## REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Tuesday previous* to the Levee on the 26th of February instant, and on the *Monday previous* to the Levee on the 3rd of March next, on each day *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levees, are to send a card (having on it their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addressess, and the names of the persons from whom they come) to the Lord

Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, on the *Tuesday previous* to the Levee on the 26th of February instant, and on the *Monday previous* to the Levee on the 3rd of March next; and that two other cards, having on them precisely what is written upon that sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, are to be taken to the Levee; one of the two cards to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the law respecting the office of county coroner," it is enacted, that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of the said Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under the said Act, it shall be lawful for the said justices, in General or Quarter Sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition shall be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof shall be given to the coroner or coroners of such county as therein-after provided :

And whereas it is in and by the said Act further enacted, that the clerk of the peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every coroner for such county, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said justices into consideration, and the justices shall confer with every such coroner who shall attend the meeting of the justices

for that purpose, touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, shall be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when such petition shall be agreed to, and the clerk of the peace for such county shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition, certified under his hand, to every coroner for such county :

And whereas it is in and by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, if she shall think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which may be presented to her by any coroner of the same county, concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to Her Majesty, to direct the issue of a writ de coronatore eligendo, for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such county, to order that such county shall be divided into such and so many districts, for the purposes of the said Act, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place, within each district, the court for the election of coroner for such district shall be holden as thereafter provided, and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette :

And whereas a petition of the justices of the peace for the county of Hertford, in Quarter Sessions assembled at the town of Hertford, on the fourteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred fifty-one, certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of five of the justices present when such petition was agreed to, hath been presented to Her Majesty, setting forth that there always had been two persons elected as coroners for the county of Hertford; and that by arrangement between them, the said county had been divided into two divisions, one of such coroners acting in all matters within the eastern division of the said county, and the other of such coroners acting in all matters within the western division thereof; that the said county of Hertford, including the liberty of Saint Albans, was of considerable extent, being thirty-six miles in length, twenty-eight miles in breadth, and one hundred and thirty miles in circumference, and that it would be a great convenience and saving of time to the public, a considerable diminution in the expences payable out of the county rate, and induce professional gentlemen of respectability to accept the office, which many declined to do under the present arrangement from the distance which they would have to travel from home, and the consequent unnecessary interruption to business, if the county were divided into more districts; that Francis James Osbaldeston, Gentleman, one of the coroners for the said county, and who acted for the western side of the said county, was recently dead, and that not any appointment of a coroner had been made in his stead, and that it was desirable to divide the said western side of the said county, into three districts, that Thomas Swarder, of the town of Hertford, Gentleman, was the other coroner for the said county, and acted for the eastern side thereof, whose division of the county it was not proposed to alter or interfere with; that

a description of the several proposed districts, was given in the schedule to the said petition, and that the boundaries of each district were shewn by the map or plan thereunto annexed, and upon which each district was differently coloured; that the preliminaries and notices under the second and third sections of the above-mentioned Act had been duly complied with and given; and humbly praying that the said county of Hertford, including the liberty of Saint Albans, might for the purposes of the said Act be divided into four districts, in the manner set forth in the schedule to the said petition, or as near thereto as circumstances would admit, and that a separate coroner might be elected forthwith for the Hemel Hempstead District, the Saint Albans District, and the Hitchin District, the same forming, as near as circumstances would admit, the western division of the said county, for which the said Francis James Osbaldeston, previous to his death, used to act; and that the parishes and places within the eastern division of the said county, for which the said Thomas Swarder had been accustomed to act, and then did act, might constitute the fourth district of the said county, and be called the Hertford District:

And whereas a petition has been presented to Her Majesty by the present coroner for the county of Hertford, in the said petition mentioned, concerning the proposed division of the said county :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the said petition of the justices of the peace, together with the petition of the coroner above-mentioned, into her royal consideration, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to accede to the prayer of the petition of the said justices of the peace, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the county of Hertford, including the liberty of Saint Albans, shall, from and after the publication of this Order in the London Gazette, be divided into four districts, for the purposes of the said recited Act ;

That the names of the said districts respectively shall be—

The Hemel Hempstead District,  
The Saint Albans District,  
The Hitchin District, and  
The Hertford District :

