The Fown was pillaged, and afterwards burnt; The Plunder was so great, that divers of the common Soldiers got two hundred Ducats a Man, befides Horses and rich Cloaths. G. neral Mercy has sent to Vienna 16 Colours taken in this This defeat of the Enemy, put those of Temiswaer into so great a Consternation, that they burnt their Suburbs fearing they should be attackt. The Advices from the Turkish Territories, say Teckeley is kept a close Prisoner in the Castle of Belgrade.

Hague, Fan. 28. The Ratifications of the Treaty concerning the separation of the Limits between this State and that of Liege, were exchanged here the 23d Instant. The Heer Van Staremberg, our Ambassador in France, arrived here last Saturday, and this Morning made Report in the Assembly of the States General of his Negotiation a that Court, Whicher, it's faid he will return in a Month or fix The States of Holland are adjourned till the 13th of the next Month. Prince Waldecke, and Count Nassaw General of the Horse in the Service of this State, are not now expected h re till the next Month. We have an account from Berlin, that the freaty between the Emperor and the el ctor of Brandenburgh, by which his Electoral Highness promises to affish his Imperial Majesty with 7500 Men, whereof 4500 are to be Foot, and the rest Horse and Dragoors, was signed the 6th of this Month; The Ratifications thereof are to be exchanged in three Weeks,

Bruffels , Jan. 25. The States of Flanders and the Magilfrates of Antwerp have fent Deputies hither to compliment his Excellency upon his being confirmed in this Government. The Prince de Racbe, Governor of the Province of Haynault. who has been extremely ill, is now lookt upon to be out of all danger; The Prince de Vaudemont, General of the Cavalry, is likewise very much recovered, and begins to have the use again of his Arms and Legs. The Letters from Vienna of the 13th Instant tell us, that the three Ambassadors from Transilvania were arrived there, and had been in Conference with some of the Emperor's chief Ministers, upon the demand they made that their Masters Territories might be freed from Win ter-quarters, at least that the charge laid upon his Countrey might be moderated. They write from Opper Hungary, that a confiderable Body of Imperialiffs had been fent under the Command of Mafor General Wallis to view Great Waradin, and though the were 4000 Turks in that Garison who fallied out, and endeavoured to hinder the approach of the *Imperialists*, yet they advanced so hear to the place, that they took a perfect view of it. The Letters add, that General Cuprara had fent a reinforcement of 1500 Foot to General Mercy, for the execution of some de fign which was kept very fecret.

Bruffels , Fan.29. His Excellency parted from hence this Morning for Antwerp, where he intends to stay till Friday next; At his Return he will be met by all the Publick Ministers, the Nobility and General Officers, and will make his Publick Entry into this City as Governor General of these Pro-vinces. The Treaty between the Emperor and the Elector of Brandenburgh is concluded, the Rattification whereof on the part of his Electoral Highness was brought to Vienna, before our last Letters, which are of the 17th Instant, came from thence; The same Letters tell us, that the Treaty with the Elector of Saxony would be likewise concluded in few days; And that the Forces these two Princes are to assist the Emperor with, will mike a Body of 14 or 15000 Men. Staremberg may command his Electoral Highnesses Forces, but that at the same time he may keep his Regiment in his Imperial Majestics Service.

Paris, Fan. 26. We are told that the King will begin his Journey towards Lorrain and Alface in April, and that he intends to be abroad most of the Summer. The Mareschal d'Estrades lies very ill, with little hopes of his Recovery. The Marquis de la Pierre, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Savoy, has had his Audience of Leave of the King at Versailles.

Dublin, Jan. 11. His Excellency the Earl of Clarendon Lord Lieurenant of this Kingdom, having Embarqued the 8th Instant at Holy-Head, Landed the next Morning at Dunlari, a place about five Miles from hence, the News whereof being brought hither, the Lord Archbithop of Dublin, with a great Number of the Nobility, went in their Coaches to conduct his Excellency to this City; In his way his Excellency was met by two Troops of Horse; The Foot Companies quartered here, lined the Streets which he palled through, and the People expressed their Joy for his Arrival, by their repeated Acclamations. His Excellency went immediately to the Council Chamber, where the Lords Juffices and the Lords of the Privy Council received him with all the demonstrations of Honour and Respect imaginable. I is Excellency having presented His Maj. sties Letter to the Lords Justices, and his Commission being read, took the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy; After which, the Sword of State was delivered to his Excellency by both the Lords Justices, and his Exceller cy took his Seat in the Chair of State. In the Evening the Streets were filled with Bonfires, accompanied with ringing of Bells, and all other Expressions of a general Joy and Satisfaction.
