#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the tenth and eleventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing the Bishoprick "of Manchester, and amending certain Acts re-"lating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for "England," and of certain Acts therein recited, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eleventh day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the tenth and eleventh years of Your Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for establishing the Bishoprick of Manchester, and amending certain Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and of certain Acts therein recited, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for providing for the residence of the Bishop of Manchester within his diocese, for confirming the said bishop as visitor of the cathedral thereof, and for regulating honorary canonries therein.

"Whereas the said Acts confer upon us and Your Majesty in Council power for providing a fit residence for the Bishop of Manchester, and for carrying into effect the other arrangements hereinafter mentioned in connection with, and incidental to, the foundation and endowment of the bishoprick of Manchester:

"And whereas we are not yet prepared to recommend that a permanent episcopal residence should be provided for the bishops of Manchester:

"We, therefore, recommend and propose, that it shall be lawful for us, forthwith and from time to time, until a permanent house of residence shall be provided for the See of Manchester, to procure and engage, for the Bishop of Manchester for the time being, with the concurrence of such Bishop, a fit temporary residence within the said Diocese of Manchester, for such time as shall be deemed by us to be expedient, and to pay for the same, at a

rate not exceeding four hundred pounds by the year, out of any monies applicable to the purposes of the said Acts, which shall from time to time be standing to our credit and account in the Bank of England, such payment by us being in addition to the annual sum now in course of payment by us as the endowment of the see of Manchester.

"And whereas the order made by your Majesty in Council, on the tenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, ratifying a scheme prepared by us for founding the said bishoprick of Manchester, contains a provision for giving to the bishop of Manchester episcopal pre-eminence, jurisdiction, power, and authority within and over the said cathedral church of Manchester; but doubts may arise whether the said bishop is thereby constituted Visitor of the said cathedral:

"We further recommend and propose, for the purpose of removing such doubts, that the said James Prince Bishop of Manchester, and the Bishop of Manchester for the time being, is and shall be the Visitor of the said cathedral church and the chapter thereof, with all the same and the like rights, privileges, powers, jurisdiction and authority, with respect to and over the same, as appertain and belong to the Bishop of Ripon, in his office of Visitor, with respect to and over the cathedral church of Ripon and the chapter thereof; and that the office of Visitor of the said cathedral and chapter of Manchester is and shall be held to be absolutely transferred from the Bishops of Chester, and vested in the Bishops of Manchester for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of Manchester, testified by an instrument in writing under their common seal, bearing date the ninth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, that all the provisious contained in an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, relating to honorary canonries to be founded in certain cathedral churches therein mentioned, and to the holders thereof, shall be extended and shall apply to all honorary canonries to be founded in the said cathedral church of Manchester and to the holders thereof, as fully and effectually as if the said provisions were repeated herein.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the registrats ... Chester and Manchester respectively.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed iu the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to "amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in them by the Church Building Acts duly prepared them by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a repre-sentation, bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fortynine, in the words following, viz.

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Darton, in the West Riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assiged to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas, situate at Gawber, in the said parish of Darton, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes, or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the church building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'the Chapelry District of Gawber,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

" The chapelry district of Gawber is bounded on the east by the parochial chapelry of Saint Mary, Barnsley, and on the south by the district parish of Saint George, Barnsley; on the west by the chapelry district of Dodworth, and by the township of Cawthorne, both in the parish of Silkstone; on the north by the turnpike road from Cawthorne to Barnsley, as far as the watercourse leading north easterly to the Barnsley Canal, and from that point, by the said watercourse and the

Saint Mary, Barnsley, as the said proposed chapelry district of Gawber is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Thomas; and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister for the time being of the said church of Saint Thomas, at Gawber aforesaid:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section firstly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provision of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Gran-tham, in the county and diocese of Lincoln, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John, situate at Manthorpe, in said canal, as far as the said parochial chapelry of | the said parish of Grantham, under or by virtue

of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled, 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an 'Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for 'building and promoting the building of additional 'Churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in Your Majesty's said Commissioners by the church building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'The 'Chapelry District of Manthorpe,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned.

"The chapelry district of Manthorpe is bounded on the east by the River Witham, on the north by the parish of Belton, on the west by the parish of Great Gonerby, and a public drain or watercourse described in the Gonerby and Manthorpe Inclosure Award, as the 'Manthorpe drain,' and on the south by a public drain or water-course, described in the said award as commencing at Easthorpe-street, and emptying itself into the said 'Manthorpe drain', and by lands belonging to the Earl Brownlow, situate in the township of Manthorpe cum Little Gonerby, the boundary between the said chapelry district and the same lands being defined by three boundary stones, each marked 'M. C. D. B.' the one placed at the eastern extremity being upon the confines of the River Witham, the one on the western extremity upon the confines of the Manthorpe drain, and the third and middle one upon the confines of the western boundary of the road leading from Grantham to Manthorpe, all in the county of Lincoln, as such proposed chapelry district of Manthorpe is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon colored blue.

