REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOMS.

The Ladies, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing-Rooms, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names legibly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

And those Ladies, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *on the Tuesdays previous to the Drawing-Rooms, on the 26th of April and the 31st of May, on each day before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested, that in every case *written cards only* be delivered.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's

" subjects resorting to China," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order or Orders made with the advice of Her Privy Council, to ordain, for the government of Her Majesty's subjects, being within the dominions of the Emperor of China, or being within any ship or vessel at a distance of not more than one hundred miles from the coast of China, any law or ordinance which to Her Majesty in Council might seem meet, as fully and effectually as any such law or ordinance could be made by Her Majesty in Council for the government of Her Majesty's subjects, being within the island of Hong Kong.

And whereas it is expedient that all persons in holy orders of the United Church of England and Ireland, being within the dominions of the Emperor of China, or being within any ship or vessel at a distance of not more than one hundred miles from the coast of China, should be subject to the authority and jurisdiction of the see of Victoria, to be erected by Her Majesty, and to the bishop thereof, to be by Her Majesty duly nominated and appointed, in the same manner as if they were resident within the said island of Hong Kong :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order and direct, and doth hereby order and direct that all persons in holy orders of the United Church of England and Ireland, being within the dominions of the Emperor of China, or being within any ship or vessel at a distance of not more than one hundred miles from the coast of China, shall be subject to the authority and jurisdiction of the see of Victoria, and to the bishop thereof, in the same manner as if they were resident within the said island of Hong Kong.

And the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the

third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect with certain modifications the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Saint Philip and the chapelry district of Saint Peter, in Birmingham, in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas it was by the recited Acts provided, that the canonry annexed to the rectory of the church of Saint Philip, in Birmingham, should immediately upon the first vacancy thereof be detached from the said rectory, and be suspended, and that all lands, tithes and other hereditaments, excepting any right of patronage, and all other emoluments and endowments whatsoever belonging to any prebend not residentiary in any cathedral or collegiate church in England, or enjoyed by the holder of any such canonry as such holder, should immediately upon the vacancy thereof respectively, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the provisions of the same Acts, accrue to and be vested absolutely in us for the purposes thereof, and that out of the endowments belonging to the prebends in the cathedral church of Lichfield, after setting apart a certain portion of the rents and profits of the prebend of Sawley, such provision as should be deemed fit should be made for the rector of the said church of Saint Philip, in Birmingham, for the time being:

"And whereas it was by the said first and secondly-recited Acts enacted, with an especial view to the better care of populous parishes, that arrangements might from time to time be made by the authority therein provided, for improving the value or making a better provision for the spiritual duties of ill-endowed parishes or districts by means of such alterations in the exercise of patronage as might be agreed upon by patrons, with the consent of the bishop in every such case, notwithstanding that such patronage should be vested in or belong to any ecclesiastical corporation aggregate or sole:

"And whereas to the said canonry in the said cathedral church of Lichfield so forming part of the endowment of the rectory of Saint Philip as aforesaid was annexed the non-residentiary prebend of Sawley, in the same cathedral church, and by reason of the vacancy of the said canonry, on the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, the same became detached from such rectory, and all the lands, tithes and other hereditaments belonging

thereto and to the said prebend of Sawley became and now are absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts:

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the seventeenth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, ratifying a recommendation of your Majesty's Commissioners for Building New Churches, (which Order was duly gazetted on the second day of July in the same year) a chapelry district, was taken out of the parish of Saint Philip, in Birmingham, containing a population of six thousand persons at the least, and was assigned to the church of Saint Peter, which at the time of the passing of the said Act was only a chapel of ease to the rectory of Saint Philip, and the said church of Saint Peter thereupon became a benefice with cure of souls, and the right of patronage or nomination of the minister or perpetual curate to the said church of Saint Peter now belongs to the rector of Saint Philip for the time being, and it is expedient and has been agreed by the said rector that the right of patronage or nomination to the said church shall be transferred to the bishop of the diocese for the time being:

"We, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of Worcester, and of the Honourable and Reverend Grantham Munton Yorke, Rector of the said parish of Saint Philip and patron of the said church of Saint Peter, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that immediately upon and from the next vacancy of the said rectory of Saint Philip, the patronage of the said church of Saint Peter, and the right of nominating a perpetual curate thereto, shall be transferred from the said rector of Saint Philip and his successors, and shall be absolutely vested in and may be exercised by the bishop of Worcester and his successors for ever.

