on Education, to appoint the Reverend John
Pilkington Norris, M. A. Fellow of Trinity
College, Cambridge, to be one of Her Majesty's
Inspectors of Schools.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session
of Parliament held in the twelfth and
thirteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty,
intituled the "Passengers' Act, one thousand
eight hundred and forty-nine," it is enacted, that
it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order
in Council, to be by Her made with the advice of
the Privy Council, to prescribe such rules and re-
gulations as to Her Majesty may seem fit, for pre-
serving order, and for securing cleanliness and
ventilation on board of passenger ships proceeding
from the United Kingdom to any port or place in
Her Majesty's possessions abroad, and the said
rules and regulations from time to time in like
manner to alter, amend, and revoke, as occasion
may require ;

And whereas it is expedient to revoke an Order

in Council made at a Court held at Osborne-
House, Isle of Wight, on the fifteenth day of April
one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, in
virtue of the provisions of an Act (now repealed)
passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her
Majesty, intituled "An Act to make further
provision for one year, and to the end of the th n
next session of Parliament, for the carriage of
passengers to North America," and to make a new
Order in Council which shall extend to passenger
ships proceeding from the United Kingdom, not
only to North America, but to any port or place in
Her Majesty's possessions abroad, out of Europe,
and not being within the Mediterranean Sea ;

Now, therefore, Her Majesty doth, by and
with the advice of Her Privy Council, and
in pursuance and exercise of the authority
vested in Her by the said "Passengers' Act,
one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine," order,
and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in
Council of the fifteenth of April one thousand
eight hundred and forty-eight be, and the same
is hereby revoked ; and that the following shall
henceforth be the rules for preserving order and
for securing cleanliness and ventilation to be
observed on board of every passenger ship pro-
ceeding from the United Kingdom to any port or
place in Her Majesty's possessions abroad, out of
Europe, and not being within the Mediter-
ranean Sea.

1. All passengers who shall not be prevented by
sickness, or other sufficient cause, to be determined
by the surgeon, or in ships carrying no surgeon,
by the master, shall rise not later than seven
o'clock A.M., at which hour the fires shall be
lighted.

2. It shall be the duty of the cook, appointed
under the twenty-sixth section of the said "Pas-
sengers' Act, one thousand eight hundred and
forty-nine," to light the fires and to take care
that they be kept alight during the day, and also
to take care that each passenger, or family of
passengers, shall have the use of the fire-place, at
the proper hours, in an order to be fixed by the
master.

3. When the passengers are dressed their beds
shall be rolled up.

4. The decks, including the space under the
bottom of the berths, shall be swept before break-
fast, and all dirt thrown overboard.

5. The breakfast hour shall be from eight to
nine o'clock A.M. ; provided that, before the com-
mencement of breakfast, all the emigrants, except
as hereinbefore excepted, be out of bed and

dressed, and that the beds have been rolled up, and the deck on which the emigrants live properly swept.

6. The deck shall further be swept after every meal, and, after breakfast is concluded, shall be also dry holystoned or scraped. This duty, as well as that of cleaning the ladders, hospitals, and round-houses, shall be performed by a party taken in rotation from the adult males above fourteen, in the proportion of five to every one hundred emigrants, and who shall be considered as sweepers for the day. But the single women shall perform this duty in their own compartment, where a separate compartment is allotted to them, and the occupant of each berth shall see that his own berth is well brushed out.

7. Dinner shall commence at one o'clock P.M. and supper at six P.M.

8. The fires shall be extinguished at seven P.M. unless otherwise directed by the master, or required for the use of the sick, and the emigrants shall be in their berths at ten o'clock P.M. except under the permission or authority of the surgeon; or, if there be no surgeon, of the master.

9. Three safety-lamps shall be lit at dusk, and kept burning till ten o'clock P.M.; after which hour two of the lamps may be extinguished, one being nevertheless kept burning at the main hatchway all night.

