THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Thursday the 7th February next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford the undermentioned articles; viz.:

Sugar (the produce of the British Possessions), 50 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Cocoa, 50 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Soap (Mottled), 30 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Oats (Scotch potato), 300 quarters; to be delivered within ten days.

The sugar and cocoa to be exempted from the Customs' duties.