"And whereas by reason of the severance of the said canonry and prebend from the said rectory of Saint Philip the income of the rector thereof has become greatly diminished, and the rents, profits and emoluments of the lands, tenements and hereditaments of the property vested in us thereby are of considerable value, and fully sufficient, after complying with the proviso aforesaid respecting the fabric of the said cathedral church of Lichfield, to make the arrangements hereinafter mentioned, we further recommend and propose that there shall be paid by us to the rector for the time being of the said rectory of Saint Philip, in Birmingham, the annual sum of four hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May, and the first day of November, in every year, and that the first of such half-yearly payments shall be made on the first day of May next, and that there shall also be paid by us to the said Grantham Munton Yorke, the present rector of the said rectory and church, within ten days after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, the sum of one thousand seven hundred and six pounds ten shillings and fivepence, being the arrears of the above-mentioned annual sum of four hundred pounds, which have accrued due to him as such rector, from the day of the vacancy of the said canonry as aforesaid:

"And whereas in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for enabling Ecclesiastical Corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years,' certain building leases of portions of the glebe belonging to the said rectory of

Saint Philip, all particularly described in the schedule annexed to this scheme, have been agreed to be granted at rents amounting in the whole to the sum of two hundred and forty-five pounds per annum, or thereabouts :

“ And whereas it was by the first-recited Act enacted, that arrangements might be made for the apportionment of the income of two benefices, belonging to the same patron, between the incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith, provided that no such arrangement should be made in any case so as to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the bishop of the diocese, nor where a bishop is himself one of the patrons, without the consent of the archbishop also :

“ And whereas by virtue of the provisions aforesaid the said two benefices will, upon the next vacancy of the said rectory, belong to the same patron, namely, the bishop of Worcester for the time being, and it is, in the opinion of the said Henry Bishop of Worcester and of ourselves, expedient that the following arrangement should thereupon be made respecting the income of the said two benefices :

“ We further recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend John Bird, Archbishop of Canterbury, testified by his having also signed and sealed this scheme, that immediately upon and from the next vacancy of the said rectory of Saint Philip as aforesaid, all the said portions of glebe land of the said rectory so described in the schedule hereunto annexed, together with all buildings erected thereon, and the rents and profits arising and accruing from the same shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be separated from the said rectory of Saint Philip and be transferred and annexed to the said benefice of Saint Peters, in Birmingham, and shall be held and enjoyed by the perpetual curate thereof and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that in the mean time, and until such next vacancy of the said rectory, there shall be paid by us to the perpetual curate of Saint Peter in Birmingham, for the time being, the annual sum of two hundred pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the said first day of May and the first day of November in every year, and that the first such half-yearly payment shall be made on the said first day of May next, and that there shall be paid by us to the Reverend Joseph Greaves, the present perpetual curate of such church, within ten days from the date of the publication of this scheme in the London Gazette as aforesaid, the sum of two hundred and sixty-six pounds sixteen shillings and elevenpence, being the arrears of a like annual sum, from the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven aforesaid, when the said church of Saint Peter became a benefice with cure of souls as aforesaid.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that whenever a vacancy in the said rectory of Saint Philip or in the said chapelry district of Saint Peter shall happen on any other day than either of the two half-yearly days of payment aforesaid, the amount payable shall in each such case be duly apportioned between and paid to the rector or perpetual curate making the vacancy or his representatives, and the rector or perpetual curate succeeding to the said rectory or chapelry district, as the case may be.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

 scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and
 every part thereof, shall be effectual in law im-
 mediately from and after the time when this Order
 shall have been duly published in the London
 Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her
 Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased
 hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith
 registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Wor-
 cester.
