The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a report from the General Board of Health, dated the twenty-third day of September one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, in the words following; that is to say:

"To the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

"We, the General Board of Health, appointed for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1848, having, in pursuance of the provisions of that Act, upon the petition of not less than one-tenth of the inhabitants rated to the relief of the poor of and within the town of Haworth, in the county of York, (the number of the said petitioners greatly exceeding thirty in the whole), directed Benjamin Herschel Babbage, a superintending inspector appointed for the purposes of the said Public Health Act, to visit the said town and to make public inquiry, and to examine witnesses as to the sewerage, drainage, and supply of water, the state of the burial grounds, the number and sanitary condition of the inhabitants, and as to any local Acts of Parliament in force within such town for paving, lighting, cleansing, watching, regulating, supplying with water, or improving the said town, or having relation to the purposes of the said Public Health Act; also as to the natural drainage areas, and the existing municipal, parochial, or other local boundaries, and the boundaries which might be most advantageously adopted for the purposes of that Act;

"And the said superintending inspector, having previously given the notices directed by the said Public Health Act, proceeded upon the said inquiry in the manner directed by that Act, and hath reported in writing to the said Board upon the said several matters with respect to which he was directed to inquire, and upon certain other matters with respect to which he deemed it expedient to report for the purposes of that Act;

"And copies of the said report, accompanied by a notice, stating that written statements might be forwarded to the said Board, with respect to any matters contained in or omitted from the said report, or any amendment proposed to be made therein, have been duly published and deposited as directed by the said Public Health Act, and the time for forwarding such statements has now

elapsed; and all such statements as have been received by the said Board have been duly deposited as required by that Act;

"And it appears by the said report, that there is no local Act of Parliament in force within the said town for paving, lighting (otherwise than for the profit of proprietors or shareholders), cleansing, watching, regulating, supplying with water, or improving such town, or any part thereof, or in anywise relating to the purposes of the said Public Health Act;

"Now, therefore, We, the said General Board of Health, do hereby, in pursuance of the said Public Health Act, humbly report to your Majesty, that it appears to us to be expedient,

"1. That the Public Health Act, 1848, and every part thereof, except the section numbered 50 in the copies of that Act, printed by your Majesty's printers, should be applied to, and be in force within and throughout the entire area, places, and parts of places, comprised within the aforesaid town of Haworth, in the county of York, and that such area, places, and parts of places should be and constitute a district for the purposes of the said Public Health Act accordingly.

"2. That the Local Board of Health to be elected under the said Public Health Act should consist of nine persons, and that the entire number should be elected for the whole of the said district.

"3. That the first election of the said Local Board should take place on the fourth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

"4. That one-third in number of the said Local Board of Health should go out of office on the twenty-fifth day of March in each year subsequently to that in which the said first election takes place; but in case the day so appointed should fall on a Sunday, or on a day appointed for public fast or thanksgiving, then that such one-third should go out of office on the day next following.

"5. That every person should at the time of his election as member of the said Local Board, and so long as he should continue in office by virtue of such election, be resident, as in the said Public Health Act, 1848, is required, and be seized or possessed of real or personal estate, or both, to the value or amount of not less than two hundred pounds, or should be so resident and rated to the relief of the poor of some parish, township, or place, of which some part is within the said district, upon an annual value of not less than five pounds.

"6. That at the first election of the said Local Board, George Spencer, Esq. Clerk to the Guardians of the Keighley Union, should have the powers and perform the duties vested in or imposed upon the Chairman of the Local Board of Health by the Public Health Act, 1848, in relation to the election by owners of property and ratepayers, and should perform all other duties which it might be requisite for him to perform in conducting and completing the said first election; and in case the said George Spencer, from illness, or other sufficient cause, should be unable to exercise or discharge such powers or duties, or should be absent, or should refuse to act, then that Mr. James Driver, of Haworth, should exercise and perform such of the said powers and duties as then remain to be exercised or performed.

