of No. 1213, and of Bennets End Farm-house, and also of Nos. 1211 and 1245, to the Crabtree-lane; then up such lane to No. 1510, and along the north-western side thereof, and also of No. 1511, and part of No. 1512, as far as Hardy Field, No. 1474; then along the south and west sides thereof, to the centre of the road opposite to Hardy Field, where the proposed consolidated chapelry or Leverstock Green commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon

coloured yellow, green, and pink:

"That the consents of the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Rochester (as the Bishop of the said diocese), of the Right Honourable James Walter Earl of Verulam (as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Saint Michael), of the Reverend Richard Gee, of Abbotts Langley aforesaid, Clerk (as the patron of the parish church of the said parish of Abbotts Langley), and of the Right Reverend John Lord Bishop of Lincoln (as the patron, in right of his see, of the parish church of the said parish of Hemel Hempstead), have been severally obtained to the formation of the hereinbefore-proposed consolidated chapelry of Leverstock Green, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof the said George Lord Bishop of Rochester, James Walter Earl of Verulam, Richard Gee, and John Lord Bishop of Lincoln, have signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that it has been mutually agreed between the said James Walter Earl of Verulam, Richard Gee, and John Lord Bishop of Lincoln (as such respective patrons as aforesaid), testified as aforesaid, with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, testified as hereinafter mentioned, and of the said George Lord Bishop of Rochester (testified as aforesaid), that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of the Holy Trinity, at Leverstock Green aforesaid, should be vested in, belong to, and, whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the said James Walter Earl of

Verulam, his heirs and assigns for ever:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom

shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed formation of a consolidated chapelry be accordingly made, and the agreement in respect of the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent, or perpetual curate, to serve the said church, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Acts, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Rochester.
