Those Gentlemen, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on Monday the 30th of April, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levee but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until halfpast one o'clock.

Bye-Laws and Regulations, pursuant to the Act ninth and tenth Victoria, cap. 36, for the Registration and Regulation of Coal-Whippers, of the Port of London, to come into operation on the 1st June next.

NHAT from and after the 1st June next, all bye-laws and regulations made previous to that date by the Commissioners for the registration and regulation of coal-whippers, of the Port of London, shall be, and the same are hereby rescinded.

2. That the Head Office shall be as heretofore at King James's-stairs, Wapping-wall, for the uses and accommodation of all ships discharging to the westward of Regent's Ferry, in Woolwichreach; and a branch office shall be established at Woolwich, for the uses and accommodation of all ships discharging between Regent's Ferry and the Royal Arsenal Canal, Woolwich. At the abovementioned offices, every able-bodied male person who shall be desirous of following, or continuing to follow, the employment of a coal-whipper, and who shall make application to be registered, shall be required to state his name, place of abode, age, present or late occupation, single or married, if able to read and write, if a basket-man, and how long he has been so; all of which shall be entered in the register at the office at which he shall apply, against the number in the order of application; which being done, and upon the payment of four-pence (4d.), the registrar or branch registrar shall then deliver, or cause to be delivered to the applicant, a certificate, according to the terms of the Coal-Whippers' Act.

3. That each basket-man shall give security to the Commissioners for the amount of ten pounds (£10), by approved sureties, for his faithfully accounting for and duly paying over to the registrar, branch registrar, or other person duly appointed to receive the same, all monies which shall have been received by him, as the person authorised to collect the same, on account of the Commissioners, under the provisions of the Act.

4. That the basket-man, when not employed, shall attend at the head office or branch office, with his gang, at such hours as shall be directed by the registrar or branch registrar, for giving out orders. The basket-man shall sign a contract upon accepting an offer, on the part of himself, and men appointed under him, for the due performance of the engagement then entered into. And in case any one or more of the

said gang shall neglect or refuse to perform the same, after being required so to do, unless he or they shall have objected before the contract was signed as aforesaid, or shall prevent the performance thereof, by disorderly conduct or insubordination, by dispute or otherwise, every man so offending shall, for every such neglect, refusal, or insubordination, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding five pounds (£5). And in case any dispute shall arise in the gang, either among themselves, or between any one or more of them, and any other party, or any other cause with reference to the coal-whippers shall happen tending to delay the delivery of the coals, then the registrar, or branch registrar, is hereby authorised to suspend any one or more of the said gang until the next meeting of the Board, and to substitute others; and with the consent of the master, or any other person in charge of the ship, to cancel the existing contract; and a new contract shall be made for the discharge of the cargo, or part, or remainder thereof, or a certificate of refusal shall be given, as the case may be. The basket-man is hereby required to report any act of drunkenness, or insubordination on the part of the men, during the hours of labour, to the registrar, or branch registrar, who shall have the power of suspension until the next meeting of the Commissioners, when he shall lay the same before them for their further orders

5. That every registered coal-whipper shall use his best endeavours to expedite the business of the office, especially by the discharge of the cargoes without unnecessary delay; and on the completion of each contract, the basket-man shall receive from the master or other person in charge of the ship, all monies due for labour performed, baulk-days, and for hire of tackle, and shall give a receipt for the same on account of the Commissioners, and shall forthwith pay the amount over to the registrar, branch registrar, or other person appointed by the Commissioners for that purpose, (to be disposed of according to the provisions of the Act,) together with a certificate, which he shall require the master or other person in charge of the ship to sign, detailing the name of the ship, the name of the master, the quantity of coals which have been worked by himself and gang, in the contract just completed, the amount of money received by him, specifying under different heads the proportions for labour, baulk-days, and for hire of tackle; for which he shall be entitled to receive, and the registrar, branch registrar, or clerk, is hereby directed to pay him, out of the funds of the office, such commission as the Commissioners may direct, for his own use, over and above any share that he may be otherwise entitled to.

6. That one rotation-book shall be kept at the head office, and another at the branch office, at Woolwich, and on the completion of each contract, and on producing the receipt for the return of the gear to the depôt, when such has been used, the basket-man shall enter his name, on behalf of himself and gang, in the rotation-book of the office at which he is registered, which shall entitle them to the offer of another contract in due course of rotation, upon the terms, and according to the provisions of the Act.

7. That the Commissioners, as they shall deem it expedient, shall, from time to time, appoint out of the registered men such other men of good character as they may consider most eligible to fill the office of basket-man.

8. That a numerical and alphabetical list shall be kept at each office of the practised coal-whippers there registered. One class, under the age of thirty years; another, between the ages of thirty

and forty; and another, of forty and upwards; and similar lists of other registered men, not being practised coal-whippers. And with the view to equalise the labour, and to appoint the most efficient men for expediting the work to be performed under the provisions of the Act, and to complete the gang under each basket-man, there shall be added eight other men; consisting, as nearly as practicable, of a due proportion from each of the above classes of coal-whippers.

9. That in case there shall be any practised coal-whippers registered, who remain unappointed to gangs, as above mentioned, they shall be called supernumeraries, and shall, in the numerical order in which they are registered, be appointed to fill up vacancies as they occur, by death or otherwise, in the regular gangs. And when, hereafter, it shall happen that any gang shall be deficient four men, or more, then the remainder, including the basket-man, shall become supernumeraries, and shall be appointed to fill up vacancies which may have occurred in other gangs; and such other supernumeraries as may not be so required shall supply casual vacancies until there shall be sufficient to form a new gang. The basket-men, whose gangs have been broken up, shall, in the order in which they were deprived of their gangs, be reappointed when required, either to such newlyformed gangs, or to fill up vacancies caused by the death or permanent removal of other basketmen.

