Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Oxford, humbly request permission to present to your Majesty the expressions of our heartfelt condolence on the melancholy event which has bereaved your Majesty of an illustrious and honoured relative, and deprived the country of one of its brightest examples of piety and virtue.

However afflicting to your Majesty this dispensation of Divine Providence may be, your Majesty will doubtless derive consolation from the reflection that a devout and Christian life was closed in perfect peace, cheerful resignation to the will of Almighty God, and humble reliance on the merits of the Redeemer.

Though the loss of one, so endeared to the nation by her piety, meekness, and boundless charity, has withdrawn from us the inestimable benefit of her example, still must the influence of that example be long and deeply felt among us, sustained and strengthened as it is by the contemplation of those virtues which, displayed in your Majesty's daily life, have won for your Majesty the devoted affection of your loyal people, and have imparted additional lustre and stability to the Throne.

We humbly trust that the Almighty Disposer of events may vouchsafe to your Majesty a long and peaceful reign, together with the con-

tinued enjoyment of every temporal and spiritual blessing.

sion to another part thereof, in other than British ships, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, so to authorise the conveyance of such goods or passengers, as the case may be, in such terms and under such conditions as to Her Majesty may seem good:

And whereas an address has been presented to Her Majesty by the Legislative Council of the colony of Trinidad, praying that Her Majesty will be graciously pleased to authorise and permit the conveyance of goods and passengers from any part of the said colony to any other part thereof in steamers, of whatever build the same may be, and owned by subjects of any nation in terms of amity and alliance with Her Majesty:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, and in pursuance of the authority vested in Her as aforesaid, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be lawful to employ steam vessels, of whatever build the same may be, and by the subjects of whatever nation (being a nation at amity with Her Majesty), the same may be owned in the conveyance of goods and passengers from any part of the said colony to any other part of the same.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them respectively shall appertain.

And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a new prison should be erected at St. Helena and maintained for the safe custody of such of the inhabitants, merchants, seamen, foreigners, and others, who by legal process may from time to time be remanded for trial or sentenced to imprisonment:

And whereas it has been represented to Her Majesty that there is a greater proportion in each year of commitments of merchant seamen to prison than of admission of the same class as

patients to the Hospital, and that it is therefore reasonable that all merchant ships or vessels resorting to St. Helena should contribute equally to both of the abovenamed institutions:

And whereas it has further been represented to Her Majesty that the said Civil Hospital is nearly completed and ready for the reception of patients:

It is therefore hereby ordered by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that, in lieu of the duty of one farthing per ton imposed as aforesaid, a duty of one penny per ton shall hereafter be levied upon all merchant ships or vessels entering the Port of James Town for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

And it is further ordered that no ship or vessel shall be allowed to depart from the said port until all such tonnage duties as, by virtue of this present Order of Her Majesty in Council, the said ship or vessel shall be liable to, shall have been fully paid to the collector of customs in the said port, who is hereby authorized and required to levy and collect the same.

And it is further ordered, that all sums of money so levied and collected as aforesaid, shall be applied solely in aid of the funds required for completing the said hospital, and for erecting the new prison, as well as for defraying the expenses of maintaining the efficiency of both the institutions above mentioned.

And the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, are respectively to give the necessary directions herein as may to them respectively appertain.
