THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to facilitate procedure in the Court of Session in Scotland.

An Act for the further extension of summary jurisdiction in cases of larceny.

An Act to render valid certain marriages solemnized in the new church at Upton-cum-Chalvey, in the county of Buckingham, and diocese of Oxford.

An Act to regulate the disposition of the naval prize balance.

An Act for the better government of convict prisons.

An Act for taking an account of the population of Ireland.

An Act to continue certain Acts relating to linen, hempen, and other manufactures, in Ireland.

An Act to confirm the incorporation of certain boroughs, and to provide for the payment of the expenses of the incorporation of new boroughs.

An Act to continue an Act to amend the laws relating to loan societies.

An Act for further continuing certain temporary provisions concerning ecclesiastical jurisdiction in England.

An Act to suspend the making of lists and the ballots and enrolments for the militia of the United Kingdom.

An Act to amend the practice and proceedings of the Court of Chancery of the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act to authorize the division of the parish of Manchester into several parishes, and for the application of the revenues of the collegiate and parish church; and for other purposes.

An Act for the transfer of the equitable jurisdiction of the Court of Exchequer to the Court of Chancery in Ireland.

An Act to defray the charge of the pay, clothing, and contingent and other expenses of the disembodied militia in Great Britain and Ireland; to grant allowances in certain cases to subaltern officers, adjutants, paymasters, quartermasters, surgeons, assistant-surgeons, surgeons' mates, and serjeant-majors of the militia; and to authorize the employment of the non-commissioned officers.

An Act to continue the exemption of inhabitants from liability to be rated as such in respect of stock in trade or other property to the relief of the poor.

An Act to incorporate the members of the Shipwrecked Fishermen and Mariners' Royal Benevolent Society, and to enable them better to carry into effect their charitable designs.

An Act to extend the powers of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Carlisle Railway Company, and to amend Acts relating to their railway.

An Act to extend the Wolverhampton waterworks, and to amend the Act relating thereto.

An Act for forming and regulating the British Electric Telegraph Company, and to enable the said company to work certain letters patent.

An Act to extend the time limited by "The Liverpool Corporation Waterworks Act, 1847," for purchasing lands and constructing the works authorized by such Act; and for other purposes.

An Act to extend the powers of the Dundalk and Enniskillen Railway Company for the purchase of lands and completion of works on part of their railway, and for other purposes.

An Act for better supplying with water the borough of Salford, and for the further improvement of the said borough.

An Act for repealing an Act relating to the borough of Bradford, in the county of York, and for better paving, lighting, watching, draining, and otherwise improving the said borough, and for the better regulation and management thereof.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS the Mails passing between the United Kingdom and certain parts of the British West Indies are about to be landed at the island of Saint Thomas, and sent from thence to their places of destination;

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power and authority in us for such purpose vested, in and by an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," and of all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, direct, that Letters passing by the Post between the United Kingdom and the British West Indies, or between any ports in the British West Indies, or between the British West Indies and British North America respectively, landed at the island of Saint Thomas, and sent on from thence to their places of destination, shall be charged with the same rates of postage only as would have been chargeable thereon if the same had been sent direct to their places of destination without having been first landed at the said island of Saint Thomas.

And we direct, that printed Newspapers and other printed papers passing by the Post between the United Kingdom and the British West Indies, or between any ports in the British West Indies, or between the British West Indies and British North America respectively, landed at the island of Saint Thomas, and sent from thence to their places of destination, shall be considered as having passed direct to their places of destination, and be free of postage, or chargeable with postage, accordingly as the case may be.

And we direct, that Letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, brought into the United Kingdom from seamen employed in Her Majesty's Navy, when actually employed in Her Majesty's service on board Her Majesty's ships on foreign stations, on the private concerns of such seamen, shall, if enclosed in stamp covers, or having a

stamp affixed thereto (the stamp being affixed or appearing on the outside, and of the value or amount of one penny, and specially provided under the authority of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and if the stamp shall not have been used before), pass by the post free of postage as if one penny had been paid in money on such letter being put into a post-office established under the authority of the Postmaster-General as required by the said Act, provided that upon every such letter shall be subscribed the name of the writer and his class or description in the vessel to which he shall belong, and that upon every such letter there shall be written in the handwriting of and signed by the officer having at the time the command of such vessel the name of such officer, and the name of such vessel, as required by the said Act. And if any such letter shall be sent by private ships, the gratuities payable by law to the masters of such vessels in respect of such letters shall be charged on such letters and paid to the post-office by the parties to whom the same shall be addressed, provided that it shall be optional to the sender of any such letter to pay such gratuities by affixing on such letters, at the time of sending the same, additional stamps to the amount of such gratuities.

And we direct, that the term "British West Indies," in this warrant, shall include the Bermudas, the Bahamas, and other British islands commonly called the West Indies, as also the colonies of British Guiana, and Honduras, and their respective dependencies, and that the several other terms and expressions used in this warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act of the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any other regulations in lieu thereof.