"7. That the fourteen days' notice of qualification required by the Public Health Act, 1848, to be given by owners of property, in order to entitle them to vote at the said first election, should be given to the said George Spencer, at the residence of Mr. Joseph Redman, West-lane, Haworth, within the district aforesaid; or in case he should refuse, or be unable to receive the same, then to the said James Driver, at his residence in West-lane, Haworth, likewise within the aforesaid district.

"Given under our hands, and under the seal of the General Board of Health, this twenty-third day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said report into consideration, is pleased to approve thereof, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby, under and in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1848, order and direct:

1. That from and after the date of this Order, the Public Health Act, and every part thereof, except the section numbered 50 in the copies of that Act, printed by Her Majesty's printers, shall be applied to, and be in force within and throughout the entire area, places, and parts of places comprised within the boundaries of the town of Haworth, in the county of York, and that such area, places, and parts of places, shall be and constitute a district, for the purposes of the said Public Health Act accordingly.

2. That the Local Board of Health, to be elected under the said Public Health Act, shall consist of nine persons, and that the entire number shall be elected for the whole of the said district.

3. That the first election of the said Local Board of Health shall take place on the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

4. That one-third in number of the said Local Board shall go out of office on the twenty-fifth day of March in each year subsequently to that in which the said election takes place; but in case the day so appointed shall fall on a Sunday, or on a day appointed for public fast or thanksgiving, then such one-third shall go out of office on the day next following.

5. That every person shall at the time of his election as member of the said Local Board, and so long as he shall continue in office by virtue of such election, be resident as in the said Public Health Act, 1848, is required, and be seized or possessed of real or personal estate, or both, to the value or amount of not less than two hundred

pounds, or shall be so resident or rated to the relief of the poor of some parish, township, or place, of which some part is within the said district, upon an annual value of not less than five pounds.

6. That at the first election of the said Local Board, George Spencer, Esq. Clerk to the Guardians of the Keighley Union, shall have the powers and perform the duties vested in or imposed upon the Chairman of the Local Board of Health by the Public Health Act, 1848, in relation to the election by owners of property and ratepayers, and shall perform all other duties which it may be requisite for him to perform in conducting and completing the said first election; and in case the said George Spencer, from illness, or other sufficient cause, shall be unable to exercise or discharge such powers or duties, or shall be absent, or shall refuse to act, then that Mr. James Driver, of Haworth, shall exercise and perform such of the said powers and duties as then remain to be exercised or performed.

7. That the fourteen days' notice of qualification required by the Public Health Act, 1848, to be given by owners of property, in order to entitle them to vote at the said first election, shall be given to the said George Spencer, at the residence of Mr. Joseph Redman, West-lane, Haworth, within the district aforesaid; or in case he shall refuse, or be unable to receive the same, then to the said James Driver, at his residence in West-lane, Haworth, likewise within the aforesaid district.

Scarborough Market and Approaches.

Erection of Market House, Improvement of Approaches, Removal of Existing Markets, Purchase of Tolls, and Incorporation of Company.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for leave to bring in a Bill for the establishment of a new market, for the sale of butchers' meat, poultry, fish, butter, cheese, vegetables, corn, hay, and other provisions, goods, wares, merchandise, and marketable commodities, in the borough of Scarborough, in the North Riding of the county of York.

And it is intended to apply for the following powers and provisions in the said Bill:—

To incorporate a Company, and to authorise such Company to carry the powers and provisions of the Bill into effect, and to raise the requisite capital by shares and mortgage.

To erect and maintain a market house or market houses, with all suitable buildings, shops, sheds, market places, slaughter houses, courts, passages, weighing machines, and other conveniences connected therewith, and for such purpose to purchase and take by agreement or compulsion certain lands, tenements, and hereditaments in the township of Scarborough, in the parish of Scarborough, situate near Carr-street, Saint Helen's-square, Cross-street, Leading Post-street, Dumble-street, Saint Sepulchre-street, and also near Auboro'-street, High-west-gate, and Tollergate, and also near the Friarage, and also near Wrea-lane, some or one of them.

