NOTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Railways, by a warrant under their seal, bearing date the 3d day of November now last, and made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to give further time for making certain railways," have ordered and declared, that the period of time limited by the Cornwall Railway Act, 1846, for the completion of the railways and works described in the said warrant (that is to say), a railway, commencing by a junction with the South Devon Railway, in the parish of Saint Andrew, Plymouth, and county of Devon, and terminating at or near the town of Falmouth, in the parish of Budock, and county of Cornwall; a railway to connect the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway with the quays or wharfs at Truro, diverging from such railway, in the parish of Kenwyn, in the county of Cornwall, and terminating at or near Newham, in the same parish; a railway to connect the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway with the quays or wharfs at Penryn, diverging from such railway, in the parish of Budock, in the county of Cornwall, and terminating at or near the Exchequer-quay, at Penryn; and a railway to connect the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway with the Liskeard and Caradon Railway, diverging out of the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway, in the parish of Liskeard, and terminating by a junction with the said Liskeard and Caradon Railway, near Looe-mills, in the same parish; and also certain alterations in the line of the Bodmin and Wadebridge Railway, as defined in the plans and sections referred to in the said Act; and also a railway to connect the said firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway with the town of Padstow, commencing in the parishes of Saint Winnow and Cardinham, or one of them, in the county of Cornwall, and terminating at or near the town of Padstow, in the parish of Padstow, in the county aforesaid, shall (except as to such portion thereof as shall have been or be abandoned in pursuance of the provisions of the Cornwall Railway Act Amendment and Deviation, 1847) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by the said Cornwall Railway Act, 1846; and also that the period of time limited by the said Cornwall Railway Act, 1846, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore-mentioned railways and works, shall (except as to such portion thereof as shall have been or be abandoned as aforesaid) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the Cornwall Railway Act Amendment and Deviation, 1847, for the completion of the new or altered line of railway described in the said warrant (that is to say), a new or altered line of railway, commencing by a junction with the Devonport Branch
