

[Extract from the Dublin Gazette of Tuesday, July 15, 1851.]

*Office of Arms, 14th July 1851.*

The Queen has been graciously pleased, by licence under the Royal Signet and Sign Manual, dated at Saint James's, 27th day of June 1851, to give and grant to the Rev. Peter Browne, of the city of Dublin, Clerk, and Incumbent of Blackrod, in the parish of Bolton, and county of Lancaster, Her Majesty's royal licence and authority that he may henceforth take the name of William in addition to and before his surname of Browne, in compliance with an injunction in the will of his late father, John Browne, of Rathbane, in the county of Limerick, and of Mountjoy-square, in the city of Dublin, Esq. deceased, who devised to the said Peter the towns and lands of Dromroe, Rathbane, Rathure, the two Ardnevedoges, and Rathmitchell, in the county of Limerick, on that condition; provided Her Majesty's said royal licence, concession, and declaration be recorded in the office of Ulster King of Arms' in Ireland, that the Officers of Arms there, and all others, may have full notice and knowledge thereof, which has been done accordingly.
