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Naples, Febr. 13.

THE last week arrived here a Vessel from Spain with 250 new raised Men to recruit the Spanish Regiments in the Service of this Kingdom. The new Fort in the Province of *Abuzzo*, is quite finished, and provided with a good Garrison, so that those Parts will be secured for the future against the IncurSIONS of the Banditti.

Genoua, Febr. 19. This week arrived here a Felucca from *Cagliari*, the Master whereof informs us, That the Count *de Fuensalida*, Viceroy of *Sardinia*, had given Orders for the fitting out two Gallies, which are to transport him and his Family hither; From hence he will go to *Milan*, being to succeed in that Government the Count *de Melgar*, whom the King of Spain has appointed his Ambassador to the Pope. They write from *Turin*, that the Duke of *Savoy* had ordered five Regiments of Foot, one of Dragoons, and four Troops of Gen darmes, to march towards the Valley of *Lucerne*. This week arrived here the *Golden Fleece* and the *Rainbow* from *Leghorne*, to lade for Spain.

Venice, Jan. 25. Three Regiments of Foot, and 300 Dragoons of the Troops of the *Milanese* are arriv'd at the *Lido*, who, after having refreshed themselves in the Quarters assigned them by the Senate, will be transported to the Fleet, whither a great Convoy will be likewise sent the beginning of the next month; consisting in above 40 Ships laden with all sorts of Ammunition and Provisions, under the Command of Signior *Pietro Bembo*. By a Vessel arrived from the Coast of *Barbary*, we are informed, that the Grand Signior has commanded the Governments of *Argiers*, *Tunis*, and *Tripoli*, to send their Ships to the *Levant* early in the Spring to serve in his Fleet. The 10th Instant the Sieur *Renaldi* was received into the Body of the Nobility, he paying 100000 Crowns towards the War against the *Turks*.

Marseilles, Febr. 25. Yesterday arrived in this Port a Merchant Ship, in 17 days from *Smirna*, by which we have advice, that the *Turks* make great preparations for the War; And that they will have a very numerous Army in *Hungary* this Campaign, but composed, for the most part, of raw, undisciplined Men. That a Courier was arrived at *Adrianople* from the Prince of *Transylvania*, to inform the Grand Signior, that the *Imperialists* had by Force taken *Wineer* quarters within that Principality. And that the Sieur *Girardin*, Ambassador from France, arrived at *Constantinople* the 11th of the last month. Orders are come hither from the Court of France, for the building of several new Gallies.

Vienna, Febr. 21. The Duke of *Lorraine* is expected here about the middle of the next Month;

and the Elector of *Bavaria* in the beginning of April: The Treaty with the Elector of *Saxony* is ratified; His Electoral Highness has promised to send with the Troops that are to serve against the *Turks*, a proportionable Train of Artillery, and has already given Orders for the providing a Magazine at *Raab*, and another at *Comorra* for their Subsistence. We are told that the Count *de Nostitz*, the Emperor's Minister at *Stockholme*, has made a Treaty with the King of *Sweden* for 30000 Men, which are to serve this Campaign in *Hungary*. The Letters from *Upper Hungary* say, *Teckley* was come to *Great Waradin*, and had been very well received there; but was very strictly observed by the *Turks*; That General *de Mercy* having notice that 4000 *Turks* were come to *Gyula*, had immediately drawn together the Troops quartered about *Zolnocke*, who marched to *Saravits* and from thence towards *Gyula*, under the Command of Major General *Heuffer*, and the Count *de Peterhaff*, but returned, without hearing any News of the Enemy. The Count *de Weissenwolfe* having surrendered his Government of the *Upper Austria*, the Emperor has given the same to the Count *de Lamborg*. The Electoral Prince Palatin will part from hence the 4th of the next Month, to return to *Dufeldorpe*, but the Archduchess his Wife intends to remain here some time longer.

Vienna, Feb. 24. The last Letters from *Zolnocke*, confirm the news of *Teckley's* arrival at *Waradin*; And tell us farther, that he had sent Circular Letters, wherein he styles himself Prince of *Hungary* and *Transylvania*, to several Counties of the *Upper Hungary*; requiring the Nobility and the Towns to send Deputies to him to receive his Orders; And that these Letters were accompanied with others from the Bassa of *Great Waradin*, but that they had had no other effect, than to confirm the *Hungarians* in their Fidelity to his Imperial Majesty, of which they give every day fresh Testimonies. General *Caprara* having reinforced the Blockade of *Manigatz* with 4000 Men, has sent Lieutenant General *Cassia* with 2500 *German* Horse, and 1500 Foot, and 2000 *Hungarians*, to join the Baron *de Mercy* at *Zolnocke*, that he may be in a condition to oppose the *Turks*, who seem to have a design upon some of our Quarters on that side. The Advices from the *Turkish* Quarters, say they make great Preparations for the Campaign; That the Garrisons of *Buda* and *Agria* have been lately reinforced, and supplied with Provisions and Ammunition; and that there is now in the last of these places 4000 Men, who expect to be attackt at the opening of the Campaign, and are therefore putting themselves into the best posture of defence they can. The Deputies of *Transylvania* are preparing for their departure; We do not hear that they have concluded any thing concerning the Alliance that was proposed

to them. It seems rather that the chief aim of Prince *Abassi* is to gain time, that he may take his measures according to the success of this next Campaign. The Troops of *Saxony* will be commanded by Duke *Christian of Saxe-Hall*, and the Count *de Transmandorfe*. The Emperor is sending a splendid Embassy to *Persia*.

