NOTICE is hereby given, that the Commissioners of Railways, by a warrant under their seal, bearing date the 24th day of January now last, and made in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the eleventh and twelfth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to give further time for making certain Railways," have ordered and declared that the period of time limited by an Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for amending the Acts relating to the Taw Vale Railway and Dock, and for making an extension therefrom to the Exeter and Crediton Railway, in the county of Devon," for the completion of the Extension Railway described in the said warrant (that is to say), an Extension Railway from and out of the Taw Vale Railway, commencing in the parish of Tawstock, in the county of Devon, and terminating at or near the town of Crediton, in the same county, by a junction with the Exeter and Crediton Railway, shall (except as to such portions thereof as shall have been or be abandoned in pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for making a deviation in the line of the Taw Vale Railway, for making branches therefrom to the towns of Bideford and South Molton, for enlarging the Dock, and for amending the Acts relating thereto"), be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by the said Act of the tenth year of Her Majesty; and also that the period of time limited by the said Act of the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, for the compulsory purchase of lands for the purpose of constructing the hereinbefore mentioned Extension Railway, shall (except as to such portions thereof as shall have been or be abandoned as aforesaid,) be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said last-mentioned period so limited by such Act; and also that the period of time limited by the said Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her Majesty, for the completion of the branch railways, altered line of railway, dock and works described in the said warrant (that is to say),
