Naples, Febr. 13:

HE last week arrived here a Vessel from Spain with 250 new railed Men to recruit the Spansh Regiments in the Service of this Kingdom. The new Fort in the Provice of Abvaro, is quite finished, and provided with a good Gassion, so that those Parts will be secured for the future against the Incursions of the Bandici.

Genoua, Febr. 19. This week arrived here a Felneca from Cagliari, the Master whereof informs us. That the Count de Fuensitida, Viceroy of Sardinia, had given Orders for the fitting out two Gallies, which are to transport him and his Family hither; From hence he will go to Milan, being to succeed in that Government the Count de Melgar, whom the King of Spain has appointed his Ambassador to the Pope. They write from Turin, that the Doke of Savoy had ordered five Regiments of Foot, one of Dragoons, and sour Troops of Gendarines, to march towards the Valley of Luctine. This week arrived here the Golden Fleece and the Rainbow from Leghorne, to lade for Spain.

Venice, Jan. 23. Three Regiments of Foot, and you Dragoons of the Troops of the Milaneze are arriv'd at the Lido, who, after having refreshed themselves in the Quarters assigned them by the Senate, will be transported to the Fleet, whither a great Convoy will be likewise sent, and Provisions, under the Command of Signior Pietro Bembo. By a Vessel arrived from the Coast of Barbary, we are informed, that the Grand Signior has commanded the Governments of Argiers, Tunin, and Tripoli, to sent ships to the Levant early in the Spring to serve in his Fleet. The 10th Instant the Sieur Renaldi was received into the Body of the Nobility, he paying 100000 Crowns towards the War against the Turks.

Marseilles, Febr. 25. Yesserday arrived in this. Port a Merchant Ship, in 17 days from Smirna, by which we have addice, that the Turks make great prepatations for the Wars. And that they will have a very numerous Army in Hangary this Campagne, but composed, for the most part, of raw, undisciplined Men. Vienna, telt, 24. The last Letters from Zofnocke, consist the news of Teckeley's arrival at Waradin; And tell us farther, that he had sent Cifficular Letters, wherein he siles himself Prince of Hungary and Transsluania, to several Countries of the Opper Hangary; requiring the Nobility and the Towns to send Depu ies to him to receive his Orders; And that these Letters were accompanied with others from the Bassa of Great Waradin, but that they had had no other effect, than to confirm the Hungarians in their Fidelity to his Imperial Majesty, of which they give every day fresh Testimonies. The News we have concerning Count Teckeley varies every Post, but they all confirm that the New Grand Visier is his Friend. and that he is restored to his Liberty, and supplied with Money to raile a Body of Hungarians, Bulgarians, and Valachians, to oppose the Imperialifts in Upper Hungary. The Treaty between the Emperor and the Elector of Saxony is ratified.

Cologne, March 5. Several Persons have, since our last, been apprehended here by Order of the Imperial Sub-Commissioners, among which is the Sieur Fuden, Secretary to the Magistrates that were lately displaced. The present Magistrates have refolved to raife two Companies of Foot, and a Troop of Horse, for the Service of the Em-The Elector of Trier has given Orders for the fortifying the Castle of Herberstein. Letters from Baden tell us, that the General Dyet of the 13 Suiffer Cantons begun there the 18th of the last Month.

Hague, March 8. The States of Holland and West-friesland adjourned on Friday last, till the 12th of this Month; It's believed that at their next Meeting, they will take a final Resolution about the discharging the Debts of the State contracted during the last War. The Marquis de Castel Moncayo, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Spain to this State, is arrived here from Bruffels, to take his leave of the States General, being named by the King of Spain to go his Ambailador to the Republick of Venice. There was, the 6th Instant, a Review of all the Guards on the Slaguelt. This morning the Prince parted from hence for Dieren, whither her Royal Highness will follow on Monday next.

Bruffels, March 5. The last Letters from Ma-drid gave an account of the great Reform that was making there as well in the Court as the feveral Councils, by which the King's Revenues will be very much cased, the Pensions alone of 9 or 10 great Men, which are now suppressed, amounting to 170000 Ducats yearly. His Excellency has by this Courier received a Supply of 135000 Crowns, with a promise that for the future 100000 Crowns Thall be remitted hither every Month for the Service of these Countries. The Letters from Vienna of the 21 past inform us, that Lieutenant General de Merty had given the Emperor an account, that 4000 Turks were come into the Neighborhood of Gyula, where they expected to join with a greater Body, which was drawing together from the Neighbouring Garisons; That he believed their delign was to attack Sarava, where Major General Heufler was with a small Garison, and that he had therefore sent to his affishance 300 German Musqueticts, and 1500 Hungarians; That Count Teckeley was at Great Waradin, where he had been received by the Furks with much outward Respect; But that at the same time it was easily to be seen they did not trust him, for they kept a Guard about him, and the Troops that came with him from Belgrade were not under his Command; The Eungarians that were formerly of his Parry, continue first in their fidelity to the Emperor, and offer to ferve het on- ly against the Turks, but against Teckeley himself: Acundel Buildings in the Strand, shall have 20 s. The Letters from Vienna of the 24th past tell us, that Teckeley, according to their last advices from Hungary, was still at Great Waradin, from whence he had lent circular Letters to the several Counties of Upper Hungary, to require them to join with him; That the Bassa of Waradin had likewise written to all the Villages in the Counties next adjoining to his Government, commanding them to fend in Forage and Provisions for the subsistence of the Army commanded by Count Teckeley, who, he laid, was come to Waradin, to put in Execution the Grand Signior's Orders. It is added in a Poffscript of a Letter from Vienna, that they had at that moment advice that Teckeley endeavouring to pass the They fe with 1500 Turks, had been attacked, and beaten by General Caraffa; But this needs a Confirmation.

Paris, March 9. The King has made eight new Brigadiers of Foot, four of Horse, and one of Dragoons; Ard has given the Government of Dunkirk, vacant by the death of the Marcichal d'Estra-des, to the Marquis d'Estrades his Son. The Marcichal d'Estree and the Duke of Mortemar will part from hence the next week, the first for Brest, and the other for Marseilles. Orders are given for the continuing the work of the River Eure, in which feveral thousand Men will be continually employed. A great Caroufel is preparing here
