Saint Helens Waterworks Act Amendment.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session thereof for a Bill to alter, amend, and enlarge some of the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and intituled "An Act for better supplying with water the town of Saint Helens, and several hamlets and places adjacent thereto, all in the parish of Prescott, in the county palatine of Lancaster;" and to enable the Saint Helens Waterworks Company, incorporated by the said Act, to increase their capital for the purpose of affording to the inhabitants within the limits of the said Act a more abundant supply of water; and it is intended by the said Bill to empower the said Company to agree with the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Liverpool, for a supply of water from the Waterworks which the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses are authorized to construct, under the powers of "The Liverpool Corporation Waterworks Act, 1847," and "The Liverpool Corporation Waterworks (Amendment) Act, 1850;" and to enable the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses to afford such supply; and the said Bill will confer generally upon the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses and the said Company respectively, all necessary powers with respect to such supply.

And notice is hereby given, that it is also proposed by the said Bill to empower the said Company to sell to the Saint Helens Improvement Commissioners all the waterworks, lands, houses and other property, estate and effects, rights, powers and privileges, which are now held, used,
