THE Queen has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of an Earl of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto His Royal Highness Albert Edward Prince of Wales, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, and His Heirs, Kings of the said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for ever, by the name, style, and title of Earl of Dublin.

AT the Court at *Balmoral*, the 5th day of *September*, 1849.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority vested in Her Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in the words following; that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Kirkburton, in the West Riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Paul, situate at Shepley, in the said parish of Kirkburton, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the

'building, of additional churches in populous parishes,' or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should comprise the township of Shepley, and be called 'The Chapelry District of Shepley,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The chapelry district of Shepley is to consist of the township of Shepley, and is bounded on the east and north by the township of Shelly; on the north-west by the township of Thurstonland; on the west and south-west by the township of Foulstone, all in the parish of Kirkburton; and on the south and south-east by the townships of Cumberworth and Cumberworth Half, in the parishes of Silkstone and Kirkburton, as such district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed and thereon coloured green:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Paul, at Shepley aforesaid; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be received for, and paid over to the Reverend Richard Collins, the present vicar or incumbent of the parish church of the said parish of Kirkburton, during his incumbency of such parish church, and that upon his avoidance thereof, the said fees should belong to the incumbent for the time being of the said church of Saint Paul, at Shepley aforesaid:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon (as the Bishop of the diocese of Ripon) has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made;

and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the like advice, to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Ripon. *C. 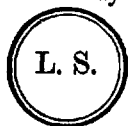
And whereas the said parish of Saint Mary-le-bone appears to be affected by formidable epidemic and endemic disease;

We, the General Board of Health, do, in further exercise of the power vested in us as aforesaid, issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to the said parish of Saint Mary-le-bone:

1. That two legally qualified medical men be forthwith appointed, in addition to those already appointed, in and for the said parish, to afford to persons within the said parish afflicted by or threatened with cholera, such medical aid as may be proper, and more particularly to assist in carrying out the system of from house to house visitation within the said parish, and such other measures of precaution in relation to the said disease as it may be deemed advisable to adopt.

2. That a suitable house or houses or places of refuge be forthwith provided for the reception of the families of poor or necessitous persons within the said parish who have been or may be attacked by or threatened with cholera, and of poor or necessitous persons living under the same roof or within the immediate vicinity of persons so attacked or threatened, and also for the reception of persons whom it may be advisable and proper to remove from overcrowded dwellings where disease may have made or may make its appearance.

2. That three lay visitors be immediately appointed, to aid in a regular and systematic house to house visitation, especially of the infected districts.

To the Managers of the Tottenham-court-road Chapel, Tottenham-court-road, Middlesex; and to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Act twelfth and thirteenth Victoria, cap. 3, intituled "An Act to amend the Nuisances' Removal and Diseases' Prevention Act, 1848," it is provided that it shall be lawful, in England or Wales, for the General Board of Health to cause inquiry to be made by a superintending inspector, or by such other ways and means as the General Board of Health may deem fit to direct, into the state of the burial grounds in any part of England or Wales, excepted from the powers of the Public Health Act, 1848, or in any populous city, town, or place in England or Wales to which for the time being the said Act has not been applied; and if it appear to the General Board of Health that any such burial ground is in such a state as to be dangerous to the persons living in the neighbourhood thereof, it shall be lawful for the said General Board of Health, in England and Wales, under the seal of the said Board, and under the hands of two or more members thereof, to issue such orders as the said

Board may think fit for the application of such disinfecting substances, and for the adoption of such other measures of precaution in relation to the premises as may, in the opinion of the said Board, tend to lessen or remove the danger to health;

And whereas Gavin Milroy, Doctor of Medicine, Superintending Inspector to the said Board, has inquired into the state of the burial ground of Whitfield's Chapel, Tottenham-court-road, Middlesex, and has reported the said burial ground to be in a condition dangerous to the health of the persons living in the neighbourhood thereof;

We, the General Board of Health, being of opinion that, in order to lessen or remove the danger to health at present arising from the said burial ground, it is expedient that interments should be discontinued therein, do hereby order and require the Managers, and other persons having the care and control of the same, to cause the discontinuance of interments in the said burial ground until further order, and to make such provision for interment elsewhere as to them may appear necessary, under the tenth section of the Nuisances' Amendment Act aforesaid, or otherwise.

1. That a legally qualified medical man, or (in case a legally qualified medical man cannot be obtained) an advanced medical student, be forthwith appointed to act as assistant to the parochial surgeon for the time being of Putney, within the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union.

2. That an efficient and thorough system of daily scavenging be forthwith instituted within the above mentioned union.

3. That a local Board or Committee be immediately appointed to superintend the sanitary affairs in general of Putney, during the continuance of the present epidemic.

4. That a house or suitable rooms be forthwith prepared, wherever it may be deemed most convenient (being as near as practicable to the affected districts) to serve as a place or places of refuge, for the reception of the families of those who have been attacked by cholera, and also of those necessitous persons living under the same roof, or in the immediate vicinity of those so attacked; and that the houses or rooms from which such persons have been so removed shall be thoroughly cleansed and purified by the owners or those having the care or ordering thereof, or in their default by the Board of Guardians of the aforesaid union.
