

CONTRACT FOR BLACK IRONMONGERY.

General of the Navy, Somerset-
Place, February 26, 1849.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of
Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom
of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give
notice, that, on Tuesday the 10th April next, at one
o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such
persons as may be willing to contract for supplying
Her Majesty's several Dock-yards with

BLACK IRONMONGERY,

under a contract for twelve months certain, and
afterwards until the expiration of six
months' warning.

Patterns of the articles may be seen at Her
Majesty's Dock-yard, at Deptford, and the con-
ditions of the contract, a schedule of the articles,
and a form of the tender may be obtained at the
said Office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on
the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party
attends, or an agent for him duly authorized
in writing.

Every tender must be addressed to the Secre-
tary of the Admiralty, and bear in the left hand
corner the words, "Tender for Black Ironmongery,"
and must also be delivered at Somerset-place,
accompanied by a letter, signed by two responsible
persons, engaging to become bound with the person
tendering, in the sum of £2000, for the due
performance of the contract.