10. No naked light shall be allowed at any time or on any account.

11. The scuttles and stemports, if any, shall, weather permitting, be opened at seven o'clock A.M. and kept open till ten o'clock P.M.; and the hatches shall be kept open whenever the weather permits.

12. The coppers and cooking utensils shall be cleaned every day.

13. The beds shall be well shaken and aired on deck at least twice a week.

14. The bottom boards of the berths, if not fixtures, shall be removed and dry-scrubbed, and taken on deck at least twice a week.

15. A space of deck-room shall be apportioned for a hospital, not less, for vessels carrying one hundred passengers, than forty-eight superficial feet, with two or four bed-berths erected therein; nor less, for vessels carrying two hundred or more passengers, than one hundred and twenty superficial feet, with six bed-berths therein.

16. Two days in the week shall be appointed by the master as washing days; but no washing or drying of clothes shall on any account be permitted between decks.

17. On Sunday mornings the passengers shall be mustered at ten o'clock A.M. and will be expected to appear in clean and decent apparel. The Lord's day shall be observed as religiously as circumstances will admit.

18. No spirits or gunpowder shall be taken on board by any passenger; and if either of those articles be discovered in the possession of a passenger, it shall be taken into the custody of the master during the voyage, and not returned to the passenger until he is on the point of disembarking.

19. No loose hay or straw shall be allowed below for any purpose.

20. No smoking shall be allowed between decks.

21. All Gambling, fighting, riotous or quarrelsome behaviour, swearing and violent language, shall be at once put a stop to. Swords and other offensive weapons shall, as soon as the passengers embark, be placed in the custody of the master.

22. No sailors shall be allowed to remain on the passenger deck, among the passengers, except on duty.

23. No passenger shall go to the ship's cook-house without special permission from the master, nor remain in the forecabin among the sailors on any account.

24. In vessels not expressly required by the said "Passengers' Act, 1849," to have on board such ventilating apparatus as therein mentioned, such other provision shall be made for ventilation as shall be required by the emigration officer, at the port of embarkation, or in his absence by the officers of customs.

25. And to prevent all doubts in the construction of this Order in Council, it is hereby further ordered that the terms "United Kingdom" and "Passenger Ship" shall herein have the same significations as are assigned to them respectively in the said "Passengers' Act, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine."

And the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Right Honourable Sir Thomas Wilde, Knt. Lord Chief Justice of Her Majesty's Court of Common Pleas, at Westminster, hath appointed Henry Bunny, of Newbury, in the county of Berks, Gentleman, to be one of the Perpetual Commissioners for taking the acknowledgments of deeds to be executed by married women, under the Act passed for the abolition of fines and recoveries, and for the substitution of more simple modes of assurance, in and for the county of Berks.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Taunton Union; and to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Act eleventh and twelfth Victoria, cap. 123, intituled "An Act to renew and amend an Act of the tenth year of Her present Majesty for the more speedy removal of certain nuisances, and the prevention of contagious and epidemic diseases," and by virtue of an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 25th day of September 1849, directing that the provisions of the said Act be continued in force throughout the whole of Great Britain; We, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases;

And whereas it is provided in the 5th section of the aforesaid recited Act "That nothing hereinbefore contained shall apply to any district,

parish, or place, in which the Public Health Act, 1848, or any part thereof, shall be in force, unless and except in so far as the General Board of Health, by order in writing, sealed with the seal of such Board, and signed by two or more members thereof, or (in case there be no such Board in existence) as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by order in writing under his hand, shall otherwise direct ;"

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the said Act shall continue in force throughout the several parishes comprised in the Taunton Union, for the space of two calendar months from and after the date of this Order, notwithstanding the application of the Public Health Act to the municipal borough of Taunton ;

We, the General Board of Health, do hereby order and declare, that the various provisions and powers of the above-recited Removal of Nuisances' and Prevention of Contagious Diseases' Act shall remain in force within and throughout the several parishes comprised in the Taunton Union for the aforesaid period of two calendar months from and after the date of this present Order.

