

shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly, and that the same shall be named, "The District of Saint Matthias, Stoke Newington."

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us in each and every year, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November to the minister, for the time being, of the district so recommended to be constituted, and as soon as such district shall have become, according to the provisions of the said Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, to the perpetual curate thereof, the sum of two hundred pounds; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of a minister or perpetual curate as aforesaid as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of SAINT MATTHIAS, STOKE NEWINGTON, being—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Mary, Hornsey, and all that part of the parish of Saint Mary, Stoke Newington, in the county of Middlesex, and diocese of London, situate on the southern side of an irregular imaginary line commencing at the point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the western boundary of the parish of Stoke Newington where such boundary is crossed by the New River, and thence extending towards the north east, along the eastern bank thereof, as far as the middle of Albion-road, and thence towards the south east along the middle of such road to the point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of a public footpath leading from such last-mentioned road to Newington-green, and thence eastward in a straight direction from such last-mentioned point, to the point (marked *c* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of another public footpath leading from Church-street to Coach and Horses-lane, and thence towards the south east along such last-mentioned footpath to the ditch dividing the said parish of Saint Mary, Hornsey, from the said parish of Saint Mary, Stoke Newington, and thence eastward along such last-mentioned ditch to the point (marked *d* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of White Hart-court, and thence towards the south east along such last-mentioned court to the eastern boundary of the said parish of Saint Mary, Stoke Newington."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbents and to the patron of the churches of the parishes, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pur-

suant to the provisions of the said Act; and such incumbents and patron have respectively consented to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.
