PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled " An Act to regulate the " trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, among other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's charter (excepting the possessions of the said Company), as to Her Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary:

And whereas Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, did deem it expedient, by a certain Order, bearing date on the twenty-fourth day of April, in the year of our

Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to make certain regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, the same not to include the district of Natal:

And whereas Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, deems it expedient and salutary to repeal certain parts of the said Order hereinafter mentioned, and to make the regulations hereinafter contained, touching the trade and commerce last aforesaid:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the power so vested in Her as aforesaid, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said Order, as imposes a duty of Customs upon spirits of all sorts, shall be, and the same is hereby, repealed.

And it is hereby further ordered, that, in lieu of the said duty repealed, there shall be levied, upon all spirits imported into the said colony, the duty of Customs following, that is to say; on spirits of all sorts, not exceeding the strength of proof by Sykes's hydrometer, and so in proportion for any greater strength, the imperial gallon, two shillings.

And it is hereby further ordered, that, upon the

of good sound merchantable wine, the produce and manufacture of the said colony, or upon the due depositing of any quantity of such wine in any warehouse, approved of for that purpose by the Collector of Customs, and placing the same therein in the charge of an officer of Customs for exportation, there shall be granted by the proper officer of Customs to the party so exporting such wine, or so making such deposit, a certificate of his having done so, in one or other of the forms in the schedule to this Order annexed, as the case may be.

And it is hereby further ordered, that, before any such wine shall be so exported or deposited, twenty-four hours' notice at the least shall be given to the collector, of the intention so to export or deposit any such wine; and in such notice shall be stated the marks, numbers, and description of packages, and the sorts of wine, and the wharf or warehouse where it is intended to ship or deposit such wine.

And it is hereby further ordered, that, in respect of wines so deposited as aforesaid, the party depositing the same, and one sufficient surety, shall give bond in the penal sum of the value of such wine, conditioned that the same shall be duly exported within twelve calendar months from the day of such deposit, and shall be landed at the place for which they are entered, or shall be accounted for to the satisfaction of the collector, and shall not be relanded within the said-colony; and that the certificates granted in respect thereof shall be delivered up to the collector whenever all the spirits shall have been delivered, duty free, which the holder of the certificate is thereby entitled to claim to have so delivered.

And it is hereby further ordered, that the holder of any such certificate shall, upon producing the same to the proper officer of Customs, be entitled to enter, duty free, from any vessel, or from any warehouse in which the same may have been deposited for security of duty, one gallon, imperial measure, of spirits, of the strength of proof by Sykes's hydrometer, in respect of every ten gallons, imperial measure, of wine so exported or deposited as aforesaid.

And it is hereby further ordered, that every officer of Customs, to whom such certificate is produced, shall endorse upon such certificate the

due exportation from the said colony of any quantity | number of gallons of spirits delivered by him duty free, and that no such spirits shall be delivered by such officer until such endorsement shall have been made; and that when and so often as the number of gallons of spirits, delivered duty free under such certificate, shall be equal to one for every ten gallons of wine mentioned in the same, the said certificate shall be delivered up to the collector or other proper officer of the Customs to be cancelled.

> And it is hereby further ordered, that if any person shall forge any such certificate, or shall knowingly use any such certificate which shall have been forged, or shall forge any endorsement upon any such certificate, or shall alter any endorsement made upon such certificate by any officer of Customs, or shall knowingly use any certificate the endorsement upon which has been forged or altered, such person shall forfeit the sum of one hundred pounds.

> And it is hereby further ordered, that no spirits shall be delivered duty free by any officer of Customs upon any such certificate, unless the same shall be dated on some day being less than twelve months before that upon which the same is presented to such officer of Customs.

> And it is hereby further ordered, that no wine shall be exported or deposited under the provisions of this Order, until the same shall have been examined by the proper officers of Customs, and shall have been found to be sound and merchantable wine, the produce and manufacture of the said colony; and that if any wine, produced to any officer of Customs to be exported or deposited as aforesaid, shall not be such sound merchantable wine, or if any wine that has been so deposited shall at any time after such deposit be discovered not to be such sound merchantable wine, the same shall be forfeited, and shall and may be seized by any officer of Customs, and the party producing the same shall forfeit the sum of one hundred pounds.

> And it is hereby further ordered, that it shall not be lawful to reimport any wine exported as aforesaid, and that any such wine, if reimported, shall be forfeited.

