

Holland, and for continuing and amending another Act of his present Majesty, for maintaining and repairing a certain bank, and the road thereon, from Spalding High Bridge to Brother House, all in the county of Lincoln; and another Act passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for amending an Act of King George the Third, for draining lands in South Holland, and for repairing and maintaining the road from Spalding High Bridge to Brother House, all in the county of Lincoln."

And it is intended by the said Bill to apply for powers to impose, levy, and raise certain rates and taxes in gross, and certain annual rates and taxes,

and also to increase, vary, or alter the present annual rates and taxes, as well upon the lands originally liable to be taxed under the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or any of them, as upon and from any other lands and grounds heretofore admitted and taken into and now forming part of the South Holland drainage district; and also powers for borrowing or raising money on the credit of the taxes, rates, and revenues arising under, or to be raised under or by virtue of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and of the said intended Act, or any or either of them.—Dated this 25th day of June 1851.