"And your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published,, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed in the said Church of Saint John, at Manthorpe, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent or minister of such church for the time being

being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lincoln (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said John Lord Bishop of Lincoln has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendation of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln. The Queen has been pleased to issue the following additional instructions, under the Royal sign manual and signet, to the Governor in Chief of New Zealand, for the purpose of effecting certain amendments in the Royal instructions to that Officer as to the extension of rural lots, and the disposal of Crown lands by auction in that colony:

Whereas, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament, made and enacted in the ninth and tenth years of Our reign, intituled, "An Act to make further provision for the Government of the New Zealand Islands," We did, by certain letters patent under the Great Seal of our United Kingdom, bearing date, at Westminster, the 23d day of December 1846, in the tenth year of our reign, execute certain of the powers in Us by the said Act vested: and whereas, in further pursuance of the said Act, and in exercise of the powers thereby in Us vested, and in exercise of all and every other the powers in Us in that behalf vested, We did further issue certain instructions under Our sign manual and signet, approved in Our Privy Council, being the instructions accompanying or referred to in such letters patent, as relation being had unto the said letters patent and instructions will more fully and at large appear:

And whereas it is directed by the 22d section of the 13th chapter of the said instructions, being the chapter entitled "On the settlement of the waste lands of the Crown," "that no rural allotment, within the said demesne, shall exceed in extent one square mile; but it shall be competent to any such Governor or Lieutenant Governor, to divide any such allotment for the purpose of such alienation as aforesaid, into allotments of one half, or of one quarter of a square mile." whereas it is further directed by the 24th section of the said chapter, that "no part of the demesne of Us in right of our Crown in New Zealand shall be alienated, either in perpetuity or otherwise, either absolutely or conditionally, until after the same shall first have been put up to sale at a public auction, of which auction three calendar months' notice shall first have been given by such proclamation as aforesaid."

And whereas it is further directed by the 28th section of the said chapter, that "it shall be competent to any person within three calendar months next after any such auction, to become, without any further auction, the purchaser of any lands so put up to sale as aforesaid, and not then sold, by offering and paying for the same the upset price at which the same may have been so put up to sale."

And whereas by the said recited Act it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for Us from time to time to amend, and for that purpose to add to, or, if necessary, repeal any such instruction as aforesaid. And whereas it hath appeared to Us expedient to amend Our said instructions by repealing the said recited provisions and substituting others for them respectively.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the power in Us by the said Act vested, We do hereby declare Our will and pleasure that the said recited provisions shall be, and they are hereby respectively repealed.

And that in lieu of the said recited 22d section, the following direction shall be, and the same is hereby added to the said instructions;—

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"It shall be competent for the Governor or | Lieutenant Governor of any such province, with the advice of his Executive Council, to determine the size of rural allotments within the said demesne, provided that no such allotment shall

exceed the size of one square mile."

And that in lieu of the said recited 24th section, the following direction shall be and the same is hereby added to the said instructions; "No part of the demesne of Us, in right of Our Crown in New Zealand, shall be alienated, either in perpetuity or otherwise, either absolutely or conditionally, until after the same shall first have been put up to sale at a public auction. And it shall be competent to such Governor or Lieutenant Governor, with such advice as aforesaid, to fix the time at which any such auction shall take place, provided that notice of such auction shall be given by such proclamation as aforesaid, not more than three months, nor less than one month, before the same shall take place."

And that in lieu of the said recited 28th Section, the following direction shall be and the same is hereby added to the said instructions: "It shall be competent to any person, within three years next after any such auction, to become, without any further auction, the purchaser of any lands so put up to sale as aforesaid, and not then sold, by offering and paying for the same the upset price at which the same may have been put up to sale: Provided always that it shall be competent for such Governor or Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, with such advice as aforesaid, instead of permitting such lands to be so purchased by any person applying for them as aforesaid, to put up the same again to auction, giving such notice thereof as is hereinbefore provided."

THE GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH have agreed to the following Regulations under the "Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," 11th and 12th Vict., cap. 123, applicable to the Parochial Board for the management of the Poor in the Parish

of Inveresk.

Whereas by the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, cap. 123, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the 10th year of Her present Majesty, for the more speedy removal of certain Nuisances and the Prevention of Contagious and Epidemic Diseases," the General Board of Health is empowered to issue such directions and regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act, as to them may seem fit. Now we the said General Board of Health, do hereby authorize and direct the Parochial Board for the management of the Poor in the Parish of Inveresk to execute or see to the execution of the directions and regulations following, viz.:-

1. We hereby authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide dispensaries in suitable stations, with sufficient medical aid, such dispensaries to be accessible at all times by night and by day, to persons requiring medical aid for themselves or others attacked by cholera, or by any of its premonitory symptoms, and to provide the medicines to be distributed to such applicants at such dispensaries, and such medicines and cordials as may be required elsewhere in their respective parishes for necessitous persons attacked as aforesaid, who may be under medical treatment.

