The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Madeley and the chapelry district of Ironbridge, in the county of Salop and diocese of Hereford, and the new parish of Little Dawley, in the said county of Salop, and diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to

the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry or district out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the mean time, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district, we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereinafter provided:

"And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion and in such manner as shall be approved by the like authority:

"And whereas the said parishes and chapelry district are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of

such parishes and district as is hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

"And whereas a sum of six thousand pounds, three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, has been contributed, and transferred to our account and into our names in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, by Abraham Darby, of Coalbrookdale, in the said county of Salop, Esquire, towards the permanent endowment of the minister of such proposed district : and whereas it is the intention of the said Abraham Darby to contribute towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, when duly constituted, and also to provide a house of residence for the use of the minister thereof :

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consents of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Lichfield, and the Right Reverend Renn Dickson, Bishop of Hereford, in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Madeley, and also all that part of the said chapelry district of Ironbridge, and also all that part of the said new parish of Little Dawley, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed, - shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly ; and that the same shall be named 'The District of Coalbrookdale,' and shall be wholly included in and form part of the deanry of Wenlock, the archdeaconry of Salop, and the diocese of Hereford.

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November, to the minister, for the time being, of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the annual sum of one hundred and eighty pounds ; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister.

"And we further recommend and propose, that in consideration of the aforesaid benefactions, the right of patronage of, and the nomination of the minister to the said district, shall be assigned to, and shall and may be exercised by the said Abraham Darby, his heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" SCHEDULE.

"The district of COALBROOKDALE, being

"All that part of the parish of Madeley, and also all that part of the chapelry district of Ironbridge, in the county of Salop, and diocese of Hereford, situate on the north-western side of an imaginary line, commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) where an ancient public footpath leading from Dawley through Madeley-green, to a ferry across the River Severn, crosses the northern boundary of

the said parish, and extending thence southwards along the middle of such footpath as far as the middle of the road leading from Lincoln-hill to Shiffnall, and thence extending westward, along the middle of such road, through a certain avenue called the Beech Trees, until it crosses a certain land flood watercourse, and thence extending towards the south-west along the middle of such watercourse as far as the River Severn aforesaid ; and also all that part of the new parish of Little Dawley, in the said county of Salop, and diocese of Lichfield, which is situate on the south-western side of an imaginary line extending towards the north-west from the aforesaid point marked *a* along the middle of Croppings-lane, and of Coal-moor-lane."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been duly transmitted to the several incumbents and patrons as required by the said Act ; and no objections have been made thereto ;

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council ; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the several Registries of the dioceses of Hereford and Lichfield.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifth and sixth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act for enabling Ecclesiastical Corporations, aggregate and sole, to grant leases for long terms of years,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls in the parish of Roche, in the county of Cornwall, and diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of June

one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and duly gazetted, ratifying a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of the same month, prepared by us under the provisions of the secondly recited Act, for determining the portion of the improved value to be made payable to us in a certain mining lease therein stated to be about to be granted by the Reverend Thomas Pearce, Rector of the said parish of Roche, one moiety of the whole net amount of the reservation or reservations to be made by such lease was ordered to be made directly payable to us; and it was further ordered that nothing in the same scheme contained should prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"And whereas the proposed lease referred to in the said Order in Council has not yet been granted; and, with a view to making additional provision for the cure of souls in the said parish, we deem it expedient that the arrangements contemplated by the said Order should be varied in manner hereinafter mentioned.

"We therefore humbly recommend and propose that the share of the reservation or reservations under such lease, so directed to be made payable to us as aforesaid, shall be increased from one moiety to two third parts of such reservation or reservations, and that the remaining one third part, and no more, shall be made payable to the Rector for the time being of the said rectory of Roche.

"And we further recommend and propose that one half of the balance of all monies which shall, from time to time, be received by us in respect of such two third parts so to be made payable to us, shall, after deducting thereout a fair proportion of all costs, charges, and expences incurred by us in respect of the said lease or in receiving the said monies, be invested in the purchase of three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, and such annuities shall be held by us, in trust, for the said rectory of Roche, and the dividends arising therefrom shall from time to time be paid over by us to the Rector of Roche for the time being; provided always, that when the principal sums so invested shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of five thousand pounds sterling, such investments shall cease, and any further monies which shall become payable to us under or by virtue of the said lease, shall thenceforth be applicable to the purposes of the first recited Act.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Exeter.
