

Croatia, and has proposed to raise a Regiment of Horse at his own Charge. The Count de Palfi is very active in order to the raising a considerable Body of *Hungarians* for the service of the next Campaign, in which several of the principal Nobility of *Hungary* join with him, and, it's said, they design to bring into the Field no less than 20000 Men at the Charge of that Kingdom. The Courier that arrived here lately from *Venice* with Instructions to the Ambassador of the Republick at this Court, upon the Overtures of Peace which have been made by the *Turks*, was this Week sent back with repeated Assurances that his Imperial Majesty will not make any steps towards a Peace, but according to such Measures as shall be agreed on by all the Allies. The Turkish Aga at *Comorra* has sent hither another Letter from the Viceroy of *Buda* to the President of the Emperor's Council of War with new Proposals, of which we do not know the Particulars, but it's said the Grand Signior offers to send Ambassadors to any place the Emperor shall chuse for a Treaty. In the mean time we have advice from *Constantinople*, that there has been a great disorder between the *Fanisaries* and the *Spaki's*, and that to appease the former, who were the strongest, several Bassas and other eminent Officers had been strangled, on pretence that they had not well behaved themselves in their Commands.

Hague, Decemb. 28. The Heer *Van Odyke* is going for *Zealand*, to assist in the Assembly of the States of that Province, who are to meet the 8th of the next Month. The Heer *Van Stilte* will now be very quickly dispatched, all the Provinces having consented to the first Payment of the Arrears of Subsidies due from this State to the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, except *Zealand*, the States whereof will, without doubt, likewise consent therunto at their next meeting. The States of *Holland*, having consented to the state of the War for the ensuing year, are adjourned to the 8th of the next Month. The Minister that is here from the Duke of *Hanover*, has presented a Memorial concerning the Arrears of Subsidies which the said Duke pretends for this State. The Heer *Heemskerke*, our Ambassador at the Court of *Spain*, has obtained Leave to return home in the Spring. The Commissary *Van Heesck*, who carried the last Presents from this State to the Governments of *Argiers*, *Tunis*, and *Tripoli*, has this Week had several Conferences with the Deputies of the States General, in order, as is believed, to his being sent back to *Argiers*. The Count de *Horne*, General of the Artillery of this State, is returned from *Brussels*.

Brussels, Jan. 1. The Prince de *Rasbe*, Governor of the Province of *Hainault*, is at present in a condition that gives great hopes of his Recovery. The Prince de *Vaudemont* is likewise much better than he was, but is however so weak, that he has not the use of his hands or his feet. We have an account from the New Conquests, that the *French* Intendants have ordered the Rents of the Estates the Subjects of *Spain* have within the *French* Territories (which we formerly told you were sequestered by way of Reprisal for the Money taken out of the *French* Ship at the *Groyne*) to be forthwith brought in by the respective Receivers. The Regiment of *Moncada* will march from hence to-morrow for *Ghauns*, and that of *Marino*, which is now there, is to come hither in its place. There has lately happened a difference between the King of *Spain's* Officers in the Province of *Guedres*, and those of the Elector of *Brandenburgh* in *Cleves* about their Jurisdictions, and some Cattle have

been seized on both sides, but it's not doubted this matter will be amicably adjusted, and we are told that Deputies are coming hither for that purpose from *Cleves*. The Letters from *Hungary* confirm the News we had of *Fekelty's* being strangled at *Belgrade*, and add that they have sent his Head to *Constantinople*, to pacifie the People, who are greatly incensed against the Authors of this War. They write from *Poland*, that that King intends to be in the Field early in the Spring at the Head of his Army; And that the *Moscovites* shew a great disposition to enter into the Alliance against the *Turks*.

Paris, Decemb. 29. There is a discourse that the King intends to take a Journey in the Spring towards *Lorraine* and *Alsace*. The News we had of the Emperors having consented to refer the Pretensions of the Dutchess of *Orleans* upon the Allodial Lands of the Palatinate, is not confirmed. The Abbot *Morel*, his most Christian Majesties Envoy at the Court of the Elector Palatin, has Orders to return home. The Senate of *Genoua* have, it's said, laid a New Imposition of Four Crowns per Tun, upon all *French* Ships trading thither.
