Her Majesty's Steam Sloop Polyphemus, SIR. Gibraltar, November 9, 1848.

DEEMING it of importance that my Lords of the Admiralty should be made acquainted, with as little delay as possible, of the proceedings of Her Majesty's sloop under my command, on the 8th instant, I have the honour to enclose duplicates of my communications to the Commander in Chief, and to request that you will be pleased to lay the same before their Lordships.

Her Majesty's Steam Sloop Polyphemus, at Gibraltar, 9th November 1848.

I HAVE the honour to inform you that, on the 7th instant, I received a communication from Mr. Glasgow, merchant, of this place, enclosing a letter from Mr. J. Forster, late Master of the brig Three Sisters, of Liverpool, copies of which | supposed to be a six or nine pounder, and as, una-I herewith enclose.

We started the same evening to the Rif Coast, and at daylight ran into Al Khoyamich Bay, and coasted from thence, close to the shore, towards Cape Tres Forcas, for the purpose of discovering the brig, if they should have taken her to the westward.

At eleven A.M. of the 8th, on opening the Point of Calla Tramontana, we discovered her anchored close to the shore, in a small bay, partly surrounded by an amphitheatre of precipices, high rocks, and ravines, all of which places were crowded with men armed with long muskets, evidently for the purpose of protecting the brig, which laid considerably within musquet shot

Their boats, seven in number, were hauled up on the beach, and in the mouths of Cavern, with a strong party of armed men lying under cover for the protection of part of the cargo, which they had landed; their whole force appeared to consist of at least five hundred men; on approaching close to the brig, they opened fire of musquetry from all points, which we immediately returned with grape, cannister, and musquetry, doubtless with very good effect, as a very large number of them began flying about in all directions, and taking up more secure positions; having dislodged them from the beach, we proceeded to take the vessel in tow, which service was performed by Lieutenant Gardner, who volunteered to take the cutter, with a hawser, and weigh the brig's anchor; just at this time a fire was opened from a gun. l voidably, our stern was towards the nearest point

of low rocks, and therefore could make no return, it encouraged them to approach us quite close, and open a well directed fire of musquetry, which, I regret to say, severely wounded Lieutenant Wasey and slightly two seamen, on board the ship, and one seaman severely, in the cutter.

It was my intention to have landed and burnt the boats, but from the secure position taken up by so numerous a body of well armed men, I deemed it very imprudent to risk so severe a loss as must have inevitably taken place, particularly as the fire from our great guns had rendered them unserviceable. Having now taken the brig in tow, we steamed to sea.

From the scattered position taken up by the pirates, it would be impossible for me to estimate their loss; but from the accuracy of our fire, and many men having been observed to fall, and some carried away, as we-steamed-out of the bay, there is little doubt but it must have been very severe.

In performing this service, it would be invidious in me to point out any individual, whereevery one behaved so well; but I cannot omit bringing to your notice the zeal displayed by Mr. Gardner, First Lieutenant, who volunteered to board the brig under so severe a fire, and who has at all times shown the same anxiety to assist in forwarding the service; also the able support I received from Lieutenant Wasey, in command of the foremost gun, and the coolness and skill displayed by Mr. Taylor, the Master, in conducting the ship in so intricate a place.

I beg to return my thanks to Mr. F. Gilbert, Paymaster and Purser, who volunteered to take command of the small arm men.

Having placed Mr. Kirkham, Master's Assistant, on board the prize, with six men, I proceeded to Gibraltar, where I arrived this day.

As a steamer is about to start for England, I have thought it requisite to forward a duplicate of this communication to the Secretary of the Admiralty. I have, &c.

#### GENTLEMEN.

IT is with extreme regret that I have to announce the capture of the brig Three Sisters, by the Moorish pirates, off Cape Tres Forcas, on the 2d instant.

When I left Gibraltar on the 31st of October, I carried a fair wind until midnight, it then fell very light, attended with calms, until eight o'clock the following morning, when a light breeze sprung up from the eastward; I then stood to the south east, and finding that I was under the influence of a strong southerly current, I stood to the northward at six P. M. On the 1st it fell calm, which continued. At ten A.M. on the 2d, I observed several boats pulling off from the shore, which caused my crew to be greatly alarmed; however, I waited until I could make out that they were nothing else than pirates, each boat pulling from twelve to fourteen oars, with an additional lot standing in midships, with their long musquets, all ready for action, they also had large guns on their gunwales; after witnessing all the formidable weapons, I thought it was high time to look for the preservation of our own lives, accordingly I ordered the small boat to be got out, in order to keep without the reach of their guns, but, to my astonishment, no sooner had we put off from the ship, than a volley of shot came tumbling about the boat, but fortunately they all fell a few yards short; and, I am confident, had I remained five minutes longer, there would be no person to tell the tale. However, we saw six of them abreast of the ship, keeping up their firing at the ship at a distance, leaving one to chase the boat, but fortunately he gave up the chase in about ten minutes; he then returned to his companions, and assisted them in towing the vessel within their own dominions.

