A PROCLAMATION.

For apprehending George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore.

VICTORIA R.

HEREAS George Sealey Waggett, John VV Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have severally been guilty of a breach of the privileges of the House of Commons; and whereas the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have been severally ordered, for their said offences, to be taken into the custody of the Serjeant at Arms attending the House of Commons; and whereas the said George Scaley Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore have evaded all attempts to discover or take them into custody; and whereas an humble address hath been presented to Her Majesty, that she will be graciously pleased immediately to issue Her Royal Proclamation, with such reward as Her Majesty shall think proper, for discovering, apprehending, and detaining George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore: We therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, have thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation hereby commanding all Our loving subjects, who may know or discover where the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore, or any of them, may be found, forthwith to give information thereof to Our Privy Council, or to one of our Principal Secretaries of State, or to the Serjeant at Arms attending Our said House of Commons, and We do hereby promise and declare, that whosoever shall give such information as aforesaid whereby the said George Sealey Waggett, John Hayward, James Skegg, and Thomas Burchmore, or any or either of them, shall be apprehended and taken into the custody of the said Serjeant, shall be entitled as a reward to the sum of fifty pounds for each and every of the said persons who shall be so apprehended, which said sums the Lords Com-missioners of Our Treasury are hereby directed to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court, at Buckingham-Palace, this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Our reign.
