Those Gentlemen, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, before twelve o'clock, on Monday the 1st of July next, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levee but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until half-past one o'clock.

IT is hereby notified that Viscount Palmerston, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the copy of a Despatch, dated the 19th of February last, from the Commodore in command of Her Majesty's squadron on the west coast of Africa, covering the copy of a notice, dated the 24th of November 1849, and received by him on the said 19th of February last, from the Commodore of the French Naval Forces on that coast, announcing that he had raised the Blockade which had been previously imposed by him upon that part of the coast which lies between the rivers Grand Bassam and Assinee.