We then made the best of our way across towards the Spanish coast, and, thanks to Providence, we were picked up by the brig Dawn, at midnight, otherwise the boat must have been swamped before morning, owing to her being so deep with all the ship's company and sundries.

I beg you will transmit this information to the authorities, and probably they'll look after the

#### THIRD NOTIFICATION.

THE General Board of Health having, under the authority of the statute, issued one set of Orders, directing that the places frequently visited by epidemics should be sought out and examined, and that measures of prevention should be carried into effect, as far as practicable, by cleansing; having also, in addition to these Orders, issued Special Regulations for the direction of Medical Relief in places where cases of cholera have appeared, and numerous applications having, from time to time, been made to the Board from other places for these Special Regulations,

It has appeared to the General Board of Health to be desirable that these Special Orders and Regulations should hereafter take effect, without further notification, in all places forthwith, upon the actual occurrence of cases of cholera, and by these Orders and Regulations they do so provide.

In all cases, however, in which these Orders are acted upon, immediate notice of the fact must be sent to the General Board of Health, and the Medical Officers will be required to notify, from time to time, for the information of the Board, any progress which the epidemic may make in their respective districts.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Parishes named in the Schedules hereunto annexed;

To the Owners and Occupiers of Houses, Dwellings, Churches, Buildings, and Places of Assembly within the said Unions and Parishes, and others having the care and ordering thereof;

And to all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, and by virtue of an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council. Bearing date the 28th day of September 1848, directing that the said provisions of the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, We, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations. as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases; and whereas by the said Act it is provided, that the directions and regulations to be issued as aforesaid shall extend to all parts or places in which the said provisions of the said Act shall for the time being be in force under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions and regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions and regulations shall be specified; and whereas, in pursuance of the said Act, We danger the spreading of the disease.

issued certain directions and regulations, bearing date the 3d day of November instant, to extend to the unions and parishes mentioned in the schedules hereunto annexed, and to all extraparochial places adjoining to such unions and parishes; and whereas it appears to us expedient to issue the further directions and regulations hereinafter contained:

Now, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, We, the General Board of Health, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to all parts and places within the several unions and parishes named in the schedules hereunto annexed, and to all extraparochial places adjoining to such unions and parishes.

I. We direct that where it shall be certified to the Guardians by their Medical Officer or Officers, or where it shall otherwise sufficiently appear to such Guardians that extraordinary medical aid is required for persons attacked or threatened by cholera, or epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases, we authorize and require such Guardians, without further notification, to provide sufficient medical aid, and, in suitable places, such medicines as may be required within their respective unions and parishes for necessitous persons attacked by cholera or by premonitory symptons, and to make arrangements for the distribution of notices, stating the places where aid and medicines shall have been provided.

II. Whereas it has heretofore been found impracticable to insure proper treatment in their own houses to many of the poorer classes, we authorize and require the said Guardians, where it shall appear that such extraordinary aid is required, to provide suitable rooms or places, capable of accommodating necessitous cases, to which persons attacked by cholera, who cannot be properly treated in their own houses, may be conveyed.

III. And we also authorize and require the said Guardians, where it shall appear needful, to provide rooms or places of refuge to which may be removed the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked by cholera; and also such necessitous persons living under the same roof with or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the Medical Officer or Officers acting under the authority of the said Guardians may deem it necessary to remove; and the houses, rooms, or dwellings, from which persons may have been so removed to the places of refuge, shall be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or, in their default, by the said

IV. And on the occurrence of any case of cholera, or other epidemie, endemic, or contagious disease, in any room occupied by one family or more, we hereby authorize and require the Medical Officer to remove, or cause to be removed, either the patient, or so many of the occupants of such room as he shall consider would, unless removed, tend to prevent the recovery of the patient, or enV. And in case of death by cholera, or any other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, we hereby authorize and require the last Medical Attendant upon the person of the deceased, or in case of there having been no Medical Attendant, the housekeeper or person present at the death, or who is in charge of the body, forthwith to notify the fact of the death to the Medical Officer of the district, who is charged with the execution of these orders for the prevention of the spread of such disease.

And we do hereby authorize such Medical Officer to give such directions as may appear to him to be needful, in respect to the care, removal, and the time of interment of the body, for preventing the communication or spread of disease.

And we hereby authorize and require all persons to give such information, or such assistance, to such Medical Officer, and to be otherwise aiding him as he may need in the execution of these orders.

VI. And in the event of the fatal termination of any case of cholera, or of other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, in any room occupied as a living or sleeping room by one family or more, or by numerous persons, we hereby authorize and require the Medical Officer to remove, or cause to be removed, as speedily as may be, either the corpse or the persons occupying such room, until the corpse can be conveniently removed and properly interred.

VII. And we do authorize and direct the said Guardians to make arrangements for obtaining daily lists of persons attacked by cholera, or other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, within their respective unions and parishes, with the particulars of their cases and treatment, and for communicating the same daily to the General Board of Health.

VIII. And we do hereby authorize and direct the said guardians, where it may appear needful, to appoint such additional Medical Officers, and also to appoint such other officers as may be necessary to execute and superintend the execution of these regulations; and to publish and circulate, by printed hand bills or other means, notices of our directions and regulations, or of such part of any of them as it may appear desirable to make publicly known.