2. And we do further authorize and require the Parochial Board of the said parish to make arrangements for the distribution of notices, stating the places where the dispensaries shall have been

provided. 3. Whereas it has heretofore been found to be impracticable to ensure proper treatment in their own houses to many of the poorer classes, we authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide houses or suitable rooms capable of accommodating necessitous cases, to which persons attacked by cholera, who cannot be properly treated in their own houses, may be conveyed.

4. We authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide houses of refuge, to which may be removed, the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked with cholera, and also such necessitous persons living under the same roof, or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the medical officers acting under the authority of the said Parochial Board may deem it necessary to remove, the houses, rooms, or dwellings from which persons may have been so removed to the houses of refuge, to be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or in their default by the said Parochial Board.

5. And we hereby authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide for the frequent visitation by themselves, or their officers; or such persons as they may appoint in this behalf of the several houses and dwellings throughout the bounds of their several parishes, and to inquire into the condition and matters affecting the health of the inmates of such houses and dwellings respectively, and their liability to contagious epidemic or endemic diseases, and especially as to the existence among them of bowel complaints.

6. And we authorize and require the said Parochial Board, on their own inspection, or the report of the officers or persons by whom such visitations may be made, or other information which they may acquire from their own committees, or from visitors or others, as to the condition of the poor who may be affected with, or threatened by, the cholera, or other epidemic disease, or supply such medical aid as may appear

requisite.

7. And we hereby authorize and require the Parochial Board, or the officer or person visiting as aforesaid, subject to the special instructions of the Parochial Board in each case, where symptoms are found of a premonitory attack of bowel complaint, to send the person so affected to the nearest dispensary within the bounds of the parish, or where that may be inexpedient, to dispatch some member of the family or other person for advice and medical aid, and immediately report to the medical officer the case of every such person found so affected who shall not have proceeded to the dispensary.

8. And we do authorize and direct the Parochial Board to make arrangements for obtaining daily lists of persons attacked by cholera within their respective parishes, with the particulars of their cases and treatment, and for communicating the same daily to the President of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh.

9. And we do hereby authorize and direct the said Parochial Board to appoint such additional medical officers, and also appoint such other officers as may be necessary to carry out, execute, and superintend the execution of these regulations.

Whereas by the Act 11 and 12 Victoria, c. 123, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the 10th year of Her present Majesty, for the more speedy removal of certain Nuisances, and the Prevention of Contagious and Epidemic Diseases," the General Board of Health is empowered to issue such directions and regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act as to them may seem fit: Now we the said General Board of Health do hereby authorize and direct the Parochial Board for the management of the Poor in the Parish of Liberton to execute or see to the execution of the directions and regulations following, viz. :-

1. We hereby authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide dispensaries in suitable stations with sufficient medical aid, such dispensaries to be accessible at all times, by night and by day, to persons requiring medical aid for themselves or others attacked by cholera, or by any of its premonitory symptoms, and to provide the medicines to be distributed to such applicants at such dispensaries, and such medicines and cordials as may be required elsewhere in the said parish, for necessitous persons attacked as aforesaid, who

may be under medical treatment.

2. And we do further authorize and require the Parochial Board of the said parish to make arrangements for the distribution of notices, stating the places where the dispensaries shall have been provided.

3. Whereas it has heretofore been found to be impracticable to ensure proper treatment in their own houses to many of the poorer classes, we authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide houses or suitable rooms capable of accommodating necessitous cases to which persons attacked by cholera, who cannot be properly treated in their own houses, may be conveyed.

4. We authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide houses of refuge, to which may be removed the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked with cholera, and also such necessitous persons living under the same roof, or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the medical officers, acting under the authority of the said Parochial Board, may deem it necessary to remove, the houses, rooms, or dwellings from which persons may have been removed to the houses of refuge, to be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or in their default by the said Parochial Board.

5. And we hereby authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide for the frequent visitation by themselves or their officers, or such persons as they may appoint in their behalf, of the several houses and dwellings throughout the bounds of the said parish, and to enquire into the condition and matters affecting the health of the inmates of such houses and dwellings respectively, and their liability to contagious, epidemic, or endemic diseases, and especially as to the existence among them of bowel complaints.

6. And we authorize and require the said Parochial Board on their own inspection, or the report of the officers or persons by whom such visitations may be made, or other information which they may acquire from their own committees, or from visitors or others, as to the have been provided.

condition of the poor who may be affected with or threatened by the cholera or other epidemic disease to supply such medical aid as may appear requisite.

