AT the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 7th day of *August* 1851,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth Report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth Report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the endowment of the first canonry in the cathedral church of Lichfield.

"Whereas it is by the herein firstly recited Act enacted, that so soon as conveniently may be, and by the authority thereafter provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same), such annual sums shall be determined on to be paid, and shall be accordingly paid by us, as after due inquiry and calculation shall give to the respective canons of any cathedral or collegiate church in England an average annual income of five hundred pounds:

"And whereas, it is by the herein secondly recited Act declared and enacted that, notwithstanding anything in the said first recited Act contained, it shall be lawful, by the authority

aforesaid, to carry the said purposes, or any of them, into effect by any other mode of payment, contribution, augmentation, or endowment which may be deemed fit, as well as by the mode in the same Acts specified:

"And whereas, it has been made to appear to us that the income of the said first canonry in the said cathedral church of Lichfield, now held by the Reverend John Hutchinson, Master of Arts, which is derived from a share of the divisible corporate revenues of the chapter of such church is subject to great fluctuation and uncertainty; and we have satisfied ourselves, after due inquiry and consideration, that it is expedient that the augmentation of the income of the said canonry, as contemplated by the said recited Acts, should be effected in the mode hereinafter proposed:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we shall be authorized and empowered forthwith, and from time to time, to pay to the said John Hutchinson, as holder of the said first canonry in the said cathedral church of Lichfield, as from the period from which he became entitled to a share of the divisible corporate revenues thereof, and to his successors in the said canonry, such a sum of money as, together with the moneys which, upon inquiry and calculation, shall appear to us to have become due in each year to the holder for the time being of the said canonry, out of such divisible corporate revenues, will make up the annual amount of five hundred pounds.

"And we further recommend and propose, that in every year, so soon as conveniently may be after the annual audit of the accounts of the chapter of the said cathedral church, an account showing the moneys which shall have become due and payable to the holder for the time being of the said canonry, out of the corporate revenues of such chapter for the year ending on the day up to which such account shall have been so audited as aforesaid, shall be rendered to us, verified in such manner as we may require, and that thereupon the amount (if any) which may be necessary to make up the income of such canonry for the same year to the amount hereinbefore specified, shall be calculated and ascertained, and the sum so ascertained shall forthwith be paid by us to the holder of such canonry accordingly:

"Provided always, and we further recommend and propose, that if in any case the amount of the moneys so payable as aforesaid out of the corporate revenues of the said chapter to the said

holder of the said canonry, in respect of any such year, shall exceed the annual income hereinbefore specified, the amount of the surplus shall be retained by the treasurer or other proper officer of such chapter and be carried by him to our credit in the account for the next succeeding year, and so on from time to time until the average income of the said canonry shall again be below the amount so hereinbefore specified.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other mode of augmenting or endowing the said canonry; or any other measures relating to such matter in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notice of the said scheme has been duly given, and no objection has been made thereto:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of East Stonehouse, in the county of Devon, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons: And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after due notice thereof, on Friday the eleventh day of July last, it was resolved,—

"That the Churchwardens of this parish be

of holding any vestry and other meeting for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said parish, shall be applied to, and be put in force in the said parish of East Stonehouse.

And we hereby further direct, that a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