> And it is hereby further ordered, that all the rules and regulations made by the said first-mentioned Order, concerning penalties and forfeitures. and concerning the recovery and application of the

same, shall apply to the penalties and forfeitures incurred under this Order.

And it is hereby further ordered, that the net produce of the duties received by the means and powers of this Order shall be paid by the Collector of Customs into the hands of the Treasurer or Receiver General of the said colony, or other proper officer authorized to receive the same.

And it is hereby further ordered, that the Governor, or the officer for the time being administering the government of the said colony, shall promulgate this present Order within one calendar month next after the receipt thereof by him; and that this Order shall take effect from and after such promulgation thereof, and not before.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

K.G.C.B., Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the settlement of the Cape of Good Hope and its dependencies, dated

> Camp, "Bethany," two marches from Bloem Fontein, August 30, 1848.

My Lord,

IN continuation of my despatch to your Lordship of the 23d instant, reporting that, by means of that most perfect and inimitable invention, the Caoutchou Pontoon float, I had established myself on the right bank of the deep and rapid Orange River, 200 yards in width, with four companies of the Cape Mounted Rifles, three six-pounders, two companies of the Rifle Brigade, and two companies of the 45th regiment, I have now the honour to state, that the detachment of the 91st regiment, having arrived on the 25th instant, was immediately carried over, with the exception of forty men. These, with twenty of the Cape Corps, were posted on the left bank of the river, in charge of a boat and a Hawser, which, for the purpose of securing my communication, I had succeeded in passing across the stream.

I marched on the morning of the 27th instant, provided with thirty days commissariat supplies, to Philippolis; and on the following day to a bivouac, at a stream near "Vister's Hock." Up to this period no positive information had reached me as to the spot at which the rebels proposed to make a stand; although rumour represented that they would probably do so at a place called "Bloem Plaats," on the Kroom Elem Bok River, a celebrated position for the interruption of a march. Early yesterday morning I received intelligence, much to be relied on, that such was their positive intention; and on my march on this position, in order of battle, a shepherd informed me that he had seen many fires during the night, and that he believed the whole rebel force was there strongly posted, numbering about one thousand men. I was soon sufficiently near to reconnoitre their position, of which, from my previous journey through the country, I had some knowledge; my troops were prepared for the attack, and scarcely had the advanced party of reconnoissance, accompanied by myself, arrived within shot, when the rebels sprung up, like the men of "Roderick Dhu," from behind bushes and rocks, every height was in an instant covered with them, and they opened a well directed and very destructive fire.

The position chosen was a succession of ridges of hills on either side of a stream, called the Kroom Elem Bok, strongly undulating, and covered with large stones and bush, most favourable

range, the hills on the opposite bank of the river being much higher, and consequently "en potence" and in support.

The Cape Rifles, in advance, being by no means calculated, from being mounted, to stem this torrent of musketry, were ordered back, the three guns opened a rapid and well directed fire upon the points where the rebels appeared to be the most numerous. The Rifle Brigade, supported by the two companies of the 45th regiment, were directed to attack their left flank, so as to turn it, and the detachment 91st regiment were held in reserve in rear of the guns. A more rapid, fierce, and well directed fire than that kept up by the rebels I have never seen maintained, and for some time they manfully held their ground, when a rush of the Rifle Brigade upon their left flank, of the 45th upon their left centre, and of the 91st, whom I now brought into action, upon their right centre, carried every thing before it, and gallantly dislodged the rebels. Meanwhile a fierce and determined conflict was going on between the Cape Mounted Rifles and the right of the rebels, who descended the hills far in their direction for the double purpose of turning my left flank and of insulting our baggage and commissariat stores, which were collected on the plain below.

I have seldom seen a sharper skirmish, the rebels advancing most rapidly and successfully into the plain until their impetuosity exposed their left to the fire of one of the guns, by which they were checked, and the gallant Hottentots, nobly headed by their officers, then drove them back pell mell into the hills. During this time the victory on our right had rapidly progressed, the rebels in about three quarters of an hour having been driven from their position on our side of the river, the higher ground upon the opposite bank of which they most obstinately endeavoured to hold. The gallant efforts of our infantry along their centre and on their left were however soon crowned with success; and at the same moment their right was driven by the Cape Corps across our front, by passing which they alone could gain the road leading over the neck of a range of hills by which they must retire. They were thus exposed to the fire of two of our guns posted on the hill first carried by the Rifle Brigade and 45th regiment, and from which they suffered greatly.