To stop up the passages or thoroughfares called the Shambles, and Bennett's-yard, and all other

courts and passages in the intended site of the said market house, and to stop up, alter, or divert, either temporarily or permanently, any other streets, ways, passages, sewers, drains, or pipes, which it may be necessary to stop up, alter, or divert, by reason of the construction of the intended works or any of them.

To open and make a street, passage, or thoroughfare between Duple-street and Cross-street, in the said township of Scarborough, and parish of Scarborough.

To alter, vary, or improve the line or course of the streets or places called Leading Post-street, Saint Sepulchre-street, and Duple-street, such alterations, variations, or improvements to be made at and near the junction of the said streets, in the said township of Scarborough, and parish of Scarborough, and also the streets or places called Saint Helen's-square, and Cross-street, in the said township and parish, at or near the site of the intended market; also to authorise the appropriation for the purposes of the market house of a part of the present line of the streets so to be altered, varied, or improved as aforesaid.

To improve the approaches to the market by Saint Sepulchre-street, and Saint Helen's-square, by authorising the removal of the public conduit, situate at the junction of Saint Sepulchre-street with Leading Post-street and Duple-street, and the removal of the public fountain and weighing house in Saint Helen's-square, both in the said township of Scarborough, and parish of Scarborough, and the erection of other public fountains or conduits in the neighbourhood of those intended to be removed, in the said township and parish.

To confer upon the Company the powers usually granted for the compulsory purchase of the lands, houses, and property required for the said market house, slaughter houses, passages, alterations of streets, and other intended works and buildings.

To remove the existing markets and fairs now held in the said borough, and to vary or extinguish any existing rights and privileges of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Scarborough, and of all other corporations and persons with reference to the holding of markets and fairs in the said borough, whether under Act of Parliament, charter, prescription, or otherwise.

To authorise the purchase by agreement or compulsion of the tolls, stallages, or rents now payable to the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, or any other corporation or person, in respect of meat, corn, vegetables, or any other article sold or delivered on sale in the said borough, and to enable the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses to sell the same tolls, and either to vest such tolls in the Company, or to alter, abolish, or extinguish the same.

To authorise the Company so to be incorporated to levy tolls, stallages, and rents for the use of the intended market, market houses, or places, and for standing or stallage therein, and for the use of the weighing machines and other conveniences; to confer exemptions from payment of tolls, stallages, and rents, and to alter or extinguish any existing exemptions from payment of tolls, and to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights and privileges.

To prevent the hawking or vending of butchers' meat, poultry, fish, butter, cheese, vegetables, fruit, and other provisions, matters and things, in the streets, public passages, or roads, within the said borough, or in certain parts thereof.

To incorporate the Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847, and the Lands Clauses Consolidation

Act, 1845, and the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To authorise the Company to establish, erect, maintain, and regulate public slaughter houses in connection with or apart from, the said market house, and to prevent the slaughtering of cattle, sheep, or animals, within the borough, except in such slaughter houses, or in any existing slaughter houses, or under certain regulations and restrictions, and to authorise the collection of rates, tolls, and rents, for the use of such intended slaughter houses.

And notice is hereby further given, that duplicate plans describing the line or situation of the intended alterations and diversions and improvements of streets and of the lands to be taken for the purposes thereof, and also describing the situation of the lands proposed to be taken for the said market house, and slaughter houses, ways, passages, works, and conveniences connected therewith, and duplicate sections shewing the levels of the said alterations and diversions and improvements of streets, with books of reference to such plans containing the names of the owners, or reputed owners, lessees, or reputed lessees, and occupiers of such lands, and also a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection, on or before the twenty-ninth day of November next, with the Clerk of the Peace for the North Riding of the county of York, at his office in Northallerton, and a copy of the said plans, sections, books of reference, and Gazette notice, will be deposited on or before the said twenty-ninth day of November, with the Parish Clerk of the parish of Scarborough, at his residence.