IX. And we hereby direct, that in these directions and regulations, and in the directions and regulations already issued by us as aforesaid, the words "Guardians of the Poor," and the word "Guardians," respectively, shall mean the Guardians, Directors, Wardens, Governors, or other like Officers having the management of the poor for any union, parish, or place, where the matter requiring the cognizance of any such officers arises; and the word "parishes" shall include every place where the relief of the poor is administered by a Board of Guardians for such place.

To the Parochial Boards of the several Parishes and Combinations throughout Scotland;

To the Owners and Occupiers of Houses, Dwellings, Churches, Buildings, and Places of Assembly, and others having the care and ordering thereof, throughout Scotland;

And to all whom it may concern.

Whereas by the provisions of "The Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, and by virtue of an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 28th day of September 1848, directing that the said provisions of the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, We, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases; and whereas by the said Act it is provided, that the directions and regulations to be issued as aforesaid shall extend to all parts or places in which the said provisions of the said Act shall for the time being be in force under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions and regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions and regulations shall be specified; and whereas, in pursuance of the said Act, We issued certain directions and regulations, bearing date the 9th day of November instant, to extend to Scotland; and whereas it appears to us expedient to issue the further directions and regulations hereinafter contained:

Now, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, We, the General Board of Health, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to Scotland, and be in force throughout that part of the United Kingdom.

I. We direct, that where it shall be certified to any Parochial Board by their Medical Officer or Officers, or where it shall otherwise sufficiently venting the communication or spread of disease.

appear to such Parochial Board, that extraordinary medical aid is required for persons attacked or threatened by cholera, or epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, we authorize and require such Parochial Board, without further notification, to provide sufficient medical aid, and in suitable places such medicines as may be required within their respective parishes, for necessitous persons attacked by cholera or by premonitory symptoms, and to make arrangements for the distribution of notices, stating the places where aid and medicines shall have been provided.

II. Whereas it has heretofore been found impracticable to insure proper treatment in their own houses to many of the poorer classes, we authorize and require the Parochial Board, where it shall appear that such extraordinary aid is required, to provide suitable rooms or places capable of accommodating necessitous cases to which persons attacked by cholera, who cannot be properly treated in their own houses, may be conveyed.

III. And we also authorize and require the Parochial Board, where it shall appear needful, to provide rooms or places of refuge to which may be removed the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked with cholera, and all such necessitous persons living under the same roof with or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the Medical Officer or Officers acting under the authority of the Parochial Board may deem it necessary to remove; and the houses, rooms, or dwellings, from which persons may have been so removed to the places of refuge, shall be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or, in their default, by the Parochial Board.

IV. And on the occurrence of any case of cholera, or other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, in any room occupied by one family or more, we hereby authorize and require the Medical Officer to remove, or cause to be removed, either the patient or so many of the occupants of such room as he shall consider would, unless removed, tend to prevent the recovery of the patient, or endanger the spreading of the disease.

V. And in case of death by cholera, or any other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, we hereby authorize and require the last Medical Attendant upon the person of the deceased, or in case of there having been no Medical Attendant, the housekeeper or person present at the death, or who is in charge of the body, forthwith to notify the fact of the death to the Medical Officer of the district, who is charged with the execution of these orders for the prevention of the spread of such disease.

And we do hereby authorize such Medical Officer to give such directions as may appear to him to be needful, in respect to the care, removal, and the time of interment of the body, for preAnd we hereby authorize and require all persons to give such information, or such assistance, to such Medical Officer, and to be otherwise aiding him as he may need in the execution of these orders.

VI. And in the event of the fatal termination of any case of cholera, or of epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, in any room occupied as a living or sleeping room by one family or more, or by numerous persons, the corpse shall be interred by those who have the charge of interring the same within such time as may be fixed by the Medical Officer, and intimated by a notice signed by the Inspector of the Parochial Board, and left with any person on the premises; and in the event of interment not taking place within the time so fixed, we hereby authorize and require the Parochial Board to cause to be removed, as speedily as may be, either the corpse or the persons occupying such room, until the corpse can be conveniently removed and properly interred.

VII. And we do authorize and direct the said Parochial Boards to make arrangements for obtaining daily lists of persons attacked by cholera, or other epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, within their respective parishes, with the particulars of their cases and treatment, and for communicating the same daily to the General Board of

Health.

VIII. And we do hereby authorize and direct the said Parochial Board, where it may appear needful, to appoint such additional Medical Officers, and also to appoint such other Officers as may be necessary to execute and superintend the execution of these regulations; and to publish and circulate, by printed hand bills or other means, notices of our directions and regulations, or of such part of any of them as it may appear desirable to make publicly known.

IX. And we hereby direct, that in these directions and regulations, and the directions and regulations already issued by us as aforesaid, the words "Parochial Board" shall mean the Parochial Board or other like Officers having the management of the poor for any parish, combination, or place where the matter requiring the cognizance of such Officers arises, and the word "parishes" shall in-

clude "combination."