Whereas by the Nuisances' Removal and Diseases' Prevention Act, 1848, it was enacted that when any part of the United Kingdom should appear to be threatened by any formidable epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the Lords, and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any three or more of them (the Lord President of the Council, or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State being one), might, by order or orders, to be by them made, direct that the provisions contained in the said Act for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Great Britain, and that every such Order should be in force for six calendar months, or for such shorter period as in such Order should be expressed ; and whereas by an Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (the Right Honourable Viscount Palmerston, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State being one), bearing date the 28th September 1848, the said provisions of the said recited Act were directed to be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain, for a period of six calendar months thence next ensuing ; and whereas by another Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the Lord President of the said Council being one, bearing date the 27th day of March 1849, the said recited Order of the 28th September 1848 was renewed for a period of six calendar months from the date of the said last-mentioned Order ; and whereas by another Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the most Honourable the Lord President of the said Council being one, bearing date the 25th September 1849, the said first-mentioned Order was renewed for a further period of six calendar months, from the said 25th day of September 1849, which said last-mentioned Order is now in force throughout the whole of Great Britain ; and whereas the General Board of Health

in Great Britain are, by the said recited Act, empowered, during the continuance in force of any such Order as above recited, to issue such directions and regulations as the said Board shall think fit for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of such epidemic, endemic, or contagious diseases ;

Now We, the General Board of Health, in exercise of the powers vested in us by the said recited Act, do hereby issue the following directions and regulations to extend to, and to be observed in the union of Salford, in the county of Lancaster, in Great Britain, and which directions and regulations we do hereby confine to the limits of the said union :

1. That a dispensary, in a central situation and conveniently situated for the affected districts in the urban part of the said union, be opened and continue open every day and night, and be provided with a person capable of administering medicine to all necessitous persons affected with bowel complaint.

2. That one medical officer do attend during every night at the dispensary, to whom all applicants for medical aid through the night are to be referred.

3. That one medical officer be appointed to make a daily visitation from house to house in and throughout such parts and places of the said union as are affected by cholera or its premonitory symptoms.

4. That proper notices be printed and carefully distributed from house to house throughout the affected districts, clearly detailing the arrangements made for affording medical aid and assistance, and where application is to be made in case of attack.

5. That if the medical officers shall be of opinion that further medical aid is required, they shall report the same to the Guardians, and the Board of Guardians shall immediately provide such additional medical aid, by night or day, as the necessity of the case may require.

And in further exercise of the powers vested in us by the said recited Act, We do hereby authorize, and empower you, the Guardians of the Poor of the said union, forthwith to provide in the manner specified in the above directions and regulations, for the dispensing of medicines, and for affording to persons afflicted by or threatened with any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, such medical aid as may be required ; and by yourselves or your officers, or by any persons employed by you in the administration of the laws for the relief of the poor, or by officers specially appointed in that behalf, forthwith to superintend and to see to the execution of the above directions and regulations, and to do and provide all such acts, matters, and things, as may be necessary for executing the same.

4th. That notices be printed and carefully distributed from house to house throughout the affected localities, clearly detailing the arrangements made for affording medical aid and assistance, and where application is to be made in case of attack.

And in further exercise of the powers vested in us by the said recited Act, We do hereby direct, authorize, and require you, the said Guardians of the Poor of the said union, forthwith to provide in the manner specified in the above directions and regulations, for the dispensing of medicines, and affording to persons afflicted by or threatened with any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, such medical aid as may be required; and by yourselves or your officers, or by any persons employed by you in the administration of the laws for the relief of the poor, or by officers specially appointed in that behalf, forthwith to superintend and see to the execution of the above directions and regulations, and to do and provide all such acts, matters, and things, as may be necessary for executing the same.
