HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to carry into effect, with cer-"tain modifications, the Fourth Report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and "Revenues;" and of another Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act "to alter and amend the Law relating to Eccle-

" siastical Houses of Residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in council a scheme bearing date the eighth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine,

in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect with certain modifications "the Fourth Report of the Commissioners of " Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Your Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to alter and "amend the Law relating to Ecclesiastical Houses of Residence," have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in council the following Scheme for empowering the Dean and Chapter of Worcester to purchase certain premises within the precincts of the Cathedral Church of Worcester.

"Whereas it is by the first recited Act, amongst other things, enacted, that by the authority therein provided; and for the purpose of carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any sum of money which shall have been invested in the public funds, or in other security or securities, in trust for any ecclesiastical body corporate, aggregate, or sole, may, upon an application in writing to us, under the hand and seal of such body corporate, and, in the case of any chapter, with the consent of the Visitor thereof, be directed to be sold, and the same shall be sold accordingly, and the produce of such sale shall be applied to such purpose, and in such manner as shall appear most conducive to the permanent benefit of such body

"And whereas it is by the secondly recited Act enacted, that it shall be lawful for the dean and chapter of any cathedral church, under the like authority, to purchase any house or site being contiguous or near to such cathedral church, and it is by the same Act declared and enacted, that the said last recited provisions do and shall include and apply to all monies and securities for money, and to all stock in the Government funds or elsewhere, standing in the name of the Accountant General of the Court of Chancery, for or to the credit or for the benefit of or in trust for any dean and chapter, dean or canon, whether for the purpose of being laid out in land or otherwise; and that the same provisions shall extend and may be applied to any of the purposes of the now reciting

"And whereas there is now standing in the name of the Accountant General of the Court of Chancery, and to the credit of ex-parte the Oxford, Worcester, and Wolverhampton Railway Company, in the matter of the Oxford, Worcester, and Wolverhampton Railway Act (1845), belonging to the said Dean and Chapter of Worcester, in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, a sum of eight hundred and ninety-seven pounds and three shillings:

"And whereas the said dean and chapter are entitled to the fee simple and inheritance in a certain messuage or dwelling-house, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, contiguous to the said cathedral church, and situate within the precincts thereof, subject to a certain subsisting lease thereof, granted in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven to William Digby, Clerk, since deceased, for a term of forty years, the remaining term of which is now vested in Kenelm Henry Digby, of Tittleshaw, in the county of Norfolk, Clerk:

"And whereas an application has been made to

us in writing, under the seal of the said dean and chapter, for the investment of an adequate portion of the said sum of eight hundred and ninety-seven pounds and three shillings in the purchase of the said remaining term, and such investment appears to us, after due inquiry and consideration. to be most conducive to the permanent benefit of the

said dean and chapter:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, as the Visitor of the said cathedral church of Worcester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that so much of the said sum of eight hundred and ninetyseven pounds and three shillings as shall be required by the said dean and chapter for such purpose, may and shall be applied and in-vested in the purchase by the said dean and chapter of all that the said outstanding term of the said lease, so granted as aforesaid in the messuage or dwelling-house particularly described in the said schedule hereunto annexed.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"A messuage or dwelling-house situate and being within the precincts of the cathedral church of Worcester, near adjoining to the Great Tower or Gate House of the said cathedral church, now in the possession of Mistress Slade Nash and the Reverend Henry Hartopp Grove, and bounded on the east by the garden belonging to the tenth Prebendary Hall of the said cathedral church, on the south by a messuage late in the occupation of the said William Digby, but now of the said Henry Hartopp Grove, on the north by the passage leading from the Great Gate-way towards the College Green, on the west by the way leading to the college stables; which said premises contain in length, on the east side, fifty-five feet and eight inches; on the south side, thirty-eight feet and four inches; on the north side, thirty-two feet and two inches; on the west side, forty-seven feet; and on the north-west angle, seven feet, or thereabouts, be the same respectively more or less."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the registrar of the diocese of Worcester.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "for the further amendment of the Church "Building Acts," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in the said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, duly prpeared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of February one thousand eight hundred and fortynine, in the words following, viz.:

" Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parishes of Rotherfield Greys, Henley-on-Thames, and Rotherfield Peppard, in the county and diocese of Oxford, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous parts of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes for the consecrated church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, situate in the said parish of Rotherfield Greys, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for the further amendment of the church building Acts,' or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the church building Acts, and that such proposed consolidated chapelry should be called 'The Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Rotherfield Greys, with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

" The proposed consolidated chapelry is bounded on the north east and east by the parish of Remenham, on the south by the parish of Harpsden, as far as the point No. 1, where the boundary line of the latter parish crosses the Hop Garden-lane, up which lane the boundary of the proposed consolidated chapelry will then proceed in a north-westerly direction until it reaches Grey's-lane, along the middle of which latter lane it then proceeds north-easterly, as far as the point No. 2, where it enters the footpath which leaves Grey'slane and runs in a north-westerly direction under the fence on the western side of the Club-house Garden, along which said footpath it then proceeds north-westerly till it enters a field called Pitground, at the point No. 3, which said field it crosses by the said footpath, in a north-easterly direction, about ten chains, and continues to follow the course of the said footpath to the point No. 4, at which the said footpath meets the boundary of the parish of Henley-on-Thames; the consolidated chapelry is then bounded on the north by the boundary line which separates the parish of Henley-on-Thames from the parish of Rotherfield Greys as far the north-eastern corner at the point No. 5 of the garden attached to the Royal Oak Public-house, from which place it follows the course of the Town-ditch to the point No. 6, at which point the said ditch empties itself into the river Thames, and thence to the centre of the river, where it joins the boundary of the Parish of Remenham, as such proposed consolidated chapelry is more particulary delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green, yellow, and pink.

"That the consents of the Right Reverend Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford (as Bishop of the diocese), of the President and Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, within the University of Oxford, as the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Rotherfield Greys, of the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Rochester, as

the patron in right of his see of the parish church of the said parish of Henley-on-Thames, and of the Principal and Fellows of Jesus College, within the said University, as the patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Rotherfield Peppard, have been severally obtained to the formation of the said proposed consolidated chapelry, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof the said Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford, and the said George Lord Bishop of Rochester, have severally signed and sealed this representation, and the said President and Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, and Principal and Fellows of Jesus College have caused their common or college seals to be hereunto affixed.

" And your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that is has been mutually agreed between the said President and Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, the said George Lord Bishop of Rochester, and the said Principal and Fellows of Jesus College, as such patrons as aforesaid, testified as aforesaid, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, testified as hereinafter mentioned, and of the said Samuel Lord Bishop of Oxford, (as the Bishop of the diocese, testified as aforesaid), that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said new church, called Trinity Church, and proposed consolidated chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Rotherfield Greys, should be vested in, belong to, and whenever occasion may require, be (for the first two turns only that may arise) exercised by the said Samuel, Lord Bishop of Oxford, and his successors as Bishops of Oxford, and that such right of presentation and appointment should for ever afterwards, be vested in, belong to, and whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the Rector for the time being of the said parish church of Rotherfield Greys.

"Your Majesty's said Commissions therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation into a consolidated chapelry be accordingly made; and the agreement in respect of the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church and consolidated chapelry, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the Duties of Postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, or Inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of Foreign or Colonial letters, or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such warrant, and from time to time by warrant, as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid. And it is provided, that the power thereby given should extend to any increase or reduction, or remission, of postage.

And whereas by a warrant, under the hands of three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 22nd day of December, 1848, the said Commissioners did order and direct, that all letters transmitted by the post between the United States and any part of the United Kingdom, or between the United States and any of Her Majesty's Colonies, or any Foreign country through the United Kingdom, (the sea conveyance of all such letters between the United Kingdom and the United States being by the United States' packet-boats,) should, instead of being liable to the rates of British postage then chargeable thereon, be free from all British postage, for the conveyance between the United States and any part of the United Kingdom. And in the said warrant, certain further directions were contained, relative to the conveyance of letters between the United States and the United Kingdom and other places.

And the said Commissioners directed, that the said warrant should come into operation on the 29th day of December, 1848.

