#### " Resolutions.

" That the East India Company having, by the first article of the treaty contracted with Maharaj Pertaub Sing, on the 25th September 1819, 'ceded the territory of Sattara to the Raja of Sattara, his heirs and successors, in perpetual sovereignty;' and having, by the first article of a treaty, concluded on the 4th September 1839, with Maharaj Shajee (commonly called Appa solemnly confirmed that article, the Sahib), East India Company cannot alienate the territory of Sattara from the rightful heir of the Raja of Sattara, without a gross violation of public faith, and without shaking the confidence of the Native Powers of India in the stability of the treaties into which they have entered with the said Company.'

" That the seizure of the Sattara territory by the East India Company, by virtue of a con-struction arbitrarily put upon the said treaties by the stronger of the two contracting parties, would be a proceeding repugnant to every principle of justice, a breach of the law of nations, and calculated to cast a foul stain upon the character of that Company and the British Government.'
