It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament made in the session of Parliament, holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and to make such regulations touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the continent of Europe or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa or within the limits of the East India Company's Charter (excepting the possessions of the said Company), as to Her Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary:

And whereas Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, in pursuance and exercise of the power so vested in Her, did, by a certain Order in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of April in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty seven, order that no goods should be imported into, and that no goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, should be exported from the colony of the Cape of Good Hope, the same not to include the district of Port Natal by sea, from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other British possession, except into or from the several ports of Cape Town, Simon's Town, and Port Elizabeth, or such other ports within the said colony as might be thereafter declared by Her Majesty in Council to

be fit for such importation and exportation:

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty in Council that the port of East London, in the said colony is fit for such importation and exportation, it is hereby ordered that goods may be imported into and exported from the said last-mentioned port from or to other places than the United Kingdom, or some other British possession:

And whereas by the said Order made on the twenty-fourth of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, it is declared to be expedient to constitute and appoint certain ports in the said colony, to be free ware-housing ports for all the goods which might be legally imported into the same; and it was, therefore, thereby ordered, that the ports of Cape Town, Simon's Town, and Port Elizabeth, and such other ports within the colony as might thereafter be declared by Her Majesty in Council to be fit for that purpose, should be free warehousing ports for the purposes of that Order; and whereas, it appears to Her Majesty in Council, that the said port of East London is fit for the said last-

mentioned purposes.

It is hereby further ordered, that the said lastmentioned port, shall be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Order, and that all regulations made by the said Order for the ap-

pointing proper warehouses at the ports mentioned in the said Order, and for the lodging and securing of goods therein, shall extend to the appointing proper warehouses in the said port of East London, and to the lodging and securing goods in such warehouses.

And it is hereby further ordered, that the governor or the officer for the time being, administering the government of the said colony, shall promulgate this present Order within one calendar month next, after the receipt thereof by him; and this Order shall take effect, from, and after the date of such promulgation thereof, as aforesaid, and not before.

HEREAS, by an Act of Parliament, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eight years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting "the office of County Coroner," it is enacted, that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts, for the purposes of that Act, it shall be lawful for the said justices in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division be made, and that such petition, with the reasons upon which it is founded, and a description of the proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, shall be certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when such petition shall be agreed to. And it is further enacted by the said Act that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and any petition which may be presented to Her Majesty by any coroner of the county from which the petition proceeds, concerning the proposed division, to order that such county shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of the said Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district the court for the election of coroner shall be holden, and that every such order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas a petition of the justices of the peace of the county of Northampton, in quarter session assembled, on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, has been presented to Her Majesty, representing that it would be expedient that the said county should be divided into three districts, in manner hereinafter provided; and the said petition, with the reasons upon which it is founded, and a description of the proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, has been certified to Her Majesty, under the hands and seals of six of the justices, present when the said petition was agreed

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth hereby, in pursuance of the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that the county of Northampton shall be divided into three districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that such districts shall be respectively called, the Eastern District, the Midland District, and the Western District; and that such districts respectively shall be constituted as follows, that is

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Hugh-Henry Rose, Esq. a Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, and Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Her Majesty's Consul-General in Syria, Her royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the Cross of the Prussian Order of St. John of Jerusalem, which His Majesty the King of Prussia hath been pleased to confer upon him, in approbation of the services rendered by that officer in the course of the Campaign in Syria, in the year 1841, and particularly for his distinguished conduct in the engagement which took place near Mejdel on the 15th day of January in that year: Provided, nevertheless, that this licence and permission doth not authorize the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege, appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms.

And also to command, that this Her Majesty's concession and especial mark of Her Royal favour be registered, together with the relative documents, in the College of Arms.

that, in case of a fresh outbreak of the disease, the said hospital shall be immediately re-opened for the reception of all cases happening in the locality where it is situated.