And whereas, in consequence of a convention entered into between Her Majesty and the Government of the United States, it is considered expedient that the said warrant of the 22nd day of December, 1848, should be repealed, and that such regulations should be made respecting the conveyance of letters between the United Kingdom and the United States, and other places as are hereinafter contained.

Now we, the undersigned, being three of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of a power for this purpose, reserved to us in and by the said warrant of the 22nd day of December, 1848, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, by this warrant under our hands, repeal, annul, and make void, the said warrant of the 22nd day of December, 1848, and all the rates thereby fixed or altered, and the regulations therein contained.

And we, the said Commissioners, do, in exercise of the power reserved to us, in and by the said Act, and in and by the said warrant, and of all other powers and authorities, enabling us in this behalf order and direct,—

That on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by British packet-boats between a port in the United Kingdom and a port in the United States, or between a port in United Kingdom and a port in British North America, there shall be charged and taken for the sea conveyance thereof, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an uniform British packet-rate of eightpence.

And that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted at the port of departure of the packet conveying the same, or at any other part of the United Kingdom, and transmitted to the United States, or transmitted from the United States, addressed to the port of arrival of the packet conveying the same, or to any other part of the United Kingdom, (whether conveyed by British or United States packet-boats,) and on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted direct between the port in the United Kingdom of the arrival or departure of the packet conveying the same, or any other part of the United Kingdom, and any port in British North America, (the sea conveyance being by British packet-boats,) there shall be charged and taken for the conveyance of every such letter within the United Kingdom, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an inland rate of British postage of one-penny-halfpenny, in addition to the aforesaid British packet-rate of eightpence, on letters transmitted by British packet-boats between the United Kingdom and the United States, and in addition to any Foreign rate of postage charged, or chargeable, on letters transmitted by the United States packet-boats, between the United Kingdom and the United States.

And that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to the United States, transmitted by the post between the United States and any of Her Majesty's Colonies, or any Foreign country, through the United Kingdom, (conveyed by British packet-boats between the United Kingdom and the United States,) there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British packet rate of eightpence for the sea conveyance of every such letter between the United States and the United

Kingdom; and on every such letter, whether conveyed by British or by United States packet-boats, between the United Kingdom and the United States, there shall be charged and taken, over and above any British or Foreign packet rate of postage, such a further or additional rate of British postage for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet conveying the same between the United Kingdom and the United States, and the Colony or Foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet conveying the same between the United Kingdom and the United States, and transmitted between such port and such Colony or Foreign country.

And we direct that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, progressive and additional rates of postage,

as follows (that is to say):-

On every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of

On every letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of

And on every letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight rates

of postage.

And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage; and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces shall be charged as one additional And each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this warrant if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct that no British rate of postage shall be charged or chargeable for or in respect of the sea conveyance of any letters between the United Kingdom and the United States by the United States packet-boats.

And we further direct that on every printed British newspaper posted in the United Kingdom and transmitted to the United States either by British or United States packet-boats, there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of British

postage of one penny.

And we further direct that on every printed Foreign newspaper posted in or addressed to the United States, and transmitted between the United States and any of Her Majesty's Colonies, or any Foreign country, through the United Kingdom, and on every printed Colonial newspaper transmitted between any of Her Majesty's Colonies and the United States through the United Kingdom, (such respective newspapers being conveyed between the United Kingdom and the United States by British or United States packet-boats,) there shall be charged and taken an uniform rate of British postage of one penny, except in any case in which a lower rate of postage is or shall be provided by any treaty between the United Kingdom and any Foreign country or State.

And we further direct that every printed supplement or additional sheet to any newspaper shall

for the purpose of charging the postage under this warrant, be deemed a distinct newspaper, unless sent in the same cover, or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.

And we further direct that nothing herein contained shall extend to any letters or newspapers passing through the United Kingdom to or from France, or to or from any of Her Majesty's Colonies, or any Foreign country through France, in respect of which certain rates of postage are already fixed by a Treasury warrant bearing date the 9th day of May, 1843.

And we further direct that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to repeal or alter the uniform Colonial rate of twopence, and progressive and additional Colonial rates fixed by a Treasury warrant, bearing date the 11th day of October, 1843, on certain letters transmitted by the post between places in the United Kingdom and places in British North America, or the British West Indies, which rates shall continue chargeable and payable (in addition to the British rates hereby fixed) as if this warrant had not been signed.

