PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the law of copyright," it is among other things enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any person, not being the proprietor of the copyright, or some person authorized by him, to import into any part of the United Kingdom, or into any other part of the British dominions, for sale or hire, any printed book first composed or written, or printed and published in any part of the United Kingdom, wherein there shall be copyright, and reprinted in any country or place whatsoever out of the British dominions :

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British pos-"sessions abroad," books wherein the copyright is subsisting, first composed or written, or printed in the United Kingdom, and printed or reprinted in any other country, are absolutely prohibited to be imported into the British possessions abroad :

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to the " protection in the colonies of works entitled to " copyright in the United Kingdom," it is enacted that in case the legislature, or proper legislative authorities in any British possession, shall be disposed to make due provision for securing or pro-tecting the rights of British authors, in such possession, and shall pass an Act or make an Ordinance for that purpose, and shall transmit the same in the proper manner to the Secretary of State, in order that it may be submitted to Her Majesty; and in case Her Majesty shall be of opinion that such Act or Ordinance is sufficient for the purpose of securing to British authors reasonable protec-tion within such possession, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit so to do, to express Her Royal approval of such Act or Ordinance, and thereupon to issue an Order in Council declaring that so long as the provisions of such Act or Ordinance continue in force within such colony, the prohibitions contained in the aforesaid Acts, and hereinbefore recited, and any prohibitions contained in the said Acts or in any other Acts against the importing, selling, letting out to hire, exposing for sale or hire, or possessing foreign reprints of books first composed, written, printed or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended, so far as regards such colony :

And whereas an Act has been passed by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of the Island of Newfoundland, No. 74, intituled "An Act to "regulate the importation of books into this "colony, and to protect the British author," whereby provision is made for securing to British authors a certain remuneration in respect of unauthorized copies of books under copyright imported into the said island :

And whereas Her Majesty hath expressed Her royal approval of the same :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by the authority of the same, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that so long as the said Act of the legislature of the said island shall remain and eontinue in force within the said island, all prohibitions in either of the said hereinbefore recited Acts of the Imperial Parliament, or in any Acts thereof contained, against the importing into the said island, or against the selling, letting out to hire, or possessing therein foreign reprints of books first composed, written, printed or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended, so far as regards foreign reprints imported into the said island :

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. *Wm. L. Bathurst.*

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain " modifications, the fourth report of the Commis-" sioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners of England, in pursuance of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry 'into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth 'report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical 'Duties and Revenues,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme, for augmenting the income of the archdeaconry of Winchester in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas it was by the said recited Act enacted, that any archdeaconry might, subject to the consent of the bishop, be endowed amongst other modes by augmentation out of the common fund in the said Act mentioned, but not so as to raise the average annual income thereof to an amount exceeding two hundred pounds; with a proviso that no archdeacon should be entitled to hold any endowment or augmentation or other emolument as such archdeacon under the provisions of the same Act, unless resident for the space of eight months in every year within the diocese in which his archdeaconry should be situate, but subject to the same provisions as to licences for non-residence which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities and residence in the same Act mentioned :

"And whereas the permanent average annual income of the said archdeaconry of Winchester does not now exceed the average annual sum of seventy pounds:

"And whereas the Venerable Joseph Cotton Wigram was, on the sixteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fortyseven, appointed and now is archdeacon of Winchester:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and pro-pose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconry of Winchester shall be endowed in manner following ; that is to say : that there shall be paid by us to the said Venerable Joseph Cotton Wigram, archdeacon of Winchester, and to his successors in the same archdeaconry, so long as they shall respectively hold the same, the annual sum of one hundred and thirty pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and that the first such whole yearly payment shall be made on the first day of January next; and every such whole yearly payment shall be made only on production to us of sufficient evidence that the archdeacon claiming the same continued so entitled during the preceding year; and that whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the said archdeaconry

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her

Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

W HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to "amend and render more effectual an Act passed "in the last Session of Parliament for building "and promoting the building of additional "churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any other power or authority vested in Her Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, made a representation to Her Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say: "Your Majesty's Commissioners for building

new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Church Gresley, in the county of Derby, and within the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Emmanuel, situate at Swadlincote, in the said parish, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An 'Act to amend and render more effectual an Act 'passed in the last session of Parliament for ⁶ building and promoting the building of addi-⁶ tional churches in populous parishes,⁷ or under or by virtue of any other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners, by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be called 'The Chapelry District of Swadlincote,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned :

