It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until half-past one o'clock.

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's faithful and loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland met in this General Assembly, have received with profound respect and gratitude the gracious letter in which your Majesty has been pleased to express much satisfaction on occasion of our present meeting, and we earnestly trust that, through the aid of Divine grace, we will be enabled so to conduct all our proceedings as to fulfil your Majesty's expectation that our deliberations will be guided by a spirit of wisdom and prudence, and by a sincere regard to the important interests committed to our charge.

It is most encouraging to us to be assured of your Majesty's desire and hope that, under the Divine protection, the Church of Scotland will continue to promote the happiness and spiritual welfare of the people,—and it is not less cheering and animating to us, after having received many former pledges of our beloved Sovereign's good will and confidence, to know that your Majesty is still resolved to cherish, without ceasing, the same solicitude which you have ever entertained for the maintenance of the rights and privileges of this National Church.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses; do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to authorize the establishment of Courts of Appeal for certain of Her Majesty's West India Colonies.

An Act to amend an Act of the last session of Parliament for granting relief against defects in leases made under powers of leasing.

An Act for the regulation of process and practice in the Superior Courts of Common Law in Ireland.

An Act for extinguishing the vicarial tithes in the parishes of Kew and Petersham, in the county of Surrey; for confirming and regulating the pew rents of the churches of the said parishes; for authorizing the division of the vicarage of Kew and Petersham; and for other purposes relating to such vicarage.

Amendment of Acts—Restriction and Re-adjustment of Guarantees—and power to raise Money.