And we further direct that printed periodical publications (not of daily publication and not being newspapers) published and posted in the United Kingdom, may be sent by the post from any part of the United Kingdom to the United States; and printed periodical publications (not of daily publication and not being newspapers) published and posted in the United States may be sent by the post from the United States to any part of the United Kingdom, (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and the United States being by British or United States packetboats,) according to the regulations and rates hereinafter mentioned, (that is to say);-

For every such publication not exceeding two ounces in weight, one penny,

For every such publication above two ounces and not exceeding three ounces in weight, sixpence.

For every such publication above three ounces and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight-

And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, up to but not exceeding sixteen ounces, there shall be charged and paid an

additional rate of twopence. And every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces, shall be charged as one additional

And we direct that no such printed periodical publications as shall exceed sixteen ounces in weight, shall be forwarded by the post at the rates last aforesaid, and that any such printed periodical publications exceeding that weight shall be charged with the letter rates of postage.

And we further direct that printed pamphlets published and posted in the United Kingdom or the United States, may be transmitted between the United Kingdom and the United States, by British or United States packet-boats, at the same rates of postage for every such pamphlet as are lastly hereinbefore contained in respect of printed periodical publications not being newspapers; but no such printed pamphlet as shall exceed eight ounces in weight, shall be forwarded by the post at such last-mentioned rates, and all printed pamphlets exceeding that weight shall be charged with the letter rates of postage.

And we further direct that no such printed newspaper, or printed periodical publication, or printed pamphlet shall be sent by the post at the rates aforesaid, unless the following conditions shall be observed;—

1st. It shall be sent without a cover, or in a cover

or band open at the sides.

2nd. There shall be no word or communication printed on the newspaper, publication, or pamphlet after its publication, or upon the cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover of it, except the name and address of the person to whom sent.

3rd. There shall be no paper or thing inclosed in, or with any such newspaper, publication, or

pamphlet.

And in case any one of such conditions shall not be fulfilled, the whole paper or packet shall be charged with the letter rates of postage.

And we further direct that the term "United States Packet-boats" used in this warrant, shall include vessels employed or used by the Government or Post-office of the United States of America, under contract for the conveyance of post letters, and also ships of war in the service of such Government in respect of letters conveyed by them; and that all the other terms and expressions used in this warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of Her present Majesty.

And we further direct that this warrant, except so far as respects letters transmitted between places in the United Kingdom and ports in British North America shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof, and as to such lastmentioned letters this warrant shall come into operation on the 15th day of April, 1849.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners, for the time being, of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any three of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby fixed or altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.

Whereas, by an Act of Parliament passed in the fifty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third chapter 159, intituled "An Act for the better regulation of the several ports, harbours, roadsteads, sounds, channels, bays and navigable rivers in the United Kingdom, and of His Majesty's dockyards, arsenals, wharfs, moorings and stores therein, and for repealing several Acts passed for that purpose," it is enacted (among other things), that no person or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks or any portion of the shores or banks of any port, harbour, or haven of this kingdom, from which the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom for the time being, shall find it necessary for the protection of such port, harbour, or haven, or the works thereof, by order under their hands, or the hand of their Secretary, and published in the "London"

Gazette," shall prohibit the taking or removing of such shingle or ballast, upon pain of forfeiting for every such offence the sum of ten pounds:

And whereas We, as Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom, have found it necessary for the protection of the ports, harbours, or havens of Penzance and Newlyn, in the county of Cornwall, and of the shores and banks thereof, to prohibit the taking of any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks hereinafter specified; and we do therefore order, that no person or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks, or any portion of the shores or banks of the same ports, harbours, or havens, or one of them, between the following points or places, namely: from Marazion to the new northern arm of Penzance Harbour, and from the old pier of the said harbour to Newlyn.

with the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned railway, at or near Adderley-street, in the borough of Birmingham, and county of Warwick, and terminating at or near Great Charles-street, in the said borough, shall be extended for the further period of two years from the expiration of the said period so limited by such Act.