Ratisbonne, Febr. 21. The meeting of the States of *Franconia*, which was to have been at *Nuremberg* the 11th of this Month, is put off till the beginning of *May*. The News we have concerning Count *Teckeley* varies every Post, but they all confirm that the New Grand Visier is his Friend, and that he is restored to his Liberty, and supplied with Money to raise a Body of *Hungarians*, *Bulgarians*, and *Palachians*, to oppose the *Imperialists* in *Upper Hungary*. The Treaty between the Emperor and the Elector of *Saxony* is ratified.

Cologne, March 5. Several Persons have, since our last, been apprehended here by Order of the Imperial Sub-Commissioners, among which is the *Seur Fuden*, Secretary to the Magistrates that were lately displaced. The present Magistrates have resolved to raise two Companies of Foot, and a Troop of Horse, for the Service of the Emperor. The Elector of *Trier* has given Orders for the fortifying the Castle of *Herberstein*. The Letters from *Baden* tell us, that the General Dyet of the 13 *Suisse* Cantons begun there the 18th of the last Month.

Hague, March 8. The States of *Holland* and *West-friesland* adjourned on Friday last, till the 12th of this Month; It's believed that at their next Meeting, they will take a final Resolution about the discharging the Debts of the State contracted during the last War. The Marquis *de Castel Monaco*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Spain* to this State, is arrived here from *Brussels*, to take his leave of the States General, being named by the King of *Spain* to go his Ambassador to the Republic of *Venice*. There was, the 6th Instant, a Review of all the Guards on the *Slaguetts*. This morning the Prince parted from hence for *Dieren*, whither her Royal Highness will follow on Monday next.

Brussels, March 5. The last Letters from *Madrid* gave an account of the great Reform that was making there as well in the Court as the several Councils, by which the King's Revenues will be very much eased, the Pensions alone of 9 or 10 great Men, which are now suppressed, amounting to 170000 Ducats yearly. His Excellency has by this Courier received a Supply of 135000 Crowns, with a promise that for the future 100000 Crowns shall be remitted hither every Month for the Service of these Countries. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 21 past inform us, that Lieutenant General *de Merky* had given the Emperor an account, that 4000 *Turks* were come into the Neighborhood of *Gyula*, where they expected to join with a greater Body, which was drawing together from the Neighbouring Garrisons; That he believed their design was to attack *Saravus*, where Major General *Heustet* was with a small Garrison, and that he had therefore sent to his assistance 300 *German* Musquetiers, and 1500 *Hungarians*; That Count *Teckeley* was at *Great Waradin*, where he had been received by the *Turks* with much outward Respect; but that at the same time it was easily to be seen they did not trust him, for they kept a Guard about him, and the Troops that came with him from *Belgrade* were not under his Command; The *Hungarians* that were formerly of his Party, continue firm in their Fidelity to the Emperor, and offer to serve not only against the *Turks*, but against *Teckeley* himself.

The Garrison of *Mongatz* persist in their Rebellion, and make frequent Sallies, by which they very much incommode the *Imperialists*, who have blocked them up; They lately attacked a Fort, the *Imperialists* kept near them, which they took by Assault, and put all to the Sword they found there, who were about 100, and afterwards razed the Fort; but in another Sally 40 of the Rebels were killed.

Brussels, March 8. On Wednesday last the Nine Nations assembled here, to renew the Impostion upon Beer, which they unanimously consented to at their first meeting. His Excellency went yesterday to *Malmes*, and is expected here again tomorrow; And intends to go on Tuesday or Wednesday next to *Flanders*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 24th past tell us, that *Teckeley*, according to their last advices from *Hungary*, was still at *Great Waradin*, from whence he had sent circular Letters to the several Counties of *Upper Hungary*, to require them to join with him; That the *Bassa* of *Waradin* had likewise written to all the Villages in the Counties next adjoining to his Government, commanding them to send in Forage and Provisions for the subsistence of the Army commanded by Count *Teckeley*, who, he said, was come to *Waradin*, to put in Execution the Grand Signior's Orders. It is added in a Postscript of a Letter from *Vienna*, that they had at that moment advice, that *Teckeley* endeavouring to pass the *Theysse* with 1500 *Turks*, had been attacked, and beaten by General *Carassa*; But this needs a Confirmation.

Paris, March 9. The King has made eight new Brigadiers of Foot, four of Horse, and one of Dragoons; And has given the Government of *Dunkirk*, vacant by the death of the *Marschal d'Estrees*, to the Marquis *d'Estrees* his Son. The *Marschal d'Estree* and the Duke of *Morsemar* will part from hence the next week, the first for *Brest*, and the other for *Marseilles*. Orders are given for the continuing the work of the River *Eure*, in which several thousand Men will be continually employed. A great Caroufel is preparing here against *Easter*.