7. And we hereby authorize and require the Parochial Board, or the officer or person visiting as aforesaid, subject to the special instructions of the Parochial Board, in each case where symptoms are found of a premonitory attack of bowel complaint, to send the persons so affected to the nearest dispensary within the bounds of the parish, or where that may be inexpedient, to dispatch some member of the family or other person for advice and medical aid, and immediately report to the medical officer the case of every such person found so affected, who shall not have proceeded to the dispensary.

8. And we do authorize and direct the Parochial Board to make arrangements for obtaining daily lists of persons attacked by cholera within the said parish with the particulars of their cases and treatment, and for communicating the same daily to the President of the Royal College of Phy-

sicians of Edinburgh.

9. And we do hereby authorize and direct the said Parochial Board to appoint such additional medical officers, and also appoint such other officers as may be necessary to carry out, execute, and superintend the execution of these regulations.

Whereas by an Act 11 and 12 Vict. c. 123, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the 10th year of Her present Majesty for the more speedy removal of certain Nuisances, and the Prevention of Contagious and Epidemic Diseases," the General Board of Health is empowered to issue such directions and regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act as to them may seem fit: Now we, the said General Board of Health do hereby authorize and direct the Parochial Board for the management of the Poor in the Parish of Haddington, to execute or see to the execution of the directions and regulations

following, viz:—

1. We hereby authorize and require the said Parochial Board to provide dispensaries in suitable stations with sufficient medical aid, such dispensaries to be accessible at all times, by night and by day, to persons requiring medical aid for themselves or others attacked by cholera or by any of its premonitory symptoms, and to provide the medicines to be distributed to such applicants at such dispensaries, and such medicines and cordials as may be required elsewhere in the said parish for necessitous persons attacked as aforesaid who may be under medical treatment.

REGULATIONS BY THE GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH, acting under the "Nuisancs Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1843," applicable to the Parochial Board for the Management of the Poor, in the Parish of Eastwood, at Pollockshaws.

Whereas, by the Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848, for the Prevention of Epidemic, Endemic, and Contagious Diseases, and by virtue of an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 28th day of September, 1848, directing that the said provisions of the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, We, the General Board of Health, are authorised to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, and contagious disease. And whereas, by the said Act it gious disease. is provided, that the directions and regulations to be issued as aforesaid, shall extend to all parts or places in which provisions of the said Act shall, for the time being, be in force, under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions or regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions or regulations shall be specified.

And whereas, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, we have issued certain directions and regulations bearing date the 9th of November, 1848, to extend to Scotland, and be enforced through that part of the United Kingdom.

And whereas, the parish of Eastwood at Pollockshaws appears to be affected by formidable epidemic or endemic disease.

Now, in further exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, we, the General Board of Health, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to the parish of Eastwood at Pollockshaws.

1. We do hereby order, that in case any dwelling-house or lodging-house shall appear to the medical officer to be dangerously overcrowded, he shall certify in writing to the Inspector of the Poor the number of persons that may be safely lodged in any living or sleeping-room, and the Inspector of the Poor shall take order for the removal of all persons beyond such number.

2. And we hereby direct the Police to aid, if necessary, the Inspector of the Poor in the execution of this Order.

3. And we further order that the Inspector of the Poor shall provide suitable accommodation for persons not in the receipt of wages, or who, from bodily infirmity or other causes, are destitute, whom it may be necessary so to remove.

4. And we do hereby order, that on the occurrence of any death from cholera, or other epidemic disease, in any room occupied as a living or sleeping-room, the medical practitioner, who may have been in attendance on the deceased, shall notify the fact in writing to the Inspector of the Poor, who shall remove the body to some place where it may be kept until, at an appointed time made known to the relatives, and in a suitable manner, with the due performance of religious rites, it may be interred.

REGULATIONS BY THE GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH, acting under the "Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," applicable to the Parochial Board for the Management of the Poor in the Parish of Hamilton.

Whereas, by the "Nuisances Removal and "Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious Diseases, and by virtue of an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 28th day of September, 1848, directing that the said provisions of the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, We, the General Board of Health are authorised to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases. And, whereas by the said Act it is provided that the directions and regulations to be issued as aforesaid, shall extend to all parts or places in which the provisions of the said Act shall, for the time being, be in force, under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions or regulations shall be expressly confined to some such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions or regulations shall be specified.

And whereas, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, we have issued certain directions hereinafter contained, to extend to the said parish of Hamilton.

- 1. We do hereby order that the medical officers shall report to the Inspector of the Poor all houses or neighbourhoods in which cholera exists, and where he thinks that the removal of a portion of the persons residing in them will be necessary.
- 2. And we further direct that in all such cases the Inspector of the Poor take order for such removal.
- 3. And we hereby direct that the police aid and assist in the execution of these orders, if such aid be deemed in any instance necessary.
