

CONTRACTS FOR SUGAR, TOBACCO, PEAS, AND OATS.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of
Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom
of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give
notice, that, on Thursday, the 12th September
next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat
with such persons as may be willing to contract for
supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Vic-
tualling Stores, at Deptford, the undermentioned
articles; viz.:

Sugar (the produce of the British Possessions),
80 tons; half to be delivered in three weeks,
and the remainder in three weeks afterwards.

Tobacco (Virginia), 15 tons; half to be de-
livered in a fortnight, and the remainder in a
fortnight afterwards.

Peas, 400 quarters; half to be delivered in a
fortnight, and the remainder in a fortnight
afterwards.

Oats (Scotch potato), 300 quarters; to be de-
livered within ten days.

The sugar and tobacco to be exempted from the
Customs' duties.

Samples of the peas and oats (not less than two
quarts of each) must be produced by the parties
tendering, and samples of the sugar and tobacco,
together with the conditions of the contracts, may
be seen at the said office.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on
the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party
attends, or an agent for him duly authorized
in writing.

those for sugar must be accompanied by a letter,
signed by two responsible persons engaging to
become bound with the person tendering in the sum
of £25 per cent. on the value for the due per-
formance of the contracts.
