Before the Judge of the County Court of Essex, holden at the Shirehall, in Chelmsford, on Saturday the 22nd day of November 1851.

John Baker, late of Bath-side, Harwich, in the county of Essex, Mariner, previously a prisoner for debt in the county gaol of Essex, at Springfield, formerly of Bath-side, Harwich aforesaid, out of business, but occasionally a Ship and River Surveyor.

Thomas Emery Alcock, formerly of Saint George's Sutton, and late of Roe-street, during his residence at these places having occupied two rooms in the Royal Depot Mills, in Mill-street, all in the borough of Macclesfield, in the county of Chester, Silk Man and Commission Silk Throwster.

John Dean, formerly of Chester-road, Silk Broker and Dealer, afterwards of Park-street, Silkman and Throwster, having occupied a room in the Depot Mills, in Mill-

street, then of High-street, Assistant to a Silk and Silk Waste Dealer, afterwards of High-street, then of Lord-street, during these periods having occupied a room in Watercotes Mill, Silkman, Broker, and Throwster, and late of Lord-street, out of business, all the before mentioned places, being in Macclesfield, in the county of Chester.

John Barker, formerly of Market Drayton, in the county of Salop, Shopman to a Linen and Linen Draper, then of the same place, Porter Dealer, then of Market-street, then of Campbell-terrace, and late of Beckwith-street, all the three last-mentioned places being in Birkenhead, in the county of Chester, out of business.

John Johnston, formerly of Gee-Cross, near Hyde, in the county of Chester, Grocer and Tea Dealer, then of Hyde aforesaid, Collector of Rents and Debts, and late of the same place, out of business.

Henry Booth, late of Back-lade, Hyde, in the county of Chester, Labourer and Dealer in Fruit and Vegetables, also a Pensioner from the 96th Regiment of Foot.

Joseph Thomas, late of Fevindon, in the county of Chester, Blacksmith.

Robert Plews, formerly of Hyde, in the county of Chester, Iron and Tinplate Worker, carrying on business in partnership with Frederick Wilson, under the firm of Wilson and Plews, then of the same place, carrying on the same business on his own account, and late of Hyde aforesaid, Journeyman Iron and Tinplate Worker.

Evan Jones, formerly of No. 17, Seymour-crescent, Euston-square, in the county of Middlesex, Clerk to the London and North Western Railway Company, at the Euston Station, occasionally taking in Lodgers, then of Cuddington, near Malpas, in lodgings, out of business, and late of Barton, near Farndon, both last-mentioned places, being in the county of Chester, Farmer and Licensed Victualler.

George Booth, formerly of Smallshaw, near Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county of Lancaster, Farmer's Assistant, and late of Duckenfield, in the county of Chester, Assistant to a Butcher.

N. B.—1. If any Creditor intends to oppose a Prisoner's discharge, notice of such intention must be given to the said Prisoner, in writing, which may be left at the Gaol two clear days before the day of hearing above mentioned, exclusive of Sunday, and exclusive both of the day of giving such notice and of the said day of hearing.

2. The petition and schedule will be produced by the proper Officer for inspection and examination at the Office of the Court in London, between the hours of Ten and Four, on this notice being exhibited; and copies of the petition and schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided by the proper Officer, according to the Act of 1st and 2nd Victoria, cap. 110, sec. 105.

3. The duplicates of the petitions and schedules, and all books, papers, and writings filed therewith, will be produced by the Clerks or Assistant Clerks of the said County Courts, for inspection and examination, at the Offices of the said County Courts respectively, at the Towns aforesaid, and copies of the petition and schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided according to sec. 106 of the Act.
