

empower the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, after such Slaughter-houses as aforesaid shall be opened for public use, to demand and take from any person slaughtering cattle, sheep, beasts, and swine, within any such slaughter-house, such tolls in respect thereof as the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses may from time to time appoint, not exceeding certain sums to be specified in the said Act.

And it is also intended by the said Act to extend to all places within the limits of the said Act certain provisions of "The Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847."

And it is also intended by the said Act to incorporate therewith "The Town Police Clauses Act, 1847," with certain exceptions to be specified in the said intended Act.

And it is also intended by the said Act to empower the Council of the said borough, from time to time, to delegate to the Watch Committee of the said borough, such and so many of the powers and authorities by the said Act, and the Acts incorporated therewith, given to and reposed in the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, as the said Council shall from time to time consider may be more conveniently carried into execution by means of the said Watch Committee than by the said Council at large.

And it is also intended by the said Act to incorporate therewith certain provisions of "The Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847."

And it is also intended by the said Act to enact that certain clauses and provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1848," shall not be extended to the limits of the said intended Act, except as in the said intended Act mentioned.

And it is also intended by the said Act to exempt from tolls on any turnpike road or bridge, any horse or carriage in the service of the police force of the said borough, passing along or over such road or bridge.

And it is also intended by the said Act to empower all parties being seized, possessed, or entitled to any lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the said borough, or any estate or interest therein, to sell and convey, or release the same to any person, other than the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, or to exchange the same for other lands, tenements, and hereditaments, in the said borough, or elsewhere in England and Wales, subject to certain limitations, restrictions, and provisions, and to enter into all necessary agreements for that purpose, and to extend to all such conveyances certain provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845."

And it is also intended by the said Act to enact that all monies which under and by virtue thereof, or the Acts incorporated therewith, shall be payable to the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, shall be paid to the treasurer of the said borough, and shall be carried by him to the account of the borough fund of the said borough, and shall form part thereof, and that the same shall be accounted for and audited at the times and in the manner prescribed by the Acts for the regulation of municipal corporations in England and Wales, and that orders for payment of money under the said intended Act shall be subject to the provisions of the said Acts for the regulation of municipal corporations.

And it is also intended by the said Act to alter, amend and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of an Act, passed in the eighth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to enable the Eastern Counties Railway Company to make a railway from the Northern and Eastern Railway at Newport, by Cambridge to Ely, and

thence eastward to Brandon, and westward to Peterborough," so far as respects the application of the money payable for the purchase of certain common rights and interests of and in a certain piece of land heretofore parcel of Sturbridge Fair Green, in the parish of Saint Andrew the Less, in the said borough, and the conveyance of such common rights and interests.

And it is also intended by the said Act to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges in any manner connected with the lands and houses proposed to be purchased or taken by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with such purposes; and to confer other rights and privileges.

Surrey and Sussex Roads.

(Continuation and Consolidation of Acts; Alteration of Provisions with reference to Tolls.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session, for an Act to continue or otherwise to repeal, and to re-enact for a further term of years, and also to consolidate (but subject to certain alterations and amendments) the provisions of the Acts hereinafter mentioned relating to the Surrey and Sussex Roads; that is to say: An Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for more effectually amending the road leading from Stone's-End, in Blackman-street, in the borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, to Highgate, in the county of Sussex, and several other roads therein mentioned, and for other purposes relating thereto," and an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to alter and amend an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled 'An Act for more effectually amending the road leading from the Stone's-End, in Blackman-street, in the borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, to Highgate, in the county of Sussex, and several other roads therein mentioned, and for other purposes relating thereto;'" and it is also proposed by the said intended Act to confer power upon the present trustees, or the trustees to be appointed for carrying into effect the provisions of the said intended Act, to levy tolls or duties upon or in respect of all turnpike roads which now are, or which shall be vested in them, or which now are, or which shall be subject to their control under the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of such intended Act, and from time to time to vary, or alter the tolls or duties to be levied under the provisions of the said intended Act, or any or either of such tolls or duties, and also to vary or alter all or any of the tolls or duties now leviable, or deemed to be leviable, upon such roads by virtue of the said recited Acts or either of them, and to confer exemptions from the payment of any tolls or duties which the said trustees are or may be authorized to demand, and also from time to time to vary, or extinguish, and again to confer, such exemptions, or any of them.—Dated the 1st day of November 1849.
