REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Tuesday previous* to the Levee on the 22d February, and on the *Mondays previous* to the Levees on the 28th February and the 21st March, on each day *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the

session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act 'to make better provision for the spiritual care 'of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for authorizing the sale of the property formerly belonging to the Prebend of North Leverton, in the collegiate church of Southwell, and now vested in us.

"Whereas it is by the said Act (amongst other things) enacted, that notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over any lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or other hereditaments vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts, and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us, by proper instruments in writing duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase money for the sale, transfer and conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein; and with a further proviso, that none of such lands, tithes, tenements or other hereditaments be sold, transferred or conveyed, except by the authority of a scheme, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same:

"And whereas all the lands, tenements, hereditaments and endowments (excepting any right of patronage) formerly belonging to the said Prebend of North Leverton, comprising, among other estates, certain lands, tenements and hereditaments situate in the parish of North Leverton, in the county of Nottingham, became vested in us on the vacancy of the said Prebend, subject to any subsisting lease or leases thereof:

"And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of all our estate and interest in the said lands, tenements and hereditaments; and, after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient, that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by deed or deeds duly executed under our common seal, from time to time to sell, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements and hereditaments (except as aforesaid) heretofore belonging to the said Prebend of North Leverton, and all our estate, right, title and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her

Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln. *C. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional 'churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in them by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following, viz:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the united parishes of Kirkby Malzeard and Masham, the former of which parishes is situate within the west riding and the latter within the north riding of the county of York, and both being within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Paul, situate at Healey, in the said parish of Masham, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend 'and render more effectual an Act, passed in 'the last session of Parliament, for building, 'and promoting the building, of additional 'churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should comprize all that portion of the said parish of Masham which lies to the west of the eastern boundary-line hereinafter described, which comprizes also the entire township of Ellingstring, the township of Healey-cum-Sutton (excepting all that portion thereof called or known by the name of Sutton), the entire township of Ilton-cum-Pott, the greater part of the township of Fearby, with detached portions of the townships of Masham, Burton, Ellington, and Swinton, as well as the unenclosed moorland belonging to the parish of Masham, and not divided between the several townships in such parish, and that such proposed district should be called 'The Chapelry District of Healey,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The chapelry district of Healey is bounded on the south and south west by the said parish of

Kirkby Malzeard, on the north west by the parish of Coverham, on the north by the parish of East Witton, and on the east by the remaining part of the said parish of Masham, from which the proposed chapelry district is separated by the western and south western boundary line of the township of Ellington, as far as to the point where the road from Ellingstring to Swinton crosses Swinny Beck; then by the said road, leading from Ellingstring to Swinton, till it meets the Burn river; thence by the river Burn, running in a westerly direction up to the mouth of Quarry Gill Beck; thence by the Quarry Gill Beck till it arrives at the boundary of the township of Ilton; then by the boundary line of the township of Swinton as far as to the road leading from Masham to Ilton; and then by the boundary line of the township of Burton till it meets the boundary of the parish of Kirkby Malzeard on the south, as such proposed chapelry district, is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Paul, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent of such church for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon (as Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon.