At this time Lieutenant Colonel Buller, of the Rifle Brigade, who, with much judgment, gallantry, and ability, shewed great knowledge of his profession in the commencement of the attack, and by vigorously endeavouring to intercept the retreat of the rebels, was, I deeply regret to say, very severely, though I hope not dangerously, wounded above the knee, the same shot killing his horse, and I was thus deprived of his services at a moment when they were much required.

The rebels, thus driven at every point from their position, endeavoured to make a final stand for defence. Its advance was formed by a lower lat the neck in the high ridge of hills behind it previously alluded to, and which they successfully maintained against the Cape Mounted Rifles, and a body of about 250 Griquas, who this morning joined me, under their faithful Chiefs, Waterboer and Adam Kok.

The guns and infantry were, however, advancing as rapidly as the heat of the day would permit, and the neck, the last hold of the rebels, was wrested from them.

One of the most severe skirmishes ever, I believe, witnessed, thus terminated in the complete success of Her Majesty's troops, aided by the best intentions on the part of the Griqua Chiefs, whose conduct merits my perfect approbation.

A conflict of this nature, in a position so formidable, cannot be attended with complete success without considerable loss. The rebels left dead upon the field forty-nine men, twelve having been killed by one cannon shot; and their wounded is, of course, in proportion. A great number of arms were thrown away, and many horses taken. The Boer never fights without his horse, from which he usually dismounts to fire over the saddle; and consequently, when vigorously pressed, he has not time to remount. The loss on our side has, I truly regret to say, been also considerable, viz. one officer mortally, and six severely wounded; and eight men killed, and thirty-nine wounded.

The gallant conduct of every officer and soldier calls for my warmest encomium, and renders it my imperative duty to impress upon your Lordship the merits of the troops, as deserving Her Majesty's gracious consideration. In doing so, I beg leave to point out to your Lordship, the difficulties of the service in which I have been engaged, owing to the necessity of passing the Orange River, and the immense distance, in this wild country, of one point from another; and likewise to assure your Lordship, that the nature of the rebel position was such as to call forth, not only judgment, but personal gallantry, on the part of the different officers; who, I therefore venture to hope, may be deemed to merit Her Majesty's gracious favor.

Lieutenant Colonel Buller has very fully evinced his talent for command, and his gallantry in the per-This officer's exertion, and formance of his duty. that of Major Beckwith, in superintending and effecting the passage of the Orange River, was as laborious as instrumental in its important object. Major Sidney Beckwith, of the Rifle Brigade, a nephew of the late veteran of that name, and of such Rifle renown, greatly distinguished himself in command of the Infantry, and has succeeded Colonel Buller in the command of the troops. Captain Blenkinsopp, commanding the detachment 45th regiment, to Lieutenant Pennington, commanding the detachment, 91st regiment, and to Lieutenant Dyneley, commanding the Royal Artillery, an officer of great promise, the service is greatly in-debted; and of Captain Armstrong, in command of the Cape Mounted Rifles, I cannot speak in terms

soldier performed the arduous and gallant duty demanded of him in avenging the insult and indignity thrust upon Her Majesty's authority, as previously reported to your Lordship in detail. Major Warden, the British Resident, was with me; and, by his exertions, was most useful in his civil as well as his military capacity.

The only officers of my Personal Staff with me are, my private Secretary, Major Garvock, and my Aide de Camp, Lieutenant Holdich. The former, who also acted as my Adjutant General and Quartermaster General, is an officer who was severely wounded under my command upon the Sutledge; and I should feel it a favour personally conferred upon myself, if some mark of Her Majesty's gracious approbation was conferred upon him. The latter was my Aide de Camp on the Sutledge, and severely wounded at Sobraon. Both these officers were of the greatest use to me, I do assure your Lordship, in most difficult and hazardous duty; as was Lieutenant Glyn, of the Rifle Brigade, Field Adjutant of the force.

Dr. Hall, Deputy Inspector General of Hospitals, fortunately came up with me from Cape Town, for I did not imagine I should have such occasion for his services; and the wounded, under his able care, have been provided for as I could desire. I have been obliged, however, to leave some of them at a farm-house, near the field of action. In other countries, where distances are moderate, communications are generally simple; here nothing can be accomplished under a ride of from twenty to thirty miles, through a country abandoned by its inhabitants; and the difficulty attending the prosecution of war under such circumstances exceeds belief, requiring all the energy of experience.

As every thing must be carried with the army, a train of 150 commissariat wagons has been necessary; and for the arrangements connected with this department, the service and the troops are much indebted to Deputy Assistant Commissary General Green.