" The chapelry district of Swadlincote is bounded on the west and north-west by the parish of Stapenhill, on the north and north-east by the parish of Hartshorn, on the east and south-east by the parish of Ashby-de-la-Zouch and the road leading from Woodville in a south-westerly direction to Gresley, as far as the road called Coppiceside; the district is then bounded on the south and south-west by the remaining part of the parish of Church Gresley, from which such district is separated as follows; viz. : by a line commencing at the south-western side of the road, called Coppice-side, where it enters the road leading from Woodville to Church Gresley, and passes up the western side of the said Coppice-side-road northerly, as far as the blacksmith's shop; then turning in a westerly direction for the distance of seventeen yards from the western side of the said road and to the back of the premises belonging to

such blacksmith's shop, proceeds northerly, in a line at the back of the said blacksmith's and of the houses on the western side of such road at the distance of fifty-two yards, as far as the back of the premises at the junction of Coppice-side with the road leading from Swadlincote to Castle Gresley, and at the distance of fifty yards on the south side of the latter road ; the boundary line then passes in a westerly direction at the distance of fifty yards from the southern side of the said road leading to Castle Gresley until it reaches a distance of forty-three yards from the toll-gate, and crossing the said latter road, proceeds up the western side of the road leading from the toll-gate in a northerly direction to Old Colliery, as far as the stream on the north side of the Swadlincote Railway, and passing westerly along that stream as far as Dark Land Houses, and then turns southerly, westerly, and northerly, along the enclosure of such premises, and again reaches the beforementioned stream, along which it proceeds as far as the parish of Stapenhill, as the said district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church at Swadlincote aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the incumbent thereof for the time being:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lichfield (as the Bishop of the diocese) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof the said John Lord Bishop of Lichfield has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the like advice, hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield. Treaty of Friendship and Commerce between Her Majesty and the Republic of Liberia. Signed at London, November 21, 1848.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, August 1, 1849.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Republic of Liberia, being desirous to conclude a Treaty of Peace and Friendship, and to regulate thereby the commercial intercourse between the dominions and subjects of Her Majesty and the territories and citizens of the Republic; Her Majesty has for this purpose named as Her Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

The Right Honourable Henry John Viscount Palmerston, Baron Temple, a Peer of Ireland, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, a Member of Parliament, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Right Honourable Henry Labouchere, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, a Member of Parliament, and President of the Committee of Privy Council for affairs of Trade and Foreign Plantations:

And the Republic of Liberia having, by resolutions of the Legislature, bearing date the 4th of February 1848, authorized and empowered Joseph Jenkins Roberts, the President of the Republic, to conclude such Treaty on behalf of the Republic;

The Plenipotentiaries of Her Majesty, and the said President of the Republic, after having communicated to each other their respective powers, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:

ARTICLE I.

There shall be perpetual peace and friendship between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; Her heirs and successors, and the Republic of Liberia, and between their respective subjects and citizens.

ARTICLE IL

There shall be reciprocal freedom of commerce between the British dominions and the Republic of Liberia. The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty may reside in, and trade to, any part of the territories of the Republic to which any other foreigners are or shall be admitted. They shall enjoy full protection for their persons and properties; they shall be allowed to buy from and to sell to whom they like, without being restrained or prejudiced by any monopoly, contract, or ex-clusive privilege of sale or purchase whatever; and they shall moreover enjoy all other rights and privileges which are or may be granted to any other foreigners, subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation. The citizens of the Republic of Liberia shall, in return, enjoy similar protection and privileges in the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty.

ARTICLE III.

No tonnage, import, or other duties or charges shall be levied in the Republic of Liberia on British vessels, or on goods imported or exported in British vessels, beyond what are or may be levied on national vessels, or on the like goods imported or exported in national vessels; and, in like manner, no tonnage, import, or other duties or charges, shall be levied in the British dominions on vessels of the Republic, or on goods imported or exported in those vessels, beyond what are or may be levied on national vessels, or on the like goods imported or exported in national vessels.