10. That in order to keep up a succession of efficient coal-whippers, all casual absence, by illness or otherwise, of the men from their gangs, when required to labour (which cannot be supplied from the supernumerary list), shall be provided for in the following manner; viz.: for every absent coal-whipper, two registered men, not being practised coal-whippers, shall be appointed to act in lieu of such absent coal-whipper, and they shall divide the earnings that would have been receivable by the absent coal-whipper between them in equal shares: the said two men shall be the two men who shall first answer to their names, on being called, according to their numerical order of entry on the registration. But in all cases where there shall not be two such men in attendance, when called, then the temporary or casual vacancy shall be filled up by an unemployed practised coal-whipper. And when each of such men, not being practised coal-whippers, shall have been appointed in manner before mentioned to labour twenty days in the whole, he shall be deemed qualified as a coal-whipper, and be added to the list of supernumeraries in regular order, as though he had been registered as a practised coalwhipper, and was unappointed to a gang as before mentioned, and shall take his turn for regular appointment accordingly.

11. That any person registered under the Act, who, when required to attend, shall fail to answer, when called, for five successive occasions, shall cease to be entitled to the privilege of registration, and his name, at the expiration of fourteen days afterwards, shall be removed from the register, and he shall not again be permitted to register till after the expiration of three months, unless he can show reasonable cause for his absence, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners; but in every case where it shall be satisfactorily shown to the registrar or branch registrar, that a man's absence was caused by illness, he shall not be deprived of his privilege.

12. That whereas the practice of the coalmarket, between buyer and seller, has long been to calculate the time for discharging ships according to the following scale, viz.—not exceeding

forty-nine tons, within one day; exceeding fortynine tons, and not exceeding ninety-eight tons, within two days; exceeding ninety-eight tons, and not exceeding one hundred and forty-seven tons, within three days; and so on; and any days required over and above the time for delivery, so calculated, are considered and called "baulk-days." That (unless any special written application and agreement shall be made to the contrary) cargoes, or such parts of cargoes as may be required to be delivered, shall be worked according to such existing practice. Provided, nevertheless, that in order "to fetch up lost time," or to despatch the delivery, the coal-whippers shall (on being required so to do) use their utmost diligence to deliver, daily, any quantity not exceeding ninety-eight tons. And in case one or more baulk-days shall occur from any cause other than the default of the coal-whippers, the master, or other person in charge of the ship during his absence, shall pay for each baulk-day a sum equal to the amount which the coal-whippers would have earned by the delivery of forty-nine tons, in addition to the charge for the labour performed : Provided always, that when the Commissioners are satisfied that the regular discharge of colliers has been prevented by the accumulation of ice, or other extraordinary cause, and shall signify the same by notice publicly exhibited at their office, branch office, and in the coal-market, the charge for baulk-days arising therefrom shall be suspended from the date specified in such notice, and the date from which the charge for baulk-days shall again be reckoned shall be declared by a like public notice.

13. That in order to prevent the detention of vessels, when the discharge of their cargo, or part thereof, as the case may be, is completed, and to provide against delay in the payment of wages and settlement of demands, the Commissioners direct, that in all cases where the master or other person in charge of the ship, shall dispute the claim made upon him for baulk-days, on the ground that one or more of the baulk-days occurred through the default of the coal-whippers, he shall forthwith deposit, or cause to be deposited with the registrar, branch registrar, or other person duly appointed to receive the same, at the office or branch office, as the case may be, at which the contract was made, the amount in dispute, with a notice in writing, stating his objections; and the amount so deposited shall not be paid to the coal-whippers until after the expiration of thirty days; but if within that time the objection shall be established to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, the amount shall be forthwith repaid to the master or other person by whom the same was deposited, or to his agent. And in case any master or other person in charge of the ship shall, on being required to do so, neglect or refuse, immediately after the discharge of the cargo, or part of the cargo, by the coal-whippers sent from the Coal-Whippers' Office, or branch office, shall be finished, to pay the full amount due for wages and hire of tackle (if any), and the amount claimed for baulkdays, or to pay or deposit the same with the registrar, branch registrar, or other person appointed as aforesaid, the registrar or branch registrar, is hereby directed to take the necessary legal proceedings as provided by the 24th section of the Act, for enforcing the same without delay.

14. That the deduction to be made out of the men's wages for the purposes of the Act shall be at the rate of one farthing in every shilling.

15. That when tackle shall be required from the Coal-Whippers' Office, or branch office, for the de- | here and at the Yard.

livery of coals, the master, or other person in charge of the ship, shall be responsible for the same during the time it is on board the ship, and shall pay on the discharge of the cargo, or of such part thereof as shall be delivered by the tackle so required, for the use or hire thereof, the sum of seven shillings upon every vessel of two hundred and fifty tons' burthen or upwards, and four shillings and sixpence upon every vessel of less burthen than two hundred and fifty tons.

16. That for the purposes of the said Act of Parliament the Port of London shall be considered to extend from the Royal Arsenal Canal, Woolwich, to London-bridge, and to include all rivers, docks, and canals, communicating therewith, which are comprised within the said Port of London.

17. That for all ships discharging their coals above Regent's Ferry application shall be made as heretofore, at the head office, King James's-stairs, Wapping-wall; and for those discharging between Regent's Ferry and the Royal Arsenal Canal, Woolwich, at the branch office at Woolwich.
