MARINE BARRACK CANTEENS.

No person but of unexceptionable character, nor any person for more than one Canteen, or who will not undertake *bonâ fide* to reside in or occupy the Canteen, and conduct the business thereof in his own person, will be approved; and two sureties will be required for the regular payment of the rent, and of all sums which may become due in respect of the said Canteen, and for the due performance of the several conditions and stipulations of the indenture of lease.
