WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend an Act for making better provision for the spritual care of populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for altering the bounds of the districts of Carver-street and Hollis-croft, in the county and diocese of York.

"Whereas it is by the secondly-recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority provided in the first-recited Act, at any time or times within twelve months after the date of the licence of the minister first licensed to any separate district, constituted under the provisions of the same Act, to alter the bounds of such district, although any alteration be not required with a view to the constituting of another separate district; provided always, that the scheme for making any such alteration shall be subject to all the provisions relating to schemes for constituting separate districts under the said first-recited Act; and that any portion of any such separate district which, by any such alteration as aforesaid, shall become detached or excluded therefrom, shall to all intents and purposes again belong to and form part of the parish, chapelry, or district out of which such portion was taken, upon such

separate district being originally constituted, or to and of any new district, as shall be determined by the like authority:

"And whereas the said districts of Carver-street and Hollis-croft were duly constituted out of the parish of Sheffield, in the said county and diocese of York, under the provisions of the said first-recited Act, by schemes prepared by us, and ratified by Orders of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date, respectively, the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and the sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and since duly gazetted:

"And whereas the Reverend John Sheldon, clerk, was duly licensed as the first minister of the said dirtrict of Carver-street, on the fourteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and the Reverend Robert Henry Deane, Clerk, was duly licensed as the first minister of the said district of Hollis-croft, on the seventeenth day of February in the same year:

"And whereas it has since been represented to us, and appears to us to be expedient, that the bounds of such district should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Thomas Archbishop of York, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that the bounds of the said district of Carver-street shall be altered as follows, that is to say, the imaginary line now forming the eastern boundary thereof shall be extended southwards along the middle of Coal-pit-lane, to a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and numbered 1.), in the middle of South-street at or near its junction with Union-street; and thence towards the south-west, along the middle of South-street aforesaid, as described in the schedule to the said scheme for constituting the same district; and that the boundary of the said district of Hollis-croft shall be altered as follows, that is to say, the imaginary line now forming the southern boundary thereof shall be extended towards the south west from the point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed and numbered 2.) in the middle of Tenter-street, opposite to the middle of the street or road called Radford-row, along the middle of such street or road as far as the middle of Townhead-street; and thence towards the north west, along the middle of such last-mentioned street, as far as the middle of the street or road called Broad-lane; and thence westward, along the middle of such last-mentioned street or road, as described in the schedule to the said scheme for constituting such last-mentioned district.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament:

"And whereas due notice of the said scheme has been given, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and no objections have been made thereto.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law, immediately from and after the time when this Order

shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the registrar of the diocese of York.

Whereas by the provisions of the "Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, and by virtue of an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 28th day of September 1848, directing that the said Act be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, We, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases; and whereas by the said Act it is provided, that the directions and regulations, to be issued as aforesaid, shall extend to all parts or places in which the said provisions of the said Act shall for the time being be in force under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions or regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions and regulations shall be specified.

And whereas, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, we have issued certain directions and regulations, bearing date the 3d November 1848, to extend to England, and be enforced through that part of the United Kingdom.

And whereas certain parts of the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, appear to be affected by formidable epidemic or endemic disease.

Now, in further exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, We, the General Board of

Health, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch.

1. That the trustees of the poor of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, shall take the list directed by Order, No. IX, bearing date November 3d, 1848, and shall appoint one additional duly qualified medical officer for a period of not less than six weeks, who shall make a house to house visitation of all streets, courts, alleys, or places contained in such list, where diarrhoea, cholera, as well as typhus, scarlatina, and other epidemic diseases have heretofore prevailed.

2. That such medical officer shall visit all such places at least once in every twenty-four hours, and at such other times in the day as he may be directed or find convenient; and that on such visits he shall enquire as to the instances of diarrhoea, and other premonitory symptoms of cholera, as well as to the cases of typhus, scarlatina, or any other form of epidemic disease, that may have occurred, and shall record and report the same.

3. That such medical officer shall at all times carry with him medicines for the treatment of diarrhoea and premonitory symptoms of cholera, as well as of cholera itself, and shall on the spot administer the medicines, where he shall see occasion, to any person or persons whom he may find afflicted.

4. And we hereby order such medical officer to make a daily return to the clerk of the union of the number of persons affected with premonitory symptoms, cholera, typhus, and any other epidemic diseases, attended by him during the preceding twenty-four hours. And we order the clerk of the union to forward a summary of such returns to the General Board of Health, as early in the afternoon of each day as may be practicable.
