The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levee at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence Chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock, on Monday the 1st of July next*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levee but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court until half-past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to write on two cards, with their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come; one card to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents, at the time of presentation, to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

And those Ladies, who are to be presented, are hereby informed, that it is absolutely necessary that their names, together with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Tuesday previous* to the Drawing-Room on the 20th of June, and on the Saturday previous to the Drawing-Room on the 9th of July, on each day, *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

of the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain), to or in favour of certain ships and vessels in the said Order particularly mentioned; and whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council should be revoked, and that other regulations should be substituted in lieu thereof, it is hereby ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the thirtieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, and all the regulations and provisions therein contained shall be and the same are hereby revoked and absolutely repealed:

And it is hereby further ordered, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or person administering the Government of Her Majesty's garrison and territory of Gibraltar, on application to him for that purpose made, to grant and issue, without the intervention of the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral, certificates or other papers or instruments to or in favour of any ship or vessel which is duly registered at Gibraltar, or which wholly belongs to persons actually residing at Gibraltar and entitled to be owners of British ships there registered, for the purpose of investing with a national character, or of placing under the protection of Her Majesty any such ship or vessel:

And the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Wm. L. Bathurst.*

And it is hereby further ordered that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor or Deputy Governor of the said island of Malta, on application to him for that purpose made, to grant and issue, without the intervention of the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral, certificates or other papers or instruments to or in favour of any ship or vessel which is duly registered at Malta, or which wholly belongs to a person or persons actually residing at

Malta, and entitled to own British ships or vessels there registered, for the purpose of investing with a national character, or of placing under the protection of Her Majesty any such ship or vessel:

And the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled "An Act to amend the law of copyright," it is, among other things, enacted, that it shall not be lawful for any person, not being the proprietor of the copyright, or some person authorized by him, to import into any part of the United Kingdom, or into any other part of the British dominions, for sale or hire any printed book first composed or written, or printed and published in any part of the United Kingdom wherein there shall be copyright, and reprinted in any country or place whatsoever out of the British dominions:

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled "An Act to regulate the trade of the "British possessions abroad," books, wherein the copyright is subsisting, first composed or written or printed in the United Kingdom, and printed or reprinted in any other country, are absolutely prohibited to be imported into the British possessions abroad:

And whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the tenth and eleventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled "An Act to amend the law relating to "the protection in the colonies of works entitled "to copyright in the United Kingdom," it is enacted, that in case the legislature or proper legislative authorities in any British possession shall be disposed to make due provision for securing or protecting the rights of British authors in such possession, and shall pass an Act or make an Ordinance for that purpose, and shall transmit the same in the proper manner to the Secretary of State, in order that it may be submitted to Her Majesty; and in case Her Majesty shall be of opinion that such Act or Ordinance is sufficient for the purpose of securing to British authors reasonable protection within such possession, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she think fit so to do, to express Her royal approval of such Act or Ordinance, and thereupon to issue an Order in Council, declaring, that so long as the provisions of such Act or Ordinance continue in force within such colony, the prohibitions contained in the aforesaid Acts, and hereinbefore recited, and any prohibitions contained in the said Acts, or in any other Acts against the importing, selling, letting out to hire, exposing for sale or hire, or possessing foreign reprints of books first composed, written, printed, or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended, so far as regards such colony:

And whereas an Act has been passed by the Governor, Council, and Assembly of the Island of

Antigua, No. 601, intituled "An Act to authorize the importation into this island of foreign reprints of books entitled to copyright in the United Kingdom," whereby provision is made for securing to British authors a certain remuneration in respect of unauthorized copies of works, under copyright, imported into the said island:

And whereas Her Majesty hath expressed Her royal approval of the same:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by the authority of the same, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that so long as the said Act of the Legislature of the said island of Antigua shall remain and continue in force within the said island, all prohibitions in either of the said hereinbefore recited Acts of the Imperial Parliament, or in any other Acts thereof contained, against the importing into the said island, or against the selling, letting out to hire, or possessing therein foreign reprints of books first composed, written, printed, or published in the United Kingdom, and entitled to copyright therein, shall be suspended, so far as regards foreign reprints imported into the said island:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
