## Kew and Petersham Vicarage.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next sessions for an Act to amend an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for dividing the vicarage of Kingston-upon-Thames, in the county of Surrey, with the several chapelries or curacies thereto belonging or thereon dependent, into two separate vicarages and two separate perpetual curacies in such manner as is therein mentioned;" and to extinguish the vicarial tithes in the several parishes of Kew and Petersham, in the county of Surrey, and to divide the vicarage of Kew and Petersham into two distinct vicarages, and to enable the patrons of the vicarage of Kew and Petersham to sell to any person or persons, or body politic, corporate or collegiate, or trustees or commissioners, so much of that vicarage as is comprised in the parish of Kew, and that thereupon the said parish of Kew shall be and become a separate and distinct vicarage, and the said parish of Petersham shall also be and become a separate and distinct vicarage, and to confirm and legalize the pew rents in the said several parishes of Kew and Petersham, and to authorize the payment and application of such rents, and the fees for monuments, tablets, burials, &c. in such several parishes, and to make a provision for a stipend for the vicar or vicars of such parishes, jointly and severally with or out of such rents and fees, or some of them, or otherwise, and to enable the patrons for the time being of the vicarage of Kew and Petersham, and any other person or persons, to augment such vicarage, and also to augment the vicarage of Kew and the vicarage of Petersham, and each or either of them, if and when, or after they shall become distinct vicarages, and to authorize the grant of any messuages, lands, tenements, and hereditaments as and for an endowment or endowments, or residence or residences, or a site or sites for a residence or residences for the vicar or vicars of the said vicarage of Kew and Petersham jointly, and of the vicarage of Kew and vicarage of Petersham severally and separately, and for the appointment of churchwardens in the several parishes of Kew and Petersham, and to provide for the expenses of and attending such Act of Parliament, and to authorise that a portion of such expenses may be charged upon the said vicarage of Kew and Petersham, or upon the vicarage of Kew and the vicarage of Petersham separately, when and if they shall become distinct vicarages, or upon any or either of such vicarages; and for other purposes relating to such vicarage of Kew and Petersham, and the several vicarages of Kew and Petersham respectively.
