HE Queen has been pleased to appoint George Deas, Esq. Advocate, to be Sheriff of the shires or sheriffdom of Ross and Cromarty, in the room of John Jardine, Esq. deceased.

#### Whitehall, October 10, 1850.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable James Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Alexander Crawford Lindsay, commonly called Lord Lindsay, and to James Lindsay, of Berkeley-square, in the county of Middlesex, commonly called the Honourable James Lindsay, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, and Representative in Parliament for the borough of Wigan (who act in the nature of Guardians of Roger Yates, a Minor, of the age of ten years and upwards), on behalf of the said Roger Yates, Her royal licence and authority that he, the said Roger Yates, may henceforth take and use the surname of Leigh only, instead of that of Yates, and also bear the arms of Leigh only; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect :
