Whereas by the Act eleventh and twelfth Victoria, cap. 123, intifuled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the tenth year of Her present Majesty for the more speedy removal of certain nuisances, and the prevention of contagious and epidemic diseases," and by virtue of an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 27th day of March 1849, directing that the provisions of the said Act be continued in force throughout the whole of Great Britain; We, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases;

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And whereas the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, appears to be affected by formidable epidemic and endemic disease;

Now We, the General Board of Health, in further exercise of the power vested in us as aforesaid, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch:

1. That three additional properly qualified medical officers be forthwith appointed for a period of six weeks from the date of this present order; and that they exclusively devote their time to making a careful house to house visitation, throughout the affected localities, at least once each day, so as to discover at the earliest period the existence of cases of diarrhœa and premonitory symptoms of cholera, and to be enabled to treat them on the spot, by the immediate administration of the suitable medicines.

2. That three intelligent persons be appointed for a like period of six weeks to act throughout the affected districts of the parish as lay visitors, under the directions of the parochial medical officers, and to co-operate with the said medical officers in discovering cases of diarrhœa in their earliest stages, and in instructing persons who may be so affected, how and where to procure the necessary medicines; and that they report without delay all serious cases that may come under their observation or knowledge of the nearest medical officer.

3. That in addition to the existing surgeries of the medical officers, three dispensaries or depôts be forthwith provided, and be open night and day, in suitable stations, with sufficient medical aid for all who may require it for themselves or others, when attacked by cholera or any of its premonitory symptoms.



That these dispensaries or depôts, and also the surgeries of the medical officers, and the treatment provided thereat, be made known throughout the parish, by means of handbills to be printed and so distributed in all the affected localities of St. Leonard, Shoreditch, so that the poor and all classes of inhabitants may know where medicines and attendance are to be obtained in cases of emergency.

gency. 5. That such a number of efficient nurses be provided as in the opinion of the medical officers of the parish, or of a medical superintending inspector of the General Board of Health shall be deemed adequate and sufficient.

6. That there be forthwith provided a house of refuge, to which may be removed the families of such necessitous persons as have been attacked with cholera, and also such necessitous persons living under the same roof, or in the vicinity of persons so attacked, as the medical officers may deem it necessary to remove; the houses, rooms, or dwellings from which persons may have been removed to the houses of refuge, to be cleansed and purified by the owners or persons having the care or ordering thereof, or in their default by the trustees of the poor of the parish of St. Leonard, Shoreditch.

7. That two inspectors of nuisances be forthwith appointed by the trustees of the poor.


And whereas the crew of a Swedish vessel named the Anton, now lying off the Thames Police Station, Folley-wall, Poplar, have been affected with cholera, and two of them have died, the remainder having been conveyed to the hospital;

1. We, the General Board of Health, do hereby order and require the Guardians of the Poplar Union to cause their medical officer to enter and examine the condition of the said vessel, and any other vessel in which cases of cholera have occurred, to inquire into the causes of the outbreak of cholera among the crew, and to order the said vessel or vessels to be thoroughly cleansed and purified throughout, and the cargoes to be removed; if he shall think necessary;

And we further order that the said Guardians prohibit the survivors of the said crew or crews, or any other person, from returning to live on board the said vessel or vessels until the medical officer as aforesaid shall certify that they are in a perfectly safe and wholesome condition;

3. And we further order that the proceedings and arrangements as aforesaid shall be subject to the approval of any medical superintending inspector whom the Board may send to inquire into the condition of the said vessel or vessels; but that in the absence of such inspector the said medical officer to the Guardians shall act as directed aforesaid.

That no fish be allowed to be landed or cured, during a period of six weeks from the date of this present Order, within the limits of the parish of Mevagissey, except in such parts thereof or in such mode as the medical superintending inspector, or, in his absence, one of the medical officers of the aforesaid parish, shall certify that it can be done with safety to the health of the inhabitants.
