**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an Act for the regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales," it is, amongst other

things, enacted, that, if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition Her Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any such charter, if she shall think fit, by the advice of Her Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough, within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act, of the fifth and sixth William the Fourth, cap. 76; for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act; provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by Her Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette one month at least before such petition shall be considered :

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the parliamentary borough of Oldham, in the county palatine of Lancaster, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough :

Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petition be taken into consideration, by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on Saturday the twentieth day of January next.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say :

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of Welton Beckhall, in the cathedral church of Lincoln, for the property of his prebend.

"Whereas, by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the estates and endowments belonging to the said prebend (excepting any right of patronage) will upon the first avoidance of the said prebend become absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required :

"And whereas it was by the same Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement might from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such prebend, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Thomas Kaye Bonney, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Welton Beckhall, that, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said recited Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council :

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Kaye Bonney, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tithes and other hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of patronage) now belonging to the said prebend of Welton Beckhall, or to or in which the said Thomas Kaye Bonney has or ought to have as such prebendary any estate, right, title or interest, shall, together with all such estate, right, title and interest therein (except as aforesaid), be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by

and from the said Thomas Kaye Bonney to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof, or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Thomas Kaye Bonney, so long as he shall continue to be the Prebendary of the said prebend of Welton Beckhall, and no longer, the annual sum of ninety-four pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the twenty-second day of June and the twenty-second day of December, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the twenty-second day of December next; provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of the said lands, tithes or other hereditaments, or of any part thereof, shall, since the sixteenth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, have been or shall be granted or made by the said Thomas Kaye Bonney; and that, if the next avoidance of the said prebend shall happen on any other day than one of the said two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Thomas Kaye Bonney, or his representatives.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln:

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority vested in the said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in the words following, that is to say:

“ Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Cuckfield, in the county of Sussex, and within the diocese of Chichester, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate on Staplefield Common, in the said parish of Cuckfield, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes,” or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners under the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named, “ The Chapelry District of Staplefield Common,” with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

“ The chapelry district of Staplefield Common is bounded on the west by the parishes of Bolney and Slaugham; on the north and north east by

the parish of Balcombe; on the south east and south by the remaining part of the parish of Cuckfield, from which such proposed chapelry district is separated as follows, that is to say, by a line commencing at the point of the brook at the south easternmost corner of field marked No. 895 on the tithe commutation map of the parish of Cuckfield, and from that point proceeds in a westerly direction along the said brook, on the northern sides of enclosures marked on the said map, numbers 897 and 896, as far as the High-road from London, through Balcombe to Cuckfield; it then proceeds in a southerly direction, down the middle of that road, as far as the northern enclosure of the field marked number 1035 on the said map; it then proceeds westerly, along the northern enclosures of numbers 1035 and 1032, and enters the road leading from Colling's Farm, down the centre of which road, and the eastern side of enclosure number 1222, it proceeds southerly to the road passing between enclosures numbers 1222 and 1030, and then turns westerly, by the southern enclosures of numbers 1222, 1223, 1042, and 1045, as far as the south eastern corner of enclosure number 1078; it then proceeds southwards down the eastern enclosure of number 1050, then turns westerly along the southern enclosures of numbers 1050 and 1051, as far as the north western enclosure of number 1049, along which enclosure it proceeds southerly and westerly, as also along the northern enclosure of number 1055, then turns south westerly along the north western enclosure of number 1055, and westerly along the southern enclosure of number 1072, and through the middle of the small road number 1062, and enters the parish road leading to Biggs Farm; it then proceeds northerly up that road as far as the northern angle of enclosure number 1104, and then turns westerly along the road leading into the road from Crawley to Cuckfield; it then proceeds southerly, down the middle of the latter road, as far as enclosure number 2165, which it includes within the district, and then turns westerly, along the road from Cuckfield, as far as the north western angle of enclosure number 1899 (a); and then proceeds southerly, down the middle of another road (passing by Fowlers Farm, which it includes within the district), as far as the south eastern corner of enclosure number 1863, and

then turns westerly, along the northern enclosures of numbers 1945, 1946, 1947, 1952, and part of number 1953, where it enters a small brook, along which said brook it then proceeds southerly until it enters the before-mentioned parish of Bolney, as such proposed chapelry district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon surrounded by a red line:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Mark; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Ashhurst Turner Lord Bishop of Chichester has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Chichester.