That the Hemel Hempstead District shall comprize and consist of the hamlets following; that is to say: the parish of Hemel Hempstead, the hamlet of Bovington, the parishes of Great Berkhamstead, Tring, and Long Marston, the hamlet of Wilsterne, the parishes of Aldbury, Northchurch, Great Gaddesden, Little Gaddesden, Kings Langley, and Flaunden, the hamlet of Friethsden, and the parishes of Puttenham, Wigginton, Sarratt, Flamstead, Studham, Kensworth, and Caddington :

That the court for the election of coroner for the district of Hemel Hempstead, shall be holden at the town of Hemel Hempstead, and that the poll for the election of coroner in the said district, shall be taken at Hemel Hempstead aforesaid :

That the Saint Albans District shall comprize and consist of the parishes and hamlets following; that is to say: the parishes of Saint Michael, Saint Peter, Saint Stephens, Harpenden, Sandridge, Wheathamstead, Redbourn, North Mimms, Shenley, and Ridge, the hamlet of Totteridge, the parishes of Chipping Barnet, East Barnet, Aldenham, Watford, Rickmansworth, Abbots Langley, Bushey, the Abbey Parish, and Northaw, the hamlet of Theobald Street, and the parish of Elstree ;

That the court for the election of coroner for the district of Saint Albans, shall be holden at the town of Saint Albans, and that the poll for the election of coroner in the said district, shall be taken at Saint Albans aforesaid ;

That the Hitchin District shall comprize and consist of the parishes following; that is to say: Hitchin, Ickleford, Pirton, Kimpton, Offley, Lilley, Letchworth, Radwell, Bennington, Walkern, Willian, Ippollitts, Cottered, Broadfield, Welwyn, Ayott Saint Lawrence, Ayott Saint Peter, Stevenage, Bygrave, Clothall, Hinxworth, Baldock, Weston, Gravely, Knebworth, Great Wymondley, Little Wymondley, Caldicot, Hexton, Norton, Newnham, Shephall, Codicote, Paulswalden, and Kingswalden ;

That the court for the election of coroner for the district of Hitchin shall be holden at the town of Hitchin, and that the poll for the election of the coroner in the said district shall be taken at Hitchin aforesaid ;

That the Hertford District shall comprize and consist of the parishes, hamlets, and liberty following; that is to say: the parishes of Saint Andrew, All Saint's, Saint Margaret's, Great Amwell, Little Amwell, Ware, Thundridge, Bengoe, Bayford, Hertingfordbury, Tewin, Watton, Stapleford, Digswell, Little Berkhamstead, Sacomb, Datchworth and Essendon, the hamlet of Hoddesdon, the parish of Stanstead, the liberty of Brickendon, the parishes of Hunsdon, Eastwick, Broxbourne, Wormley, Cheshunt, Braintfield, Halfeld, Aston, Great Munden, Little Munden, Bishop Stortford, Sawbridgeworth, Thorley, Gilston, Albury, Great Hadham, Little Hadham, Braughin, Standon, Furneaux Pelham, Stocking Pelham, Brent Pelham, Widford, Royston, Ashwell, Therfield, Sandon, Wallington, Buckland, Kelshall, Reed, and Barkway, the hamlet of Nuthampstead, and the parishes of Barley, Throcking, Yardley, Rushden, Buntingford, Aspeden, Layston, Westmill, Great Hornead, Little Hornead, Widdial, Anstey, and Meesden ;

That the court for the election of coroner for the district of Hertford, upon the death, resignation, or removal of the present coroner, shall be holden at the town of Hertford, and that the poll for the election of coroner in the said district, shall be taken at the town of Hertford aforesaid.

And Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased hereby further to order, that after the publication of this Order in London Gazette, three several writs de coronatore eligendo shall be issued for the election of coroners for the Hemel Hempstead District, the Saint Albans District, and the Hitchin District respectively. *Wm. DISPATCHES have this day been received from Commodore Bruce, the Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's ships and vessels on the West Coast of Africa, of which the following are copies or extracts :

SIR, *Penelope, off Lagos, January 2, 1852.*

I HAVE the honour to report, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that their Lordships' instructions of the 14th October, and the wishes of Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, as far as respects Lagos, have been most faithfully fulfilled by the expulsion of the slave-dealing chief Kosoko

and his people, the utter destruction of his town, and the establishment of the friendly chief Akitoye, with his followers, in the seat of power at Lagos.

