To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the Lieutenant-Governor, the Bailiff, the Jurats of the Royal Court, the Clergy, the Queen's Procureur Delegate, and the Deputies of the several parishes and cantons of your Majesty's Island of Guernsey, in the States assembled, most humbly crave leave, on the auspicious occasion of the Birth of another Prince, to express to your Majesty our feelings of joy and satisfaction.

As Islanders apart from the United Kingdom, cherishing ever the remembrance of your Majesty's most gracious visit to our shores, we feel peculiarly impelled to express our sentiments of devoted and affectionate attachment to your Majesty's Person and Family at a moment so deeply interesting to all your Majesty's subjects.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. Edward Wallerstein as Consul-General in London for the Republick of Costa Rica.

Downing-Street, July 19, 1850.

The Queen has been pleased, by letters patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to re-constitute the Bishoprick of Quebec, and to direct that the same shall comprise the district of Quebec, Three Rivers, and Gaspé only, and be called the Bishoprick of Quebec; and Her Majesty has been pleased to name and appoint the Right Reverend Father in God George Jehosaphat Mountain, Doctor in Divinity, heretofore Bishop of Montreal, to be Bishop of the said See of Quebec.

Her Majesty has also been pleased, by letters patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to constitute so much of the ancient diocese of Quebec as comprises the district of Montreal, to be a Bishop's See and Diocese, to be called the Bishoprick of Montreal, and to name and appoint the Reverend Francis Fulford, Doctor in Divinity, to be ordained and consecrated Bishop of the said See of Montreal.

Her Majesty has also been pleased to appoint Nathaniel Hart, Esq. to be Her Majesty's Treasurer, and Robert Shany Harper, Esq. to be Provost Marshal, for the island of St. Christopher.

Her Majesty has further been pleased to appoint Johannes Cornelius Schade, Esq. to be Financial Accountant for the colony of British Guiana.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to provide for the commencement of an Act of the present session, intituled "An Act to repeal an Act of the sixth year of King George the Fourth, for encouraging the capture or destruction of piratical ships and vessels, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

An Act to render more simple and effectual the titles by which congregations or societies for purposes of religious worship or education in England and Ireland hold property for such purposes.

An Act to amend the laws concerning judgments in Ireland.

An Act to authorize further advances of money for drainage and the improvement of landed property in the United Kingdom, and to amend the Acts relating to such advances.

An Act to provide for the appointment of Sheriff of the county of Westmoreland.

An Act for confirming certain provisional orders of the General Board of Health.

An Act to diminish the delay and expense of proceedings in the High Court of Chancery in England.

An Act to continue certain Acts for regulating turnpike-roads in Ireland.

An Act to make more effectual provision for regulating the police of towns and populous places in Scotland, and for paving, draining, cleansing, lighting, and improving the same.

An Act to enable the corporation of Swansea, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, to subscribe for shares in the Swansea Dock Company, and to raise money for that purpose, and to purchase the interests of certain lessees of property belonging to the said corporation, and for other purposes.

An Act to authorize the abandoning of certain portions of the South Yorkshire, Doncaster, and Goole Railway, a deviation thereof near Doncaster, and the amendment of the Acts relating thereto.

An Act to enable the South Staffordshire Railway Company to lease their undertaking, and for other purposes.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Kent Waterworks to raise a further sum of money, and to alter and amend the former Act relating thereto.

An Act for amending and extending the powers and provisions of the Act of the seventh year of the reign of King William the Fourth relating to the Southampton Waterworks, and for other purposes.

An Act to enable the Waterford and Kilkenny Railway Company to raise further capital, and for other purposes.