ARTICLE IV.

Merchandize or goods coming from the British dominions in any vessel, or imported in British vessels from any country, shall not be prohibited by the Republic of Liberia, nor be subject to higher duties than are levied on the same kinds of merchandize or goods coming from any other foreign country, or imported in any other vessels.

All articles the produce of the Republic may be exported therefrom by British subjects and British vessels, on as favourable terms as by the subjects and vessels of any other foreign country.

ARTICLE V.

It being the intention of the Government of the Republic of Liberia to trade in certain articles of import, with a view to raising a revenue by selling them at a fixed advance upon the cost price, it is hereby agreed that in no case shall private merchants be absolutely prohibited from importing any of such articles, or any article in which the Government of the Republic may at any time see fit to trade; nor shall such articles, or any article in which the Government of the Republic may at any time see fit to trade, be subject to a duty of a greater amount than the amount of the advance upon the cost price at which the Government may from time to time be bound to sell the same.

In case the Government of the Republic shall at any time fix the price of any article of native produce, with a view to such article being taken in payment for any articles in which the Government may trade, such article of native produce shall be received into the Treasury at the same fixed price, in payment, of taxes, from all persons trading with the Republic.

ARTICLE VI. CONTRACTOR AND

The protection of the Government of the Republic shall be afforded to all British vessels, their officers and crews. If any such vessels should be wrecked on the coast of the Republic, the local authorities shall succour them, and shall secure them from plunder, and shall cause all articles saved from the wreck to be restored to The amount of salvage their lawful owners. dues in such cases shall be regulated, in the event of dispute, by arbitrators chosen by both parties.

ARTICLE VII.

It being the intention of the two Contracting Parties to bind themselves by the present Treaty to treat each other on the footing of the most favoured nation, it is hereby agreed between them, that any favour, privilege, or immunity whatever, in matters of commerce and navigation, which either Contracting Party has actually granted, or may hereafter grant, to the subjects or citizens of any other State, shall be extended to the subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party, gratuitously, if the concession in favour of that other State shall have been gratuitous, or in return for a compensation as nearly as possible of proportionate value and effect, to be adjusted by mutual agreement, if the concession shall have been conditional.

ARTICLE VIII.

Each Contracting Party may appoint Consuls for the protection of trade, to reside in the dominions of the other; but no such Consul shall enter upon the exercise of his functions until he shall have been approved and admitted, in the usual form, by the Government of the country to which he is sent.

ARTICLE IX.

Slavery and the Slave Trade being perpetually abolished in the Republic of Liberia, the Republic engages that a law shall be passed, declaring it to be piracy for any Liberian citizen or vessel to be

engaged or concerned in the Slave Trade. The Republic engages to permit any British vessel of war which may be furnished with special instructions under the Treaties between Great Britain and Foreign Powers for the prevention of the Slave Trade, to visit any vessels sailing under the Liberian flag, which may, on reasonable grounds, be suspected of being engaged in the Slave Trade; and if, by the result of the visit, it should appear to the officer in command of such British vessel of war that the suspicions which led thereto are well grounded, the vessel shall be sent without delay to a Liberian port, and shall be delivered up to the Liberian authorities, to be proceeded against according to the laws of the Republic.

ARTICLE X.

The Republic of Liberia further engages to permit any British vessel of war which may be furnished with special instructions as aforesaid, to visit, on the coast within the jurisdiction of the Republic, or in the ports of the same, any vessel which may be suspected of being engaged in the Slave Trade, and which shall be found sailing under any flag whatever, or without any flag; and if the suspicions which led to the visit should appear to the officer in command of such British vessel of war to be well grounded, to detain such vessel, in order to send it as soon as possible before the competent court for adjudication.

Duly constituted ports of entry in the Republic of Liberia shall be excepted from the operation of the stipulations of the present Article; and no vessel shall be visited by a British cruizer within the limits of such ports, except on permission specially granted by the local authorities.

ARTICLE XI.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London within the space of twelve months from the date hereof. In witness whereof the Plenipotentiaries of Her Britannic Majesty, and the President of the Republic of Liberia, have signed the same, and have affixed thereto their respective seals.