I must not omit to bring to your Lordship's notice, Mr. Richard Southey, my Secretary as Her Majesty's High Commissioner. This gentleman's activity, in his direct position, is most meritorious; but his exertions in assisting in the passage of the Orange River, and his endeavours to obtain information respecting the rebels, have been of the greatest utility. His courage was conspicuous also in the field.

No prisoners were taken, for none of the rebels would yield. Captain Armstrong was treacherously wounded by a man to whom he offered quarter, and this was not the only instance of its being refused.

I followed up the success obtained until dark, and again marched two hours before day light this morning, with the efficient portion of my troops, in the Cape Mounted Rifles, I cannot speak in terms of too great praise. In fact, every officer and

abandoned missionary station, destroyed and gutted by the rebels, I have seen nothing but tired and wounded horses left upon the road, the spoor or track of the insurgents being visible in every direction, as if they had fled in dismay. A Boer has just been brought into my camp, who describes them as having hurried off in twos and threes, and that their cause is regarded as hopeless.

I shall reach Bloem Fontein on the 2d proximo, by which time I shall have been joined, if my anticipations be correct, by a great many loyal inhabitants; and when my procedure shall take a

legal and most determined turn.

N.B.—Since I closed this despatch, two rebels have been brought in, taken near the field of battle. If found to have taken a prominent part, I shall try them by a General Court Martial, on arrival at Bloem Fontein, and the sentence shall determine their fate.

The friendly Boers are gathering thickly round me, in great delight at their future prospects. I am framing a proclamation to be published at Bloem Fontein, a copy of which shall be transmitted to your Lordship after it is issued.

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor has directed the publication of the following account of an action which took place on the 29th ultimo, at Bloem Plaatz, between the troops under his command and the rebel Boers beyond the Orange River; and which ended in the total rout, and subsequent

flight of the rebels.

The notice published on the 30th ult. gave information of the passage of the Orange River by nearly all the troops, on the 23d of that month, whereupon Pretorius, the Rebel Chief, together with those under his command, in number exceeding 1000 men, had fallen back towards Winburgh, with a degree of precipitation which rendered the prospect of an action improbable. All the troops had arrived on the 25th, when His Excellency crossed the river, and, by incredible exertions, the passage was completed by them on the 26th ultimo. His Excellency then moved the troops with the greatest rapidity, in the direction of Bloem Fontein, in pursuit of the rebels, whom, on the 29th ultimo, he found posted in a very strong position at Bloem Plaatz, on the Kroom Elim Bok River, where is a succession of ridges of low hills, backed by a higher range, through a pass in which the road runs.

On a reconnoitering party, accompanied by His Excellency, approaching the first ridge, the rebels suddenly sprung up, and opened a heavy fire upon them. The left of their position was, however, quickly carried by the Rifle Brigade, 45th and 91st Regiments, the Artillery (six pounders) opening at the same time a very effective fire. The rebel's right, having been considerably thrown forward, was gallantly attacked by the Cape Mounted Rifles, under the orders of Lieutenant Colonel Buller, and driven back towards the pass, in the direction of which the enemy were now at every point hurrying, pursued from ridge to ridge of the low hills by Her Majesty's troops, and suffering great loss as they retired, from the guns which opened upon them wherever they could be brought to bear. It was afterwards found that twelve men had been killed by one well-directed round shot. On reaching the summit of the pass, the enemy made a bold, though fruitless, effort to maintain their position, but, by a combined attack of the Cape Mounted Rifles, with a body of the Griqua Auxiliaries, they were at length driven from this; their last position; on abandoning which, they fled, in the utmost disorder, in all directions over the plain beyond, leaving behind them many horses, arms, and various articles of dress, &c. His Excellency continued the pursuit for several miles, and until dark; but it being evident that the rebels were completely broken, halted for the night at Calver Fontein. In the hope of overtaking and capturing the train of wagons, he marched next morning, the 30th ult., at two o'clock, for Bethany, which he reached early in the day, and then ascertained that the enemy's camp no longer existed, they having fled in parties of two and three, with their wagons, in all directions. On the march, evidence was everywhere afforded of the precipitate retreat of the rebels, numbers of horses, &c. having been left on the road. Forty-nine of the enemy were counted dead upon the field; their wounded may be considered upwards of one hundred and fifty. Owing to the nature of the ground, which afforded great advantage to the rebels, the loss on the side of Her Majesty's troops is, unfortunately, rather heavy, as will be seen by the following return.
