THIS day the Right Honourable Sir John Romilly, Knight, Master of the Rolls, and the Right Honourable Sir George James Turner, Knight, a Vice-Chancellor, were, by Her Majesty's command, sworn of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, upon a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, to appoint Matthew Arnold, Esq. to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

Westminster, April 11, 1851.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod,

acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.

An Act for the regulation of Her Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on shore.

An Act to amend an Act of the Parliament of Ireland of the twenty-fifth year of King George the Third, for explaining and amending several laws for the encouragement of agriculture, so far as relates to leases for the erection of mills.

An Act to extend the provisions of the Designs Act, 1850, and to give protection from piracy to persons exhibiting new inventions in the Exhibition of the Works of Industry of all Nations in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.
