Merionethshire Turnpike Roads.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application has been made to Parliament for additional provision to be inserted in a Bill now depending in Parliament, entitled "A Bill for continuing and enlarging the term and powers of three Acts passed in the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, for repairing and widening several roads leading to and from the towns of Bala and

Dolgelly, in the county of Merioneth, and other roads therein mentioned, in the counties of Montgomery, Denbigh, and Salop, and for repairing several other roads in the counties of Merioneth and Denbigh," by which additional provision it is intended to alter, amend, and enlarge, or so far as necessary, to repeal the powers and provisions of the three Acts, recited in the said Bill, being the Acts 17th George 3rd, chap. 99; 36th George 3rd, chap. 147; and 59th George 3rd, chap. 98; and also to compel the mortgagees to give up possession of the roads to the trustees; to render accounts, and to settle balances; to divide the several roads in the counties of Merioneth and Denbigh, now managed in separate districts, but forming one trust, into separate trusts, and to re-adjust and apportion the debts charged upon the tolls of the said several roads; to limit the arrears of interest, and to fix the rate to be in future payable in respect of such debts.
