REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Tuesday previous* to the Levee on the 22d February and on the *Mondays previous* to the Levees on the 28th February and the 21st March, on each day *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

The *QUEEN's* Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, among other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities, and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, parts and places, liberties and franchises therein contained, or thereunto adjoining) into districts, and to order that the County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, in each of such districts, and from time to time to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name and in what towns and places the County Courts shall be holden in each district.

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council of the 9th day of March 1847, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly;

And whereas it hath been represented that it would be advantageous to the public if certain alterations were made in some of the districts of the Courts specified or set forth in the aforesaid Order;

And whereas by the said Act it is also enacted that any Order in Council made for the purposes of the said Act shall be published in the *London Gazette*, and notice of the intention of Her Majesty to take into consideration the propriety of making any such Order, shall be published in the *London Gazette* one calendar month at least before any such Order shall be made;

Notice is hereby given, that after the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice in the *London Gazette*, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, will take into consideration the propriety of making the following Order for the purposes of the said Act—that is to say:

"The parishes of Dinas, Newport, and Llanychlwydog, now in the district of the County Court of Cardiganshire, holden at Cardigan, and the parishes of Burton, Rose-Market, and Llanstadwell, now in the district of the County Court of Pembrokeshire, holden at Pembroke, shall be in the district of the County Court of Pembrokeshire, holden at Haverfordwest.

"The parish of Mynyddyslwyn, now in the district of the County Court of Monmouthshire, holden at Newport, shall be in the district of the County Court of Monmouthshire, holden at Pontypool.

"The parishes of Badley, Battisford, Barking, Creeting All Saints, Creeting Saint Mary, Creeting Saint Olave, Earl Stonham, Great Bricett, Little Stonham, Mickfield, Stonham Aspall, and Ringshall; and the hamlets of Needham Market and Darmsden, now in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Ipswich, and the parishes of Bacton, Cotton, Finningham, Mendleshams, Westhorpe, and Wyverstone, now in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at

Eye, shall be in the district of the County Court of Suffolk, holden at Stowmarket.

"The parish of Augmering, now in the district of the County Court of Sussex, holden at Worthing, shall be in the district of the County Court of Sussex, holden at Arundel."

PRESENT,

The *QUEEN's* Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the fifth and sixth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the Law of Copyright," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall not be lawful for any person not being the proprietor of the copyright, or some person authorized by him, to import into any part of the United Kingdom, or into any other part of the British dominions, for sale or hire, any printed book first composed, or written, or printed and published, in any part of the United Kingdom wherein there shall be copyright, and reprinted in any country or place whatsoever out of the British dominions; and whereas, by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the Trade of the British Possessions abroad," books wherein the copyright is subsisting, first composed, or written, or printed in the United Kingdom, and printed or reprinted in any other country, are absolutely prohibited to be imported into the British possessions abroad; and whereas, by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Protection in the Colonies of Works entitled to Copyright in the United Kingdom," it is enacted that, in case the legislature or proper legislative authorities in any British possession, shall be disposed to make due provision for securing or protecting the rights of British authors in such possession, and shall pass an Act or make an Ordinance for that purpose, and shall transmit the same in the proper manner to the Secretary of State, in order that it may be submitted to Her Majesty, and in case Her Majesty shall be of opinion that such Act or Ordinance is sufficient for the purpose of securing to British authors reasonable protection within such possession, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit so to do, to express Her Royal approval of such Act or Ordinance, and thereupon to issue an Order in Council, declaring that so long as the provisions of such Act or Ordinance continue in force within such colony, the prohibitions contained in the aforesaid Acts, and hereinbefore recited, and any prohibitions contained in the said Acts, or in any other Acts, against the importing, selling, letting out to hire, exposing for sale or hire, or possessing foreign reprints of books, first composed, written, printed, or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended so far as regards such colony; and whereas, an Act has been passed by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of the island of Bermuda, No. 699, intituled "An Act to regulate the Importation of Books, and to protect the British Author," whereby provision is made for securing to British

authors a certain remuneration in respect of unauthorised copies of works under copyright imported into the said island; and whereas Her Majesty hath expressed Her Royal approval of the same.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that so long as the said Act of the legislature of the said island shall remain and continue in force within the said island, all prohibitions in either of the said herebefore recited Acts of the Imperial Parliament, or in any other Acts thereof contained against the importing into the said island, or against the selling, letting out to hire, or possessing therein foreign reprints of books, first composed, written, printed, or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended, so far as regards foreign reprints imported into the said island.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in the said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Snaith, in the West Riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of York, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Goole, in the said parish of Snaith, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the church building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'the Chapelry District of Goole,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The chapelry district of Goole, which comprises the whole of the township of Goole, and the south west part of the township of Hook, adjoining upon the township of Goole, commences at the midstream of the river Ouse, opposite the south east corner of a close in the said township of Hook, belonging to Andrew Montagu, Esq. and in the occupation of Andrew Robinson, passing across the east end of the said close; and thence across the high-road from Hook to Goole; and thence along the south west side of Mill-house-lane to a close in the said township of Hook, belonging to Thomas Henry Sutton Sotheron, Esq. and in the occupation of James Robinson; and thence along the same close, to and across another close, in the same township, belonging to and in the occupation of William Marshall, to another lane, called Pasture-lane; and thence along the south west side of the last-mentioned lane and across the end of Halifax-lane to another lane called Nab-lane; and thence along the south side of the last-mentioned lane to a close in the same township of Hook, belonging to the said Andrew Montagu, Esq. and in the occupation of the said Andrew Robinson; and thence across the north east end of the same close to the township of Armine, otherwise Airmin; and thence along the boundary of the same township of Armine, otherwise Airmin, to the township of Rawcliffe, near Hook-grange; and thence along the boundary of the said township of Rawcliffe, near South Common, to the townships of Snaith and Cowick; and thence along the boundary of the last-mentioned townships to the Blackwater-dyke, the boundary of the parish of Thorne; and thence along the boundary of the last-mentioned parish to and across the Swinefleet Warping Drain to the township of Swinefleet, in the parish of Whitgift, near Runlet-pit; and thence along the boundary of the last-mentioned township and parish to the midstream of the river Ouse; and thence along the midstream of the said river to the point where the boundary commenced, as such proposed chapelry district of Goole is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured pink:

"And your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, at Goole; and that the fees to arise from the publication of banns, or the solemnization or performance of marriages, baptisms, and burials should be equally divided between the incumbent or minister of such church for the time being and the Reverend John Paley, the present incumbent of the parochial chapelry of Hook, during his the said John Paley's incumbency thereof; but, that upon his avoidance of such parochial chapelry, that the whole of the said fees should belong to the incumbent or minister for the time being of the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, at Goole aforesaid; that the fees to arise from churchings should forthwith belong and be paid to the minister of such last-mentioned church and his successors.

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Thomas Lord Archbishop of York (as the Archbishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Thomas Lord Archbishop of York has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that Your Majesty will be graciously

pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provision of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

Westminster, February 27, 1849.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to consolidate the Boards of Excise and Stamps and Taxes into one Board of Commissioners of Inland Revenue, and to make provision for the collection of such revenue.

An Act to continue, until the first day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, an Act of the last session, for empowering the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland to apprehend and detain such persons as he or they shall suspect of conspiring against Her Majesty's Person and Government.
