PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners VV for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the law "relating to ecclesiastical houses of residence," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

" We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act' to alter and amend the law relating to ecclesi-'astical houses of residence,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, relating to one of the canonical houses of Gloucester Cathedral.

"Whereas the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of Gloucester have, under the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and duly gazetted, purchased a messuage or dwelling-house and premises late in the occupation of Henry Hooper Wilton, and situate within the precincts of the said cathedral church:

"And whereas it is by the said recited Act enacted, that any house so purchased by the dean and chapter of any cathedral church may, by the authority of a scheme prepared by us, and an Order of your Majesty in Council, and with the consent of such dean and chapter, be made the deanery or the house of residence for any canon of such church:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us, by the said dean and chapter of Gloucester, that the house of residence attached to the canonry in the said cathedral church annexed to the mastership of Pembroke College, in Oxford, is very inconvenient, and that it is desirable that the said house should be detached from the said canonry, and that in lieu thereof the messuage or dwellingshould thereupon become the residence of the canon of the same canonry:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said dean and chapter of Gloucester, in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their corporate seal, that the house of residence belonging to the canonry now held by the Reverend Francis Jeune, Doctor of Civil Law, as one of the canons of the said cathedral church, and Master of Pembroke College, in Oxford, shall be detached from the said canonry, and shall be disposed of in such manner as the said dean and chapter may hereafter deem fit, with the consent of their visitor, and of us, signified under our common seal, and that in lieu thereof the said messuage or dwelling-house so described in the said schedule hereunto annexed, and so much and such part of the garden and premises belonging to the same as is therein particularly described and set out shall become and be the house of residence of the said Francis Jeune and his successors, canons of the said canonry, so long as he and they shall continue to hold the same, subject nevertheless to the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament, and of any statute or custom of the said cathedral church relating to canonical houses of residence :

"And we further recommend and propose, that the said Francis Jeune, as such canon of the said cathedral church, or his successor for the time being in the same canonry, shall at his or their own personal charge and expense insure and keep insured the said house of residence and premises so attached to such canonry as aforesaid from loss or damage by fire in one of the public offices of assurance in London or Westminster, to be approved by us, in the sum of twelve hundred pounds in the whole; and that he and every future canon of the said canonry shall from time to time so insure and keep insured the said house and premises in the like sum, and shall, within fourteen days after any premium for such assurance shall have become due, deliver and hand over to us the receipt for such premium; and that in case of any loss or damage by fire to the said house and premises, any and every sum of money receivable under such assurance, shall be paid to and deposited with us, in trust, to be applied, and the same, together with any interest and accumulations thereon, shall be applied by us towards the rebuilding or repairing and reinstating of the said house and premises so purchased as aforesaid, house and premises, or of such part or parts and described in the Schedule hercunto annexed, thereof as may have so suffered loss or damage, in

such manner as shall appear to us, with the concurrence of the said dean and chapter, to be fit and

proper.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"A messuage or dwelling-house and premises described in the schedule annexed to a scheme prepared by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and ratified by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the second day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the seventh day of March in the same year; but without the coach-house and stable heretcfore occupied therewith, and with so much only of the garden thereto belonging as has been recently marked out by the dean and chapter of Gloucester, and contains, with the site of the said messuage or dwelling-house by recent admeasurement, six hundred and seventy-three square yards, together with a right of way to and from the said messuage and garden, out of and into the College-green, and also out of and into a lane, called Saint John's-lane, in the city of Gloucester."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law, immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the two several registries of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, at Bristol and Gloucester.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Westbury, in the county_of Wilts, and within the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be

assigned to the consecrated church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity, situate at Heywood, in the said parish of Westbury, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render 'more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous 'parishes,' or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners, by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'The Chapelry District of Heywood,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The chapelry district of Heywood is bounded on the north by the parishes of Steeple Ashton and North Bradley, on the north-west by the said parish of North Bradley, on the south-west and south by the remaining part of the said parish of Westbury, from which the said district is separated by a line commencing at Brook-house, and proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the middle of the brook or stream as far as the road, leading from Storridge to Westbury, and then along the middle of such road as far as the road branching therefrom on the south-eastern side of the Ham-field, and then along the middle of such road as far as the church path, and from that path by the northern and eastern enclosures of field No. 1813, on the tithe apportionment map of the said parish of Westbury, part of the eastern enclosure of No. 1812, the north-western and north-eastern enclosures of No. 1996, where it meets the turnpike-road, against No. 1994 (B) and passing through No. 2014, in a parallel direction, the line then proceeds in the same direction by part of the north-eastern enclosure of No. 2011, the northern enclosures of Nos. 2024, (C) 2024, (B) and 2023, when it crosses through in a parallel direction and includes within the district the northern part of the field No. 2030, it then proceeds by the southern enclosure of No. 2031, the northern enclosures of Nos. 2129, 2130, and 2131, the western and northern enclosures of Nos. 2122 and 2121 (A), when it reaches the hamlet of Bratton, in the said parish of Westbury, and which said hamlet there forms the eastern boundary of the said proposed district, as far as the said parish of Steeple Ashton, and as the whole of such district is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church at Heywood aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incum-

bent thereof for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof the said Edward Lord Bishop of Salisbury has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Salisbury.