By my letter No. 216, of 1851, their Lordships are aware that Kosoko very recently rejected the proffered friendship of England, and that he opposed with fire and sword the approach of a flag of truce proceeding to his seat of Government with Mr. Consul Beecroft, who offered to negotiate and to advise with him, and who was merely attended by an escort of armed boats, scarcely or problematically sufficient for his personal safety among savages.

I therefore determined to send a strong and well-organized force to punish this refractory chief, and having, through the untiring energy and exertions of Mr. Beecroft, procured the attendance of Akitoye and nearly 500 of his followers near the scene of action, ready to take advantage of a clear sweep when we should make it, I concerted measures with Captain Lewis T. Jones, of the Sampson, and Captain Henry Lyster, of this ship, who both were volunteers on the occasion, and intrusted the detail and execution of the service to Captain Jones, seconded by Captain Lyster, and their Lordships will see, from the accompanying reports, the complete success with which the enterprise has been crowned.

I am at a loss to do justice to the chivalrous bearing and devoted bravery of these two officers; Captain Jones, who, commanding the expedition, was no less conspicuous for his gallantry and firmness than for his judgment and energy; and Captain Lyster, who, finding himself, by unavoidable circumstances, exposed in the Teazer to be summarily destroyed by the enemy's guns, made a noble rush into the midst of armed hosts on shore, and with his undaunted followers spiked the obnoxious guns, and turned the fortune of the day at that point. It is to be borne in mind, that our people could expect no quarter, nor did they get any.

I should come short of my duty did I not bring before the notice of their Lordships the ardent and devoted gallantry exhibited during this very severe affair by officers and men. The responsible post which Captain Lyster filled cost him a severe wound, happily not dangerous. Commander Hillyar, of this ship, who charged with him, is severely, but not dangerously wounded. Lieutenants Edward Marshall and F. D. Rich, each in command of a paddle-box boat, exhibited heroism and firmness never surpassed. Lieutenant John Corbett, in command of Mr. Beecroft's iron boat with rockets, with his own hands spiked the guns, receiving a shot in his arm after doing so, and had five severe wounds before the affray ended. Lieutenant Williams, Royal Marine Artillery, was dangerously wounded, and Mr. Frederick Fletcher, midshipman, commanding one of the cutters appointed to guard the boats when on shore, defended them to the last, and fell with two balls in his forehead. With the other division, Lieutenant Saumarez, of the Sampson, received a dangerous wound while encouraging his men, and Mr. Richards, midshipman of that ship, got his death wound. The conduct of Lieutenant Patey, commanding the Bloodhound, and Lieutenant Leckie, commanding the Teazer, and the success attending their efforts, is beyond all praise; besides their annihilating fire, their vessels were a rallying point for the respective divisions of boats, and were conspicuously instrumental in the attainment of victory, reflecting infinite credit on all belonging to them. Commander Coote, of the Volcano, and Commander Gardner, of the Waterwitch, with their detachments, contributed, us

soon as they arrived, to the labours of the hour with an energy and zeal well worthy of them.

Nothing could exceed the devotion of the officers of the medical staff to the exigencies of the day,—Mr. Richard Carpenter, Surgeon, Mr. Walling, and Mr. Sproule, Assistant-Surgeons of this ship; Dr. Barclay, Acting Surgeon of the Sealark, and Mr. Morgan and Mr. Pendrith, Assistant-Surgeons of the Sampson. Wherever a man was struck in the boats a medical officer was immediately by his side, setting their own lives at nought when compared with the wants of their brave companions in arms. Mr. Walling and Mr. Sproule landed at the charge, with their comrades, under Captain Lyster.

Mr. Beecroft during all these operations was on board the Bloodhound, and gave every assistance that his advice and experience could afford.

I cannot withhold the expression of my regret for the very severe loss which has attended this achievement, but in which I trust their Lordships will feel that the dignity of England has been asserted, and the honour of the flag gloriously sustained. The enclosures with this despatch will afford all further information.
