PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

IT is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Tuesday the fifteenth day of October next, be further prorogued to Thursday the fourteenth day of November next.

AT the Court at *Balmoral*, the 24th day of *September 1850*,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the tenth year of Her Majesty "for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties, and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining), into districts, and to order that the County Court shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act in each of such districts, and from time to time to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem fit, and from time to time to declare by what name, and in what towns and places, the County Court shall be holden in each district:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by an Order in Council of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, of which the county of Devon was one, and the town of Plymouth was named as a place for holding one of the courts of the said county for the district therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly:

And whereas it hath been represented that it would be of advantage to the public that the County Court now holden at Plymouth should be

holden at East Stonehouse instead of at Plymouth: Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirtieth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, the County Court now holden by the name of "The County Court of Devonshire holden at Plymouth," shall be holden by the name of "The County Court of Devonshire holden at East Stonehouse," and the said Court now holden at Plymouth shall be holden at East Stonehouse instead of at Plymouth.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority vested in them by the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-second day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the words following; that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Saint Peter, in the Isle of Thanet, in the county of Kent, and within the diocese of Canterbury, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel, situate at Broadstairs, in the said parish of Saint Peter, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act,

'passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' or under and by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such district should be called 'The District Chapelry of Broadstairs,' with boundaries, as hereinafter mentioned :

"The district chapelry of Broadstairs is bounded on the east by the sea; on the south by a line proceeding from the sea and the north-eastern corner of the road to the Lime Kilns, along the boundary of fields respectively numbered 29, 27, and 26 on the Tithe Commutation Map of the said parish of Saint Peter, Thanet; on the west, the boundary of the said district chapelry is shown by a straight line commencing at the point marked No. 1 on the plan (hereinafter referred to), where the road from Broadstairs to Ramsgate meets the road to Bramstone and the footpath to Dumpton, and proceeding in a northerly direction across the land respectively numbered on the said map 56, 60, 82, 85, 84, 149, 163, 169, and 170, to the point where the road from Beard's-hill leaves the road from Kingsgate at the point marked No. 2 on the said plan; and on the north the boundary of the said district chapelry commences at the point marked No. 2 on the said plan where the road from Broadstairs to Kingsgate meets at Beard's-hill, and then proceeds in an easterly direction across lands respectively numbered on the said map 205, 204, 204 (*), 197, 198, 189, 188 and 186, to Stone Gateway, and thence along the middle of the Stone Gateway to the sea, at the point No. 3 on the said plan, as such district chapelry is more particularly delineated on the said plan, which is hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured green :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, should be solemnized and performed in the said church or chapel at Broadstairs aforesaid, and that all the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being :

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend John Bird Archbishop of the said diocese of Canterbury has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section herein-before mentioned: in testimony whereof the said John Bird Archbishop of Canterbury has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
